

Teachings from this Week's Liturgy - Deacon Jose Moronta

Lenten historical review of the 'Plan of Salvation' - Chapter Two

Last Sunday we wrote that "during the Five Sundays of Lent, the storyline of the Liturgy of the Word is dictated by the First Readings. They will take us to a walk through the "Story of Salvation", one chapter at a time on each Sunday." Today we've got the 'second chapter' of such historical recount.

In today's first reading we hear of God's first covenant with Abram. Previously we read in Genesis that God had made a three-fold promise of blessing to Abram: nationhood, dynasty (name), and worldwide blessing. These promises were then secured by covenants.

Abram was called at the age of 75 when the Lord told him "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you". Abram obediently set out with Sari his wife, Lot his nephew, and all the possessions and servants they had acquired and went to Canaan. Canaan was occupied by the descendants of Canaan the son of Ham (who was one of the three sons of Noah).

Canaan was cursed by Noah because of his father's actions when he discovered Noah drunk in his tent. Because of the curse, the Canaanites were thought to be subject people of the Semites (descendants of Shem, the firstborn of the three sons of Noah).

After living in Canaan, Abram fled to Egypt to escape the famine that came over that land. While in Egypt Abram passed Sari off as his sister and she was incorporated into Pharaoh's harem. Because of this, God inflicted serious diseases upon Pharaoh and his household. Pharaoh then learned of the deception and expelled Abram and Sari and all their possessions. Abram and Lot then separated, and Lot went to live near Sodom while Abram returned to Canaan.

Four kings took Lot prisoner. Upon hearing of Lot's capture, Abram took his 318 trained men and defeated them. When he returned, he was blessed by Melchizedek, the king of Salem and priest of God Most High.

This brings us up to the time of our reading today, some 10 years after Abram started on his journey. Abram (the name means "father who is exalted") and Sari remain childless although God had promised him once he arrived in Canaan that He would give the land to his offspring. Abram has despaired to God that he has no offspring and that his servant will inherit his estate.

God now makes His promise into a covenant, as we read in the First Reading today:

«... God took him outside and said: "Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so," he added, "shall your descendants be." ... Abram put his faith in the Lord... It was on that occasion that the Lord made a covenant with Abram...»

Repaso histórico del 'Plan de Salvación' en Cuaresma - Capítulo Dos

El domingo pasado escribimos que "durante los cinco domingos de Cuaresma, el tópico de la Liturgia de la Palabra está dictada por las Primeras Lecturas. Nos llevarán a un paseo por la "Historia de la Salvación", un capítulo a la vez cada domingo. Hoy tenemos el "segundo capítulo" de tal recuento histórico.

En la primera lectura de hoy escuchamos del primer pacto de Dios con Abram. Anteriormente leemos en Génesis que Dios había hecho una promesa triple de bendición a Abram: nacionalidad, dinastía (nombre) y bendición mundial. Estas promesas fueron aseguradas por las alianzas.

Abram fue llamado a la edad de 75 años cuando el Señor le dijo: "Deja tu país, tu gente y la casa de tu padre y ve a la tierra que te mostraré". Abram partió obedientemente con Sarai, su esposa, Lot, su sobrino y todas las posesiones y sirvientes que habían adquirido y fueron a Canaán. Canaán estaba ocupada por los descendientes de Canaán, hijo de Cam (que era uno de los tres hijos de Noé).

Canaán fue maldecido por Noé debido a las acciones de su padre cuando descubrió a Noé borracho en su tienda. Debido a la maldición, se pensaba que los cananeos eran súbditos de los semitas (descendientes de Sem, el primogénito de los tres hijos de Noé).

Después de vivir en Canaán, Abram huyó a Egipto para escapar de la hambruna que vino sobre esa tierra. Mientras estaba en Egipto, Abram hizo pasar a Sarai como su hermana y ella fue incorporada al harén del faraón. Debido a esto, Dios infligió enfermedades graves al faraón y su familia. El faraón se enteró del engaño y expulsó a Abram y Sarai con todas sus posesiones. Abram y Lot se separaron, y Lot se fue a vivir cerca de Sodoma mientras Abram regresaba a Canaán.

Cuatro reyes hicieron prisionero a Lot. Al enterarse de la captura de Lot, Abram tomó a sus 318 hombres entrenados y los derrotó. Cuando regresó, fue bendecido por Melquisedec, el rey de Salem y sacerdote del Dios Altísimo.

Esto nos lleva al momento de nuestra lectura de hoy, unos 10 años después de que Abram comenzó su viaje. Abram (el nombre significa "padre que es exaltado") y Sarai permanecen sin hijos, aunque Dios le prometió una vez que llegó a Canaán que le daría la tierra a su descendencia. Abram se desepera ante Dios porque no tiene descendencia y será su siervo quien heredaría su patrimonio.

Dios ahora hace su promesa en una alianza, tal como leemos en la primera lectura de hoy:

«...Dios sacó a Abram de su casa y le dijo: "Mira el cielo y cuenta las estrellas, si puedes". Luego añadió: "Así será tu descendencia"... Abram creyó lo que el Señor le decía y, por esa fe, el Señor lo tuvo por justo... de esta manera hizo el Señor, aquel día, una alianza con Abram...»

Ask Jared:

What happens if I can't make it to the Confirmation Mass?

If you aren't able to attend the scheduled Confirmation liturgy, you will have to wait for a future opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. In the Latin or Western Church, Confirmation is normally conferred only by the bishop. There are some exceptions to this rule, but essen-



tially Confirmation will only be celebrated in our parish on a special occasion that has been planned well in advance. We cannot licitly confirm a teen whenever we want.

Most likely, if you miss the Confirmation Mass, you will have to wait for the next scheduled Adult Confirmation liturgy. However, even in this case, everything must be planned well in advance because our pastor must receive permission ("faculty") from the bishop to confirm a baptized Catholic. We request this permission by submitting the names of everyone who will receive Confirmation, so it is very specific!

Orar/ Pray - The Season of Lent

During the season of Lent we examine and reflect on the reality of sin and the need for penance in our lives. The journey of Lent leads us from the ashes received at the beginning of Lent to the renewal of baptism at Easter. This journey from ashes to water, from death to life enables us to enter more deeply into the process of conversion as we continue on the journey of life that leads us to eternal life with God.

Ash Wednesday - March 6 - Distribution of ashes during:

Mass 8:30 am * Communion Service 12 Noon * Mass 7:30 pm (bilingual)

Regulations on Fasting and Abstinence

The dual disciplines of fasting and abstinence have a long history in the Catholic Church. Going back to the early Church, the purpose behind the custom of self denial is not punishment; it is to simplify our lifestyles so that we create a certain emptiness. In this way, freed from all distractions, we are able to hear and respond to God's continued call to conversion and holiness.

- Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 to 59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence.

NOTE: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or the renewal of baptism at Easter.

Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you are required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS.

These distributions are then taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

A new law was passed on 12/15/2015 allowing you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you save \$1000 in taxes. A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If you want to contribute from your 2019 required annual distribution or even from your current IRA, instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.

This is a great way to fulfill your pledge and/or contribute your annual offering in a lump sum.


A la luz de la gloria por la sombra de la cruz
