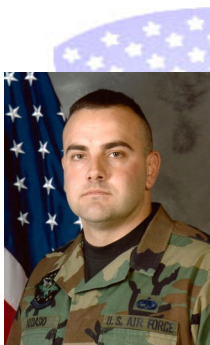

Teachings from this Week's Liturgy - Deacon Jose Moronta

Pentecost, a special date with different names in ancient times

Pentecost is an Israelite-Jewish festival. In Exodus 23 it is called simply the harvest festival, the feast of first-fruits of the grain harvest. In Exodus 34 it is called the feast of weeks, the first-fruits of the grain harvest. In Leviticus 23 the feast is reckoned by counting seven weeks from the beginning of the grain harvest; it is a day of Sabbatical observance. In Numbers 28 it is called the feast of weeks, the day of first-fruits. In Deuteronomy 16 it is the feast of weeks, which occurs seven weeks after the beginning of the grain harvest. It is one of the three major festivals in Old Testament.

This celebration most probably did not take form until the Israelites had become a primarily agricultural community in Canaan, after wandering in the desert for forty years. It always falls in Spring, when the first harvest are being collected. The beginning of the grain harvest corresponds with the feast of Matzoth (unleavened bread). When Passover and Matzoth were combined, "the festival of weeks" received a regular date in the calendar seven weeks (50 days) after Passover. The name "Pentecost" has a Greek origin, to mean those 50 days.

As a major feast, all Jewish males over the age of twelve were expected to try to celebrate it in Jerusalem. This explains the abundance of nation names and ethnical nomenclature in the First Reading of today's Mass.

Two different "like" symbols for the Holy Spirit

From the First Reading we have the reason to call the Third Holy Person of the Trinity "spirit":

«...And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were...»

Our English translations use the word "wind" to describe the noise that was heard. There is a phonetic relationship in the Greek between "pnue" (wind) and "pneuma" (spirit). In Hebrew the word "ruah" is the same for "wind", "breath", and "spirit". There is another passage in the Bible, in the Book of Genesis, when we read that God "breathed" into Adam to communicate life. It was understood that God made human life possible by using "ruah", or in other words, his spirit. Let's remember that in the Creed at the Mass we confess our faith in the Holy Spirit, "the giver of life".

Another symbol we associate with the Holy Spirit is a white dove. However it is convenient to have in mind that the Holy Spirit is not a white dove, nor is present when we see a white dove. A dove, after all, is just an animal and the Holy Spirit is God, nothing to compare. The symbolic use of the word comes from the passage of Jesus' Baptism:

«...on coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit of God, like a dove, descending upon him...»

Here, as with the quoted sentence from the First Reading a very important word must be considered: "like a". «...a noise like a strong wind...» and «...like a dove...». Nowhere the Word of God says that a dove came down from heaven nor that there was a strong wind in the room on Pentecost.

Pentecostés, una fecha especial con diferentes nombres en la antigüedad.

Pentecostés es un festival israelita-judío. En Éxodo 23 se le llama simplemente el festival de la cosecha, la fiesta de los primeros frutos de la cosecha de granos. En Éxodo 34 se llama la fiesta de las semanas, los primeros frutos de la cosecha de grano. En Levítico 23, se cuenta la fiesta contando siete semanas desde el comienzo de la cosecha de grano; Es un día de observancia sabática. En Números 28 se llama la fiesta de las semanas, el día de los primeros frutos. En Deuteronomio 16 es la fiesta de las semanas, que tiene lugar siete semanas después del comienzo de la cosecha del grano. Es uno de los tres festivales principales del Antiguo testamento.

Esta celebración probablemente no tomó forma hasta que los israelitas se convirtieron en una comunidad principalmente agrícola en Canaán, después de haber estado en el desierto durante cuarenta años. Siempre cae en primavera, cuando se recogen las primeras cosechas. El comienzo de la cosecha de granos se corresponde con la fiesta de Matzoth (pan sin levadura). Cuando se combinaron las fiestas de Pascua y Matzoth, "el festival de las semanas" recibió una fecha regular en el calendario, a siete semanas (50 días) después de la Pascua. El nombre "Pentecostés" tiene un origen griego, que significa esos 50 días.

Como una gran fiesta, se esperaba que todos los varones judíos mayores de doce años trataran de celebrarlo en Jerusalén. Esto explica la abundancia de los nombres de las naciones y nacionalidades en la primera lectura de la misa de hoy.

