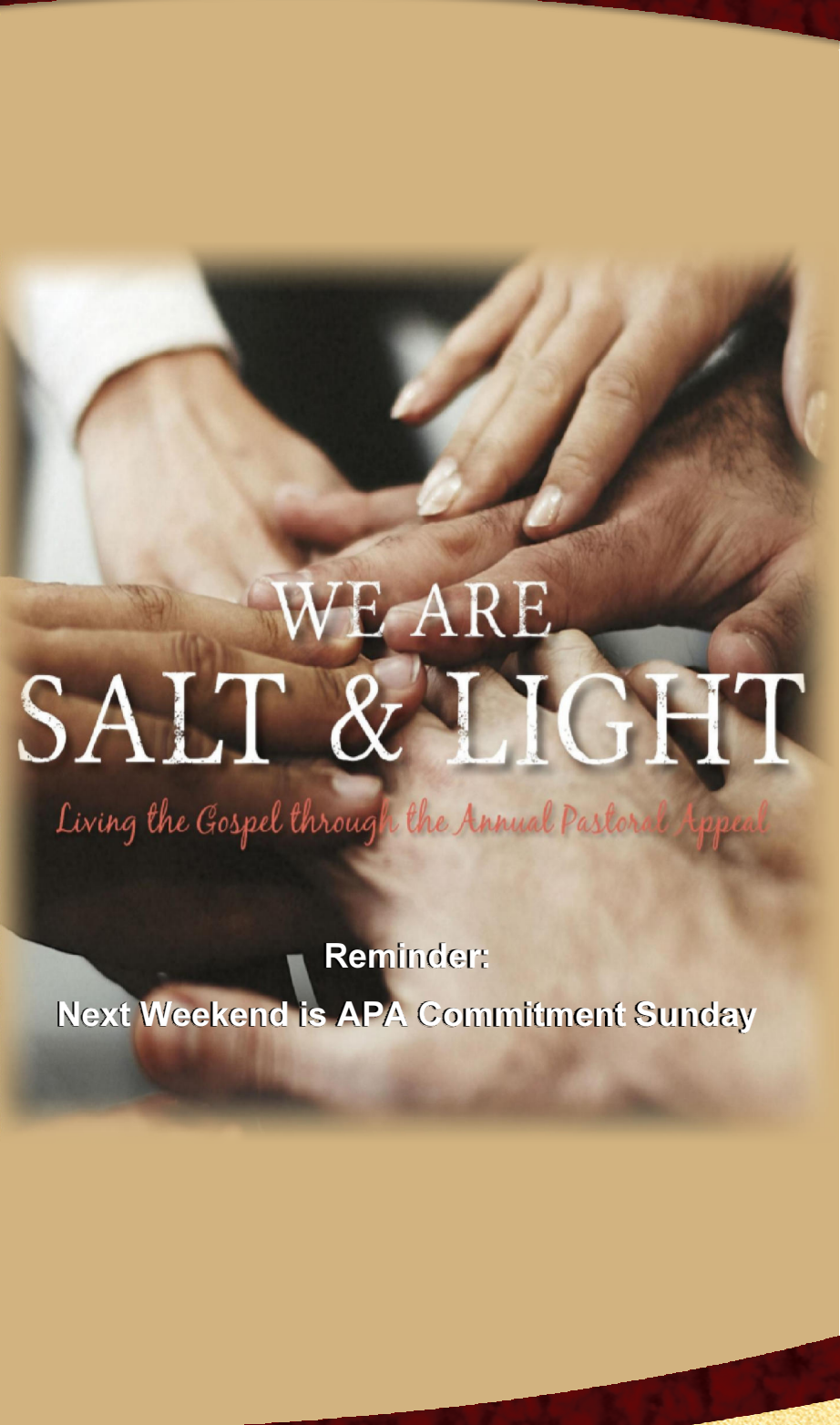

Teachings from this week's liturgy - Deacon Jose Moronta

Let's talk about the Book of the Prophet Isaiah

Today's First Reading has been chosen from the chapter 58 of the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. It belongs to what is considered "a third book" within the whole Book. Let me explain better...

The Book of the Prophet Isaiah has 66 chapters and until the 18th century it was presumed that it had only one author, Isaiah, the prophet who lived about seven centuries before Jesus Christ.

The tradition of single authorship was first questioned in the 12th century (around the year 1167) but serious questions were not raised until the around year 1780. At that time scholars maintained that chapters 40 through 66 were written during the Babylonian exile by a different author who lived some 150 years after Isaiah. They named this unknown author Deutero- or Second-Isaiah.

We know that there are a few poems dedicated to a "suffering servant". Scholars discovered that these "songs" were composed by another third author. They argued for a different author for chapters 56 through 66, who was named "Third Isaiah". This theory was better welcome by Protestant scholars than by their Catholic colleagues, who tolerated it with hesitation. After a negative response of the Pontifical Biblical Commission in 1908 Catholic scholars decided to revert to a conservative viewpoint of single authorship.

