

### **SEEKING THE LOST**

### Scott Hahn on the XXIV Sunday in Ordinary Time

The episode in today's First Reading has been called "Israel's original sin." Freed from bondage, born as a people of God in the covenant at Sinai, Israel turned aside from His ways and fell to worshipping a golden calf.

Moses implores God's mercy, just as Jesus will later intercede for the whole human race. Just as He still pleads for sinners at God's right hand and through the ministry of the Church.

Israel's sin is the sin of the world. It is your sin and mine. Ransomed from death and made His children in Baptism, we fall prey to the idols of this world. We remain a "stiff-necked people," resisting His will for us like an ox refuses the plowman's yoke (see Jeremiah 7:26).

Like Israel, in our sin we push God away and reject our divine sonship. Once He called us "my people" (see Exodus 3:10; 6:7). But our sin makes us "no people," people He should, in justice, disown (see Deuteronomy 32:21; 1 Peter 2:10).

Yet in His mercy, He is faithful to the covenant He swore by His own self in Jesus. In Jesus, God comes to Israel and to each of us—as a shepherd to seek the lost (see Ezekiel 34:11–16), to carry us back to the heavenly feast, the perpetual heritage promised long ago to Abraham's children.

"Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners," Paul cries in today's Epistle. These are the happiest words the world has ever known. Because of Jesus, as Paul himself can testify, even the blasphemer and persecutor can seek His mercy.

As the sinners do in today's Gospel, we draw near to listen to Him. In this Eucharist, we bring Him the acceptable sacrifice we sing of in today's Psalm—our hearts, humbled and contrite.

In the company of His angels and saints, we rejoice that He has wiped out our offense. We celebrate with Him that we have turned from the evil way that we might live (see Ezekiel 18:23).

# **CATECHISM** of the Catholic Church

Sharing a meal was a sign of friendship and reconciliation; thus, to the Pharisees, Christ appeared to be accepting of sinners. He used this opportunity to show that the mission is to call sinners to repentance, for which there is more reason to rejoice than there is over those who have never strayed from the faith.

**§545** Jesus invites sinners to the table of the kingdom: "I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." He invites them to that conversion without which one cannot enter the kingdom, but shows them in word and deed his Father's boundless mercy for them and the vast "joy in heaven over one sinner who repents". The supreme proof of his love will be the sacrifice of his own life "for the forgiveness of sins.

**§1443** During his public life Jesus not only forgave sins, but also made plain the effect of this forgiveness: he reintegrated forgiven sinners into the community of the People of God from which sin had alienated or even excluded them. A remarkable sign of this is the fact that Jesus receives sinners at his table, a gesture that expresses in an astonishing way both God's forgiveness and the return to the bosom of the People of God.

### **BUSCANDO A LOS PERDIDOS**

# Scott Hahn reflexiona sobre el XXIV Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

El episodio de la primera lectura del domingo ha sido llamado "el pecado original de Israel". Liberado de la esclavitud, nacido como pueblo de Dios en la Alianza del Sinaí, Israel se apartó de sus caminos y cayó al adorar un becerro de oro.

Moisés implora la misericordia de Dios, como Jesús intercederá después por toda la raza humana; como ahora, sentado a la derecha del Padre, aboga por los pecadores mediante el ministerio de la Iglesia. El pecado de Israel es el pecado del mundo. Es tu pecado y el mío. Aunque hemos sido rescatados de la muerte y convertidos en sus hijos por el Bautismo, caemos en las trampas de los ídolos de este mundo. Seguimos siendo un pueblo "de dura cerviz" que se resiste a su Voluntad, como un buey rechaza la yunta del labrador (cfr. Jr 7,26).

Como Israel, en nuestro pecado intentamos alejar a Dios, rechazamos nuestra filiación divina. Antes, Él nos había llamado "mi pueblo" (cfr. Ex 3,10; 6,7). Pero nuestro pecado nos hace "no pueblo", pueblo que Él en justicia debería repudiar (cfr. Dt 32,21; 1Pe 2,10).

Sin embargo Dios, por su misericordia, es fiel a la alianza que juró por Sí mismo en Jesús. En Él, Dios viene a Israel y a cada uno de nosotros, como pastor que busca los que se han perdido (cfr. Ez 34,11-16), para conducirnos de vuelta al banquete celestial, a la herencia perpetua prometida mucho tiempo atrás a los hijos de Abraham.

"Cristo Jesús vino al mundo para salvar a los pecadores", grita Pablo en la epístola del domingo. Esas son las palabras más felices que el mundo ha conocido jamás. Por Jesús, como Pablo mismo testifica, incluso el blasfemo y persecutor pueden buscar misericordia.

Como los pecadores del Evangelio de esta semana, nos acercamos a Jesús para escucharle. En esta Eucaristía le traemos el sacrificio agradable del que cantamos en el salmo de hoy: nuestros corazón contrito y humillado.

En la compañía de sus ángeles y santos, nos alegramos porque ha borrado nuestras ofensas; celebramos con Él que hemos regresado del camino malvado para que pudiéramos vivir (cfr. Ez 18,23).

# CATECISMO de la Iglesia Católica

Compartir una comida era signo de amistad y reconciliación; así, para los fariseos, Cristo parecía estar aceptando a los pecadores. Aprovechó esta oportunidad para mostrar que la misión es llamar a los pecadores al arrepentimiento, por lo cual hay más motivos para regocijarse que los que hay por aquellos que nunca se han desviado de la fe.

**§545** Jesús invita a los pecadores al banquete del Reino: "No he venido a llamar a justos sino a pecadores". Les invita a la conversión, sin la cual no se puede entrar en el Reino, pero les muestra de palabra y con hechos la misericordia sin límites de su Padre hacia ellos y la inmensa "alegría en el cielo por un solo pecador que se convierta". La prueba suprema de este amor será el sacrificio de su propia vida "para remisión de los pecados" (Mt 26, 28).

**§1443** Durante su vida pública, Jesús no sólo perdonó los pecados, también manifestó el efecto de este perdón: a los pecadores que son perdonados los vuelve a integrar en la comunidad del pueblo de Dios, de donde el pecado los había alejado o incluso excluido. Un signo manifiesto de ello es el hecho de que Jesús admite a los pecadores a su mesa, más aún, Él mismo se sienta a su mesa, gesto que expresa de manera conmovedora, a la vez, el perdón de Dios (cf Lc 15) y el retorno al seno del pueblo de Dios (cf Lc 19,9).



Saint John Chrysostom Feast Day - September 13

Born in Antioch in the 4th century, and raised by his widowed mother, Saint John received a rigorous classical education. He was first called to the ascetic life, even spending time as an anchorite living in a cave near Antioch. However, this life of extreme mortification was hard on his physical body, and he eventually returned to the city to recover.

Saint John was ordained in 298. He spent the next 12

years preaching in the Cathedral of Antioch, and it was most likely during this time that he earned the name Chrysostom which means "golden-mouthed." In 397 or 398 he was made archbishop of Constantinople against89p; his will. This post placed Saint John in the midst of imperial politics. But he would not be drawn in. He kept a modest household without extravagance and refused to serve the

sumptuous suppers for political supplicants that predecessors in the position had. He preached against corruption and decadence and fought for the reform of clergy even deposing corrupt bishops. Unfortunately, this high moral stance made enemies

of powerful people at court and in the Church. They conspired against him and eventually Saint John was exiled to Armenia. He died in exile in 407. He was made a Father of the Church at the Council of Chalcedon in 451 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1568.


### THE RELUCTANT SAINT: ST. JOSEPH OF CUPERTINO


