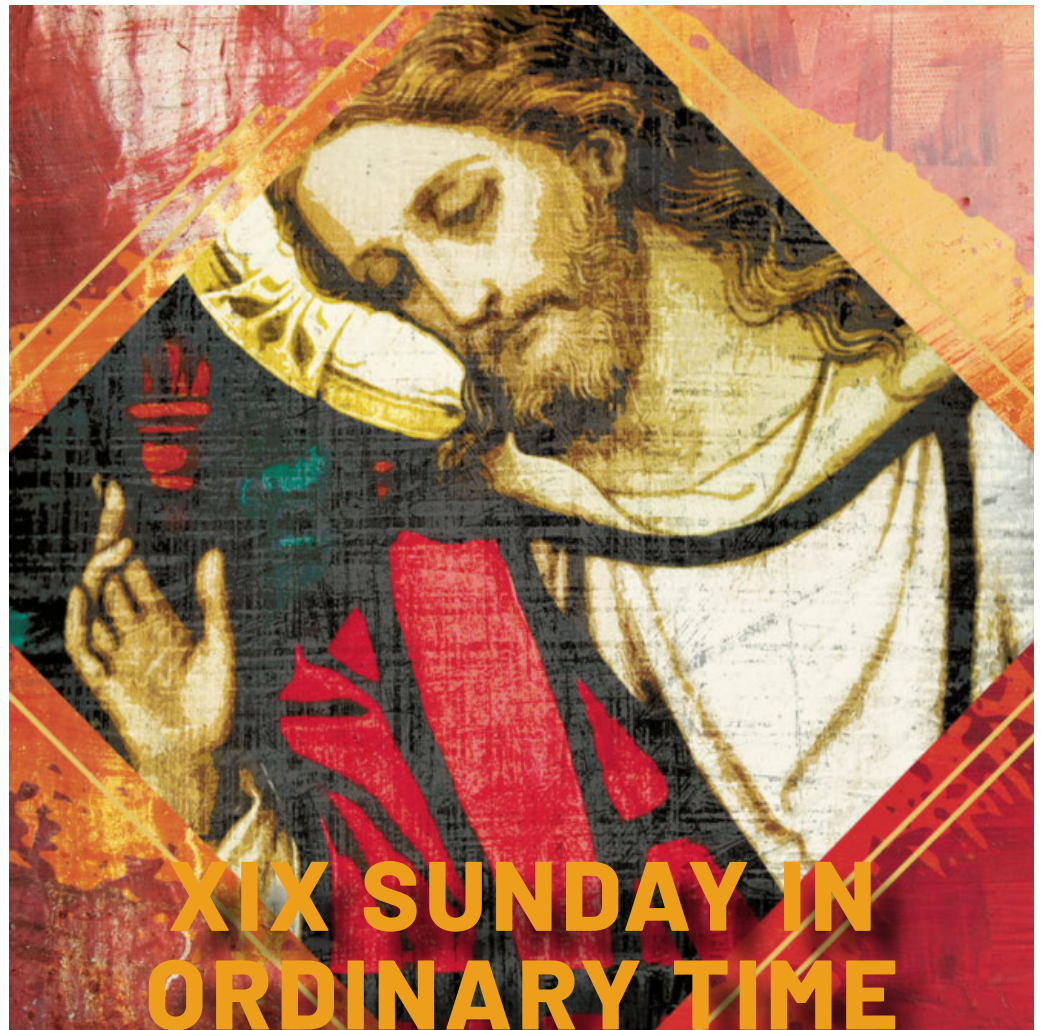

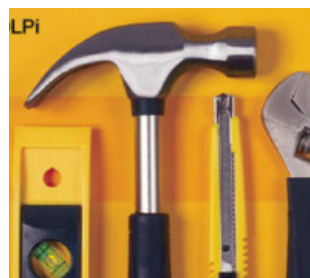
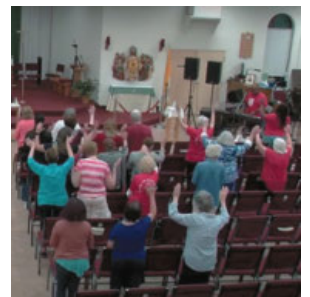
Seminary Burse Fund Collection