There was a theological debate that arrived at the conclusion that the inspiration of major parts of the Bible was not being questioned but only the literary and historical questions of an author's name and date. After this, Catholics began to argue again for the split authorship of Isaiah. Most Catholic scholars now work with a Second and Third-Isaiah thesis. The reasons for separate authorship of chapters 40 through 55 are basically historical: The addressees are no longer inhabitants of Jerusalem, but exiles in Babylon. Jerusalem has in fact been destroyed and now awaits reconstruction. Babylon is no longer an ally, for she has destroyed Jerusalem and deported the Israelites. The former prophecies about Jerusalem's destruction have been carried out (Chapter 1 of the Book) and Israel now awaits a new, more glorious future. In Third-Isaiah (chapters 56 through 66), Israel is back again in her own land, and the problems are different than those pictured in Isaiah chapters 1 through 39.

Jesus preached with insistence about the practice of mercy by his followers and disciples. Toward the end of the gospel of Matthew we read the "final judgment sermon" in which the Lord calls to feed the hungry, dress the naked and comfort the oppressed. This is rather an unusual Theology in the Old Testament and it's clear that Jesus Christ wanted to emphasize about the active practice of love in the form of acts of mercy in addition to all the demands of the different Covenants in the Old Testament. However, this Sunday's First Reading brings an exceptional passage as we read,

«... Sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering the oppressed and the homeless; Clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own.... Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer... If you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; Then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday...»

Although with a different twist from Jesus' sermon, it's obvious that this text wants us to reflect about the fact that when lowliness unites all men, then God will fill the need of the world with his glorious presence... through us. Despite our imperfections, we're called to cooperate in His plans of salvation and mercy for the whole world. Isn't this great?

Hablemos del libro del profeta Isaías

La primera lectura de hoy ha sido elegida del capítulo 58 del Libro del profeta Isaías. Pertenece a lo que se considera "un tercer libro" dentro de todo el Libro. Déjenme explicarlo mejor ...

El Libro del profeta Isaías tiene 66 capítulos y hasta el siglo XVIII se presumía que solo tenía un autor, Isaías, el profeta que vivió unos siete siglos antes de Jesucristo.

La tradición de la autoría única se cuestionó por primera vez en el siglo XII (alrededor del año 1167), pero no se plantearon preguntas serias hasta alrededor del año 1780. En ese momento, los estudiosos sostenían que los capítulos 40 al 66 habían sido escritos durante el exilio en Babilonia por un autor diferente. quien vivió unos 150 años después de Isaías. Llamaron a este autor desconocido Deutero o Segundo-Isaías.

Sabemos que hay algunos poemas dedicados a un "siervo sufriente". Los estudiosos descubrieron que estos "cantos del siervo doliente" fueron compuestos por otro tercer autor, un autor diferente para los capítulos 56 a 66, a quien llamaron "Tercer-Isaías". Esta teoría fue mejor recibida por los eruditos protestantes que por sus colegas católicos, quienes la toleraron con vacilación. Después de una respuesta negativa de la Pontificia Comisión Bíblica en 1908, los eruditos católicos decidieron volver a un punto de vista conservador de autoría única.

Hubo un debate teológico que llegó a la conclusión de que la inspiración de las partes principales de la Biblia no estaba siendo cuestionada sino solo las preguntas literarias e históricas del nombre y la fecha de un autor. Después de esto, los católicos comenzaron a discutir nuevamente por la autoría dividida de Isaías. La mayoría de los eruditos católicos ahora aceptan la tesis de tres autores diferentes para los 66 capítulos del Libro.

Las razones para la autoría separada de los capítulos 40 a 55 son básicamente históricas: los destinatarios ya no son habitantes de Jerusalén, sino exiliados en Babilonia. De hecho, Jerusalén ha sido destruida y ahora espera la reconstrucción. Babilonia ya no es una aliada, porque ha destruido Jerusalén y deportado a los israelitas. Las antiguas profecías sobre la destrucción de Jerusalén se han llevado a cabo (Capítulo 1 del Libro) e Israel ahora espera un nuevo y más glorioso futuro.

En el Tercer-Isaías (capítulos 56 a 66), Israel está de regreso en su propia tierra, y los problemas son diferentes a los representados en los capítulos 1 a 39 del Libro.

Jesús predicó con insistencia sobre la práctica de la misericordia por parte de sus seguidores y discípulos. Hacia el final del evangelio de Mateo leemos el "sermón del juicio final" en el que el Señor llama a alimentar a los hambrientos, vestir a los desnudos y consolar a los oprimidos. Esta es una teología bastante inusual en el Antiguo Testamento y está claro que Jesucristo quería enfatizar sobre la práctica activa del amor en forma de actos de misericordia, además de todas las demandas de las diferentes Alianzas en el Antiguo Testamento. Sin embargo, la primera lectura de este domingo trae un pasaje excepcional cuando leemos:

«... Así dice el Señor: "Parte tu pan con el hambriento, hospeda a los pobres sin techo, viste al que ves desnudo, y no te cierres a tu propia carne...Entonces clamarás al Señor, y te responderá..., cuando partas tu pan con el hambriento y sacies el estómago del indigente, brillará tu luz en las tinieblas, tu oscuridad se volverá mediodía..."»

