Do I need my money more than I need God?

We have to be honest, really honest, about why giving matters.

With matters of money, we get one of our greatest opportunities to reflect the generosity of Christ, and instead we always end up looking very human; very selfish instead of self-giving, very greedy instead of very faithful.

First and foremost, giving matters because God has given so much for me, for all of us; God in Christ gave himself for me, how could I not give back to him? It would be like receiving a gift from a friend and never saying "thank you." God has given us clear instructions about how to say "thank you" to him, and that is that we return to him a portion of our first fruits;

My faith would be incomplete if I didn't say "thank you" to God; not just through my prayers, worship, or devotional practices, but also through my giving.

Similarly, my faith would be incomplete if I didn't give to God because that says that I don't trust God with my resources. More specifically, it says that I need my money more than I need God.

Do I need my money more than I need God?

When we figure our monthly budget, this is the first obligation that is considered; it is our "first fruits." If things are tight, we shouldn't cut what we give to God, we make sacrifices in other areas; like eating out or going to the movies.

Giving makes us better financial managers, and it also keeps us from getting too attached to "stuff" because often we have to say "no" to stuff so that we can fulfill our gratitude to God.

Giving is one of our ways of saying "thank you" to God.

Certainly, there are lots of things that I would love to use that money for. It would be nice to have an iPad or an expensive pair of shoes, or the largest TV set. But those are not necessities, and as faithful Christians, our devotion to God through giving is a necessity. Giving matters because God matters.

When we give to God out of our surplus, it means we are making decisions on how we spend our money based on societal pressures, which these days means "more, more, more."

From everywhere we are bombarded with "ideas" that try to convince us that we must have the next great gadget or the new car; we have to have a bigger TV and change our car every year or a new pair of shoes every other month. We have to "keep up with the Joneses" as the saying goes. And we become so consumed with our desire for more that we really become slaves to our money. But when we give sacrificially to God and to God's purposes, we have to detach ourselves from the "stuff," which invariably means we are freed to better serve God.

We have to make decisions about big purchases instead of just "impulse buying." We have to make sacrifices and determine what is really "necessary" and what is not. And when we make financial decisions with God in mind first, it also enables us to plan and save for the future, for the well-being of ourselves and our children.

And we'll be surprised that in giving to God generously out of our first fruits, we still have all that our family needs.

So what is generous and sacrificial giving to God? Let's read this passage from Luke 21:

«...As Jesus looked up, he saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. "Truly I tell you," he said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on."...»

The widow in this reading gave everything. E-V-E-R-Y-T-H-I-N-G! The widow's gift of her whole livelihood was unthinkable and even foolish. It seems as if she gave everything in exchange for nothing! But did she? She gave her whole life to God. She gave everything she had and everything she was. She was entrusting her whole self to God. Her two tiny coins were the final, foolish, unspeakable, humble, outward manifestation of that absolute gift. Her gift was so humble that no one knew its magnitude except for her Lord. She is, in fact, what we are called to be: a tiny, flashing, mirror that reflects the final, foolish, unspeakably humble and utterly self-giving of God to us in his Son Jesus Christ.

I know that we live in a culture which is so dependent on money. And in no way is this Scripture passage insisting that any of us literally give all our money away. What it is talking about is proportional giving and the priorities in our lives. I know that for many, tithing can seem a bit intimidating. But tithing is neither a floor, nor a ceiling. If you don't give now, how about giving one percent of your income? If you currently give one percent, try moving to two. You get the picture... And as you plan for giving to God, you will discover that so many other things fall into place for you as well.

We give to God because we are disciples of Jesus Christ. We give to God out of thanksgiving for God's great gifts along our lives. We give to God so that the Church can use that money to reach others with the message that has so changed our lives and the lives of many. We give to God out of love for God and neighbor! And we give to God in order to be able to keep our own focus on Jesus Christ! That's why giving matters.

It's only in giving our lives completely and totally over to God that we find life abundant.

This is a beautiful challenge in our lives, to grow in our giving to God! May it be so. Amen.

Year of Prayer - Kevin Fritz, Director of Liturgy

After the Sign of Peace, the priest assisted by the deacon breaks the bread that is the Body of Christ – the Eucharistic Bread. The Eucharistic Bread is broken so it may be shared but it also represents our unity. Just as many grains of wheat have come together to make one bread, this one bread is now broken and distributed to us so we may become one body – one community – in Christ.

When breaking the Eucharistic bread a piece is placed in the chalice of the Blood of Christ “to signify the unity of the Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation...” (GIRM #83) As this is done, the priest prays: May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it.