FAITH OF OUR FATHERS

Scott Hahn on the XIX Sunday in Ordinary Time

We are born of the faith of our fathers, descending from a great cloud of witnesses whose faith is attested to on every page of Scripture (see Hebrews 12:1). We have been made His people, chosen for His own inheritance, as we sing in this Sunday's Psalm.

The Liturgy this week sings the praises of our fathers, recalling the defining moments in our "family history." In the Epistle, we remember the calling of Abraham; in the First Reading we relive the night of the Exodus and the summons of the holy children of Israel.

Our fathers, we are told, trusted in the Word of God, put their faith in His oaths. They were convinced that what He promised, He would do.

None of them lived to see His promises made good. For it was not until Christ and His Church that Abraham's descendants were made as countless as the stars and sands (see Galatians 3:16-17, 29). It was not until His Last Supper and the Eucharist that "the sacrifice . . . the divine institution" of that first Passover was truly fulfilled.

And now we too await the final fulfillment of what God has promised us in Christ. As Jesus tells us in this week's Gospel, we should live with our loins girded—as the Israelites tightened their belts, cinched up their long robes and ate their Passover standing, vigilant and ready to do His will (see Exodus 12:11; 2 Kings 4:29).

The Lord will come at an hour we do not expect. He will knock on our door (see Revelation 3:20), inviting us to the wedding feast in the better homeland, the heavenly one that our fathers saw from afar, and which we begin to taste in each Eucharist.

As they did, we can wait with "sure knowledge," His Word like a lamp lighting our path (see Psalm 119:105). Our God is faithful, and if we wait in faith, hope in His kindness, and love as we have been loved, we will receive His promised blessing and be delivered from death.

CATECHISM of the Catholic Church

Girding one's loins (i.e. tucking the bottom of the tunic into the belt in order to free the legs for physical activity) and keeping the lamp burning were signs of preparedness and vigilance. Christ called his followers to maintain such a vigilance at all times for no one knows when the end of life shall come. Each person has a specific calling that must be fulfilled diligently in this life with love and a spirit of service.

§2849 Such a battle and such a victory become possible only through prayer. It is by his prayer that Jesus vanquishes the tempter, both at the outset of his public mission and in the ultimate struggle of his agony. In this petition to our heavenly Father, Christ unites us to his battle and his agony. He urges us to vigilance of the heart in communion with his own. Vigilance is "custody of the heart," and Jesus prayed for us to the Father: "Keep them in your name." The Holy Spirit constantly seeks to awaken us to keep watch. Finally, this petition takes on all its dramatic meaning in relation to the last temptation of our earthly battle; it asks for final perseverance. "Lo, I am coming like a thief! Blessed is he who is awake."

LA FE DE NUESTROS PADRES

Scott Hahn reflexiona sobre el XIX Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Hemos nacido de la fe de nuestros padres; somos descendientes de una "gran nube de testigos" cuya fe está atestiguada en cada página de la Escritura (cfr. Hb 12,1). Hemos sido constituidos pueblo de Dios, escogidos como su heredad, como cantamos en el salmo de este domingo.

La liturgia de esta semana canta las alabanzas de nuestros padres, rememorando los momentos claves de nuestra "historia familiar". En la epístola recordamos la vocación de Abraham; en la primera lectura revivimos la noche del éxodo y la llamada de Dios a los santos hijos de Israel.

Nuestros padres, se nos ha dicho, confiaron en la Palabra de Dios y creyeron en sus juramentos, convencidos de que lo que Él había prometido, eso haría.