Dos "como" símbolos diferentes para el Espíritu Santo

En la primera lectura encontramos la razón para llamar "espíritu" a la Tercera Divina Persona de la Trinidad:

«... Y de repente vino del cielo un ruido como de un fuerte viento que llenó toda el lugar en que estaban ...»

Nuestras traducciones al castellano usan la palabra "viento" para describir el ruido que se escuchó. Hay una relación fonética en el griego entre "pnue" (viento) y "pneuma" (espíritu). En hebreo, la palabra "ruah" es la misma para "viento", "aliento" y "espíritu". Hay otro pasaje en la Biblia, en el Libro de Génesis, cuando leemos que Dios "inspiró" a Adán para comunicarle vida. Se entendió que Dios hizo posible la vida humana usando "ruah", o en otras palabras, su propio espíritu. Recordemos que en el Credo de la Misa confesamos nuestra fe en el Espíritu Santo, "dador de vida".

Otro símbolo que asociamos con el Espíritu Santo es una paloma blanca. Sin embargo, es conveniente tener en cuenta que el Espíritu Santo ni es una paloma blanca, ni está presente cuando vemos una paloma blanca. Una paloma, después de todo, es tan solo un animal y el Espíritu Santo es Dios, nada que comparar. El uso simbólico de la palabra proviene del pasaje del bautismo de Jesús:

«... al salir del agua, vio cómo se abrían los cielos y el Espíritu de Dios, como una paloma, descendiendo sobre él ...»

Aquí, al igual que con la frase citada de la Primera Lectura, una palabra muy importante debe considerarse: "como". «... un ruido como un fuerte viento ...» y «... como una paloma ...». En ninguna parte la Palabra de Dios dice que una paloma bajó del cielo ni que hubo un fuerte viento en la habitación en Pentecostés.

Ask Jared: Why do people die?

While the purpose and nature of death in God's original plan for Creation is certainly a mystery, we do know a few things, some of which might be surprising. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Even though man's nature is mortal, God had destined him not to die. Death was therefore contrary to the plans of God the Creator and entered the world as a consequence of sin" (CCC 1008). In other words, until Adam and Eve sinned in the Garden of Eden, they were not subject to death.



We don't know exactly how God intended for man's earthly life to give way to eternal bliss in heaven before Original Sin. We don't know exactly what kind of life we will enjoy after Christ's return, when "the last enemy to be destroyed is death" (1 Corinthians 15:26). But we can say for sure that humans die as a result of Adam and Eve's sin and that one day, God will definitively remove this mortal limitation.

In the meantime, we can find hope even in the face of death. As Christians, we know that death is the door by which we pass from earthly life, with its sorrows and sufferings, to eternal life, which we hope to spend with God in heaven. The Catechism includes very beautiful and thought-provoking reflections on the meaning of "Dying in Christ Jesus" in paragraphs 1005-1014.

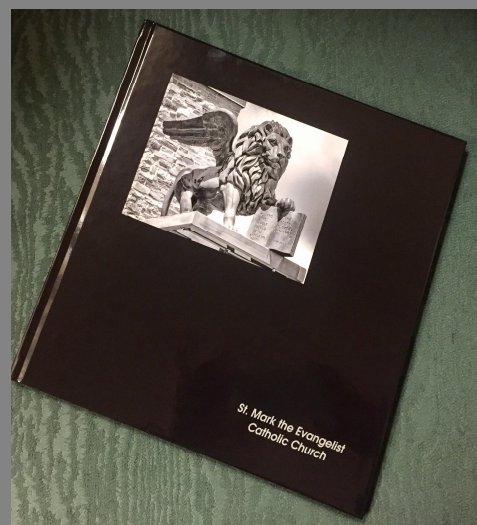

Square Kiosk Giving - via Debit/Credit Card located at the Information Desk in the Social Narthex.

Text To Give - via Smartphone - **Dial 813-296-5116.**

The first time you do this, please text your donation amount, (ex: 25 which will result in a \$25 donation). A return text will be sent back to you immediately requesting you to set up your giving info. Once complete, you will receive a confirmation text stating, "Successful Registration and Donation".

For future Text To Give donations, you only need to text the dollar amount you wish to donate and the name of the fund you wish to donate to. Available Fund Names: Offertory, Capital Campaign, APA.

Examples of what you would text: 10 offertory or 5 capital campaign.

After texting your donation amount & fund name, you will receive a confirmation text stating "Your giving was successful".

Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you are required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS.