This action is accompanied by the singing of the Agnes Dei (Lamb of God). Jesus is the lamb who was sacrificed to take away our sins and conquer death so that we might have the fullness of life – the gift of salvation. When we say Lamb of God we make reference to the title given to Jesus by John the Baptist: “The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God,* who takes away the sin of the world” (John 1:29).

“In the Eucharistic Bread, broken for the life of the world, the prayerful assembly recognizes the true Lamb of God, namely, Christ the Redeemer, and implores him: “Have mercy on us ... grant us peace” (Francis, General Audience, March 14, 2018).

We now prepare ourselves to receive the Body and Blood of Christ in communion. “The priest prepares himself by a prayer said quietly, so that he might faithfully receive the Body and Blood of Christ. The faithful do the same, praying silently” (General Instruction: #84).

We are now invited to receive the Body and Blood of Christ” “Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.” The invitation to communion is an invitation to the marriage feast of the lamb, an invitation that “...calls us to experience intimate union with Christ, the source of joy and holiness” (Francis, General Audience, March 21, 2018).

We respond using the words of the Roman centurion in the Gospel who placed his faith and trust in Christ knowing that his servant could be healed (see Matthew 8:5-13): “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.” With faith and trust we approach to receive the Body and Blood of Christ so we may be healed of our sinfulness and transformed into images of Christ.

Upcoming Year of Prayer Events

Friday November 9 - 7 pm - Taize Prayer Service

Taizé (tie-zāy) is a simple meditative prayer service in a setting of soft candlelight that fosters communion with God. Christ is the center of Taizé reflection and the candlelight signifies that Jesus Christ has conquered the darkness of death and sin. It is through Christ's sacrifice that an offer of new life is given. Through beautiful music, elegant chants, thoughtful scriptures and times of private prayer in silence, participants are invited to stillness and to listen for and to the voice of God. One of the rules of Taizé as stated by its founder, Brother Roger, is to keep inner silence always, and you will dwell in Christ for it is through inner silence that makes possible our conversation with God. (Br. Roger of Taizé)

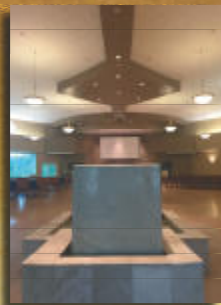

FAQ about St. Mark's St. Vincent de Paul Thanksgiving Food Drive

How long has St. Mark's St. Vincent de Paul Thanksgiving Food Drive been taking place?

Our first Thanksgiving Food Drive was conceived and executed 19 years ago in 1999 by parishioners Roger & Joyce Griffey with 15 boxes, each including a 16-18 pound frozen turkey with all the fixings necessary for a full Thanksgiving Day meal. We have certainly grown since then, particularly in the number of families helped which is made possible only by the generosity of you, our parishioners.

Why bother with one day a year when so many others seem to have it covered?

Aside from the blessings our stewards get by acting as the Face of Christ for others delivering a holiday meal, a smile and a Thanksgiving Prayer (included in each box)...

Aside from sharing the extreme blessing God has given us. *Much will be required from the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more. Luke 12:48.*

Unfortunately we find that others DO NOT HAVE THIS NEED COVERED:

- ♦ Our Parish Office receives an average 70 calls/week from those in need that are transferred to St. Vincent de Paul.
- ♦ St. Vincent de Paul stewards make approximately 16 home visits per month to better understand the needs of the callers in extreme need so we can help.
- ♦ In total, we helped 183 families with their mortgages, rent, utilities and other necessities per year.
- ♦ We serve an average of 130 families a month at our SVDP Food Pantry located in the rear of The Venetian each Tuesday from 3-6pm. This totals to 1,558 families receiving 77,646 pounds of food per year (NOT including our Thanksgiving Food Drive).

The Thanksgiving Food Drive helps over 1,000 families in need which is nearly equal to the WHOLE YEAR of our St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry effort in ONE DAY ALONE!!

Ask Jared: What is the difference between the Old and the New Testament?



Fundamentally, the difference between the Old Testament and the New Testament is Jesus. Everything in the Old Testament has to do with things that happened before God became Incarnate in the Person of Jesus Christ, while the New Testament tells the story of Jesus and his first followers.

However, there are some other differences, such as the number and variety of books, the span of time during which they were compiled, and the original languages they were written in. Theologically, it is important to understand that the Old Testament is accepted as the Jewish holy book as well as part of the Christian Bible. And the writers of the New Testament were Jews who had extensive knowledge of the Old Testament. Much of the New Testament is a re-interpretation of the Old Testament in light of what the early Christians had come to understand about Jesus, to the point that the Catechism of the Catholic Church quotes "an old saying" often attributed to St. Augustine: "the New Testament lies hidden in the Old and the Old Testament is unveiled in the New" (CCC 129).