Ninguno de ellos vivió para ver las promesas cumplidas. Y no fue sino hasta la llegada de Cristo y su Iglesia que los hijos de Abraham fueron hechos incontables como las estrellas y la arena (cfr. Ga 3,16-17.29). No fue sino hasta su Última Cena y la Eucaristía que "el sacrificio...la institución divina" de aquella primera Pascua se cumplió verdaderamente.

También ahora esperamos el cumplimiento de lo que Dios nos ha prometido en Cristo. Como Él mismo nos dice en el Evangelio de esta semana, debemos vivir con la "cintura ceñida", así como los Israelitas se ceñeron sus largas túnicas y comieron su Pascua de pie, vigilantes y listos para cumplir Su voluntad (cfr. Ex 12,11; 2 R 4,29).

El Señor vendrá a una hora que no esperamos; tocará nuestra puerta (cfr. Ap 3,20) invitándonos al banquete de bodas en la patria que es mejor, aquella celestial que nuestros padres vieron desde lejos y que empezamos a saborear en cada Eucaristía.

Así como ellos, podemos esperar con "conocimiento cierto", mientras la Palabra guía nuestros pasos como una antorcha (cfr. Sal 119, 105). Nuestro Dios es digno de confianza y si esperamos con fe, esperamos en su bondad y amamos como hemos sido amados, recibiremos la bendición que nos ha prometido: ser librados de la muerte.

CATECISMO de la Iglesia Católica

Ceñir los lomos (es decir, meter la parte inferior de la túnica en el cinturón para liberar las piernas para la actividad física) y mantener la lámpara encendida eran signos de preparación y vigilancia. Cristo llamó a sus seguidores a mantener tal vigilancia en todo momento porque nadie sabe cuándo llegará el final de la vida. Cada persona tiene una vocación específica que debe ser cumplida diligentemente en esta vida con amor y espíritu de servicio.

§2849 Pues bien, este combate y esta victoria sólo son posibles con la oración. Por medio de su oración, Jesús es vencedor del Tentador, desde el principio (cf Mt 4, 11) y en el último combate de su agonía (cf Mt 26, 36-44). En esta petición a nuestro Padre, Cristo nos une a su combate y a su agonía. La vigilancia del corazón es recordada con insistencia en comunión con la suya (cf Mc 13, 9. 23. 33-37; 14, 38; Lc 12, 35-40). La vigilancia es "guarda del corazón", y Jesús pide al Padre que "nos guarde en su Nombre" (Jn 17, 11). El Espíritu Santo trata de despertarnos continuamente a esta vigilancia (cf 1 Co 16, 13; Col 4, 2; 1 Ts 5, 6; 1 P 5, 8). Esta petición adquiere todo su sentido dramático referida a la tentación final de nuestro combate en la tierra; pide la perseverancia final. "Mira que vengo como ladrón. Dichoso el que esté en vela" (Ap 16, 15)

Kolbe, a Polish Catholic priest, fearlessly suffered the horrors of Auschwitz, where he was eventually martyred because of his faith. The life of this Saint reminds us that suffering is a mystery we all face at many points in our lives. In this talk, internationally known speaker Jeff Cavins shares his insights on this difficult topic and shows us how our suffering can become redemptive.

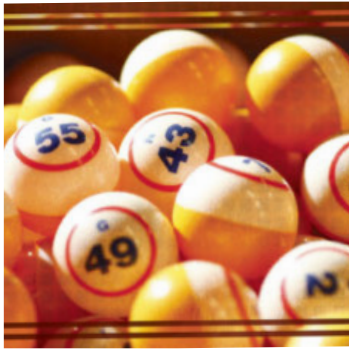

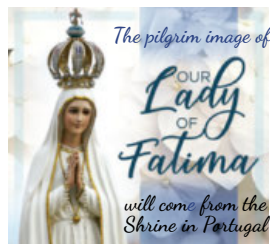