Aunque con un giro diferente del sermón de Jesús, es obvio que este texto quiere que reflexionemos sobre el hecho de que cuando la necesidad une a los hombres, Dios responderá con su gloriosa presencia ... a través de nosotros. A pesar de nuestras imperfecciones, estamos llamados a cooperar en sus planes de salvación y misericordia para todo el mundo. ¿No es genial?

Regulations on Fasting and Abstinence

The dual disciplines of fasting and abstinence have a long history in the Catholic Church. Going back to the early Church, the purpose behind the custom of self denial is not punishment; it is to simplify our lifestyles so that we create a certain emptiness. In this way, freed from all distractions, we are able to hear and respond to God's continued call to conversion and holiness.

- ✦ **Fasting** is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 to 59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
- ✦ **Abstinence** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

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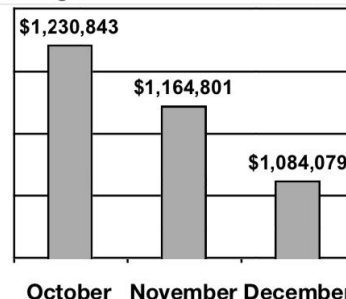

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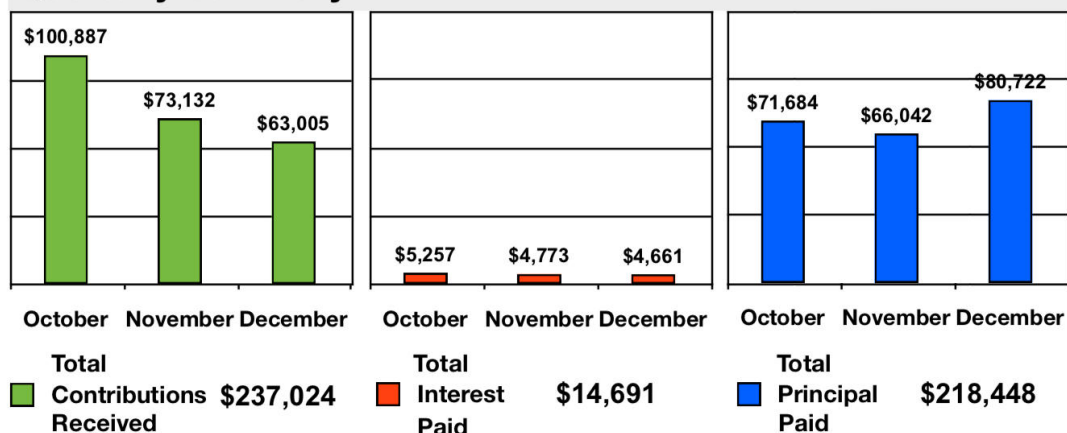

These figures are time sensitive which changes on a monthly basis.

Notes : (*) The payment is due the 1st of the month.

The check is generally written 4 to 7 days before the end of the month.

However, contributions are still being received to the last day of the month.

Also with the Capital Campaign account agreed each month to leave \$30,000 at the time of writing the check.

Remaining balance will be paid the following month.

Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you are required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are then taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

A new law was passed on 12/15/2015 allowing you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If you want to contribute from your 2017 required annual distribution or even from your current IRA, instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.

This is a great way to fulfill your pledge and/or contribute your annual offering in a lump sum.

"YO SOY LA INMACULADA
CONCEPCIÓN"

11 de Febrero



El 11 de febrero de 1858, tres niñas, Bernadette Soubirous, de 14 años, su hermana Marie Toinete, de 11 y su amiga Jeanne Abadie, de 12 salieron de su casa en Lourdes para recoger leña. Camino

al río Gave, pasaron por una gruta natural donde Bernadette escuchó un murmullo y divisó la figura de una joven vestida de túnica blanca, muy hermosa, ceñida por una banda azul y con un rosario colgado del brazo. Se acercó y comenzaron a rezar juntas, para luego desaparecer.

Por un período de cinco meses, la Virgen se le apareció a la niña, en medio de multitudes que se acercaban para rezar y poder observar a la hermosa señora, pero la Virgen sólo se le aparecía a la niña. En reiteradas ocasiones, Bernadette fue víctima de desprecios y burlas por parte de las autoridades eclesiales y civiles de pueblo, pero la niña se mantuvo firme en su fe mariana sobre todo en el especial pedido que la Virgen le había encargado: la construcción de una capilla sobre la gruta y la realización de una procesión.

Luego de la última aparición ocurrida en 16 de julio, fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Carmen, Bernadette ingresó a la orden religiosa de las hermanas enfermeras, a la edad de 22 años, y permaneció allí hasta su muerte a los 34 años de edad.