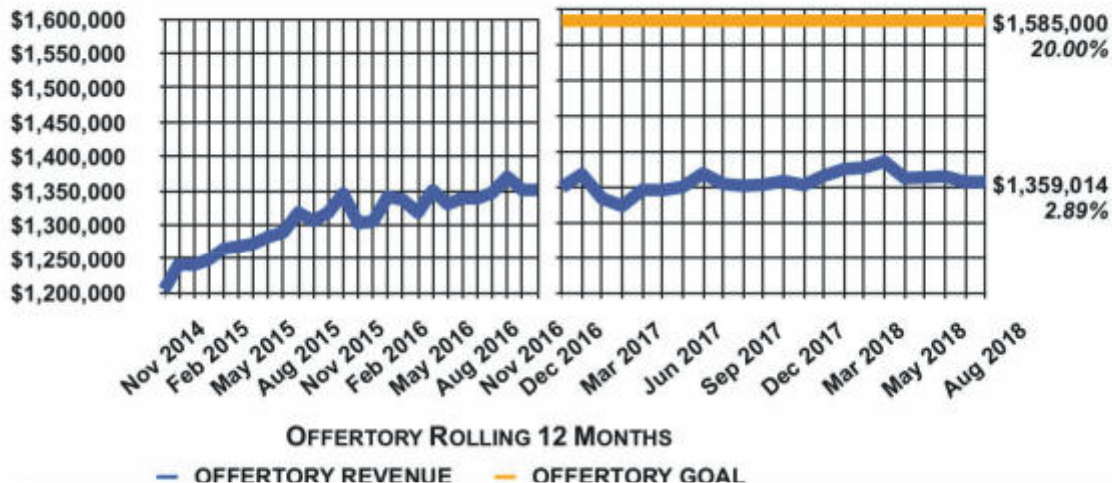

Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you are required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are then taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

A new law was passed on 12/15/2015 allowing you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you save \$1000 in taxes.

Huye del relativismo moral

"El ciego soltó el manto, dio un salto y se acercó a Jesús. Jesús le dijo: ¿Qué quieres que haga por ti? El ciego le contestó: Maestro, que pueda ver. Jesús le dijo: Anda, tu fe te ha curado. Y al momento recobró la vista y lo seguía por el camino." (Mc 10, 46-52)

El ciego Bartimeo era un enfermo que sufría y quería dejar de sufrir, quería recobrar la vista. Por eso se atrevió a molestar a Jesús. Llegó incluso a enfadar, con su insistencia, a los que acompañaban al Maestro. Bartimeo tenía, pues, tres características: Estaba ciego y lo sabía, le dolía estarlo y quería curarse, y puso los medios para conseguirlo.

Si el caso de Bartimeo lo trasladamos a la ceguera moral, tan frecuente hoy, vemos que las características de aquel hombre no se suelen dar ahora. En primer lugar, la gente se niega a reconocer que está ciega, es decir que se niega a aceptar el criterio moral de la Iglesia y prefiere decir que lo que le conviene es bueno aunque en realidad sea malo. En segundo lugar, como no se quieren reconocer como ciegos, no les duele y no buscan curarse. Por eso precisamente no se curan. Se puede decir, por lo tanto, de muchos hombres y mujeres de nuestra época que no hay peor ciego que el que no quiere ver, a lo que habría que añadir que si no se quiere ver es porque no les conviene ver.

Imitemos a Bartimeo. Reconozcamos nuestros pecados. No nos importe que sean abundantes o reiterativos. La misericordia de Dios es infinita y no hay culpa que no pueda ser perdonada. Dios está deseando curarnos las veces que haga falta. Sólo espera que se lo pidamos, con insistencia y con humildad.

Propósito: Hacer examen de conciencia de los propios pecados y pedir perdón, sin importar que sean faltas que cometemos muchas veces. Aceptar los criterios morales de la Iglesia

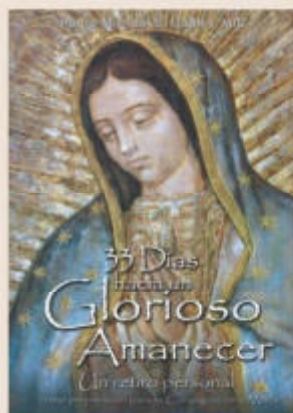