These distributions are then taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

A new law was passed on 12/15/2015 allowing you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you save \$1000 in taxes. A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If you want to contribute from your 2019 required annual distribution or even from your current IRA, instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.

This is a great way to fulfill your pledge and/or contribute your annual offering in a lump sum.

Pentecostés: Espíritu de perdón

"Y dicho esto, exhaló su aliento sobre ellos y les dijo: 'Recibid el Espíritu Santo; a quienes les perdonéis los pecados, les quedan perdonados; a quienes se los retengáis, les quedan retenidos'".

(Jn 20, 22-23)



Pentecostés, la solemnidad litúrgica en la que se celebra la venida del Espíritu Santo sobre la Virgen María y los apóstoles, nos debe ayudar a recordar los orígenes de la Iglesia. En Pentecostés, los discípulos de Jesús pasaron de ser un grupo lleno de miedo a ser una comunidad unida y decidida a dar la vida por Cristo. Y todo eso gracias a la fuerza de Dios, recibida a través del Espíritu Santo. Para

aquel primer grupo de discípulos, este cambio supuso, efectivamente, la persecución, la tortura y el martirio. De este modo pusieron de manifiesto que lo que les movía no era ningún tipo de negocio mundano -búsqueda de dinero o poder-, sino la certeza de que habían visto a Cristo resucitado.

Pero dar la vida por el Señor no es sólo una cuestión ligada al martirio. Hay muchas formas de dar la vida, porque en el fondo cada vez que se ama de verdad a alguien se está dando la vida por él. Una de estas formas es la de perdonar a los que nos han ofendido. Por eso, cuando Jesús otorga el Espíritu Santo a los apóstoles les da el mandato de perdonar los pecados. Ellos, los primeros sacerdotes, podían desde aquel momento impartir el perdón sacramental, lo mismo que siguen haciendo los sacerdotes católicos hoy en día. La mayor parte de los cristianos, al ser laicos, no pueden impartir ese sacramento, pero sí pueden perdonar a sus enemigos. Y una vez más constatamos que es difícil y a veces imposible. Por eso debemos renovar nuestra fe en la fuerza de Dios, que será la única que nos haga capaces de amar hasta el punto de perdonar. Y debemos pedir el Espíritu del perdón para poderlo llevar a la práctica.

Propósito: Pedir a Dios que nos ayude a perdonar y luego intentar aplicarlo. Para hacerlo más fácil, empezar por practicar lo que Cristo nos mandó: rezar por nuestros enemigos.

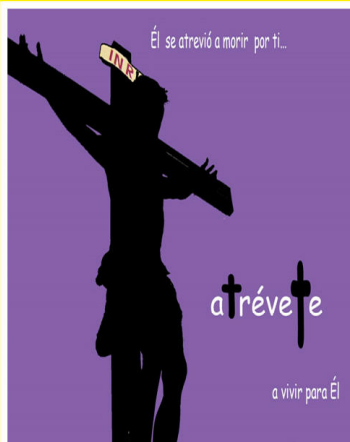

MARIA MADRE DE LA IGLESIA

A través de un Decreto de la Congregación para el Culto Divino, el Vaticano ha establecido que la memoria de la “Virgen María, Madre de la Iglesia” se celebre cada año el lunes siguiente a Pentecostés.

“El Sumo Pontífice Francisco, considerando atentamente que la promoción de esta devoción puede incrementar el sentido materno de la Iglesia en los Pastores, en los religiosos y en los fieles, así como la genuina piedad mariana, ha establecido que la memoria de la bienaventurada Virgen María, Madre de la Iglesia, sea inscrita en el Calendario Romano el lunes después de Pentecostés y sea celebrada cada año”, dice el documento.

En el decreto, la misma Congregación señala que “esta celebración nos ayudará a recordar que el crecimiento de la vida cristiana, debe fundamentarse en el misterio de la Cruz, en la ofrenda de Cristo en el banquete eucarístico, y en la Virgen oferente, Madre del Redentor y de los redimidos”.

“Tal memoria deberá aparecer en todos los Calendarios y Libros litúrgicos para la celebración de la Misa y de la Liturgia de las Horas: los respectivos textos litúrgicos se adjuntan a este decreto y sus traducciones, aprobadas por las Conferencias Episcopales, serán publicadas después de ser confirmadas por este Dicasterio. Donde la celebración de la bienaventurada Virgen María, Madre de la Iglesia, ya se celebra en un día diverso con un grado litúrgico más elevado, según el derecho particular aprobado, puede seguir celebrándose en el futuro del mismo modo”.
