When the Word of God was proclaimed in public for the first time

The first reading (from the book of Nehemiah) of this Sunday brings a narration of how after the Israelite returned from the exile in Babylon, the king and a priest offered a special gift to the People of God, when the Holy Scriptures were proclaimed "from daybreak till midday". This has never happened before and produced a great emotional impact on the persons who were present at this historical event.

Flavius Josephus, an historian from the first century, recounts in the book 'Antiquities of the Jews', how the Jews showed Cyrus the text of the prophecy of Isaiah where Cyrus' name appears (Isaiah 44:28; 45:1): "My will is, that Cyrus, whom I have appointed to be king over many and great nations, send back my people to their own land, and build my temple. This has been foretold by Isaiah one hundred and forty years before the temple was demolished. Accordingly, when Cyrus read this, and admired the divine power, an earnest desire and ambition seized upon him to fulfill what was to written; so he called for the most eminent Jews that were in Babylon, and said to them, that he gave them leave to go back to their own country, and to rebuild their city Jerusalem, and the temple of God, ... that they would contribute to them gold and silver for the building of the temple, and, beside that, beasts for their sacrifices."

Cyrus was so impressed that he issued an edict permitting those who wished to do so to return to Jerusalem. Although the Jews returned immediately after the king's decree and started rebuilding the city and the Temple, the building works were soon stopped due to fierce opposition from the Samaritans, so the Temple construction stopped for almost 20 years. Some time later, a devout king, Nehemiah, worked with Ezra, a priest, for the religious regeneration and reform of the community after the exile.

Today's reading tells of Ezra's reading of the Torah (the Law of Moses) to the people. The public proclamation of the sacred texts have never occurred before. This was part of the religious regeneration that the king and this priest promoted.

«Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly,...Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law...»

And a few lines later we have,

«...Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the priest-scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people: "Today is holy to the Lord your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep" - for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law...»

They are weeping because they know how impossible it is to keep all the commands of the Law and how horrible are the curses for disobeying the covenant.

«...He said further: "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; for today is holy to our Lord...»

Share in a common meal. This appears to be a rite of renewal of the covenant. Covenants are sworn by sharing a common meal between the parties to the covenant.

All this makes us reflect on how our Catholic Mass replicates what happened on that glorious day. We have the Liturgy of the Word, to proclaim the Word of God and then we share a common meal, the Holy Communion, symbol of the New Covenant in Jesus Christ.



St. Mark Column

The Gold Olive Tree, represents the tree, in the Garden of Gethsemane, under which, Jesus prayed, calling out: "Abba", as if a child, to His beloved Father. Yet, fully knowing, that he would soon rise to make the greatest sacrifice of all time: shedding His blood to save mankind, and providing an opportunity for eternal life. A third of St. Mark's gospel is focused on the last week in Jesus's life.

The olives, from the precious olive trees, provide the sacred oils used for the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and in the oils of the sick.

The gold, itself, directs us to the familiar gold leaves present within our own, Saint Mark, sanctuary. The olives and leaves are gold, indicating the magnificent sacramental gifts that Jesus, Himself, has provided for our salvation. Since Saint Mark is designated our particular Evangelist, this tree is dedicated to the parishioners, who are and will be blessed, to use these gifts, and nurture their faith within these walls

The Winged Lion, is a symbol of magnificence, power, nobility, and courage. It represents The Resurrection of Christ" and the characteristics of His Gospel. "It is the voice of one who cries in the wilderness." Wings are a symbol of divinity; the divine nature of Christ and the virtues required for Christian salvation.

Saint Mark, whose name means: "The little Hammer", was converted to the faith by St. Peter, according to St. Bede. After Christ's Resurrection, Mark became a disciple and an interpreter for St. Peter. He began to evangelize with Paul and Barnabas, his cousin. On their first missionary trip together, Mark left early and returned to Jerusalem, claiming that the work was too difficult. Paul was not happy with Mark's lack of dedication. On the next trip, Barnabas encouraged Mark to join them again, against Paul's better judgment. So, it was, his cousin, Barnabas, who took Mark, under his wing, to become a better disciple. Later, Mark preached all over Egypt for about twelve years. It was in this city that he set up The Catechetical countries are considered.

cal School of Alexandria, which became very famous. And he was eventually appointed Bishop of that city. Mark performed many miracles, converting people everywhere he traveled. Then, at one point in Mark's life, he had to flee from Alexandria, because of the persecutions, and returned to Rome.

Later, he returned to Alexandria, and after some time was seized by the heathens during the feast of the god Serapis. (Serapis was a combination of the Greek god Zeus, the Egyptian gods, Amun and Osiris, and the sacred Egyptian, Apis the bull.) His attackers, dragged St. Mark, over the ground all day, and all night for two days. He was then, thrown into prison. It is said that he was consoled by angels and by the voice of God before he died. His body is preserved in Venice and St. Mark Basilica is dedicated to him.

Mark is the patron saint of notaries, barristers, captives, and stained glass workers. His feast day is 4/25. Mark's Gospel is the shortest of all four gospels, only sixteen chapters. It is said, that Mark wrote his Gospel in Italy. And, it is likely that St. Peter, was the source of Mark's information since Mark never met Jesus. The Roman people begged St. Mark to put into writing the accounts of Peter's frequent talks on Our Lord's life. He wrote the second Gospel in Greek for the Gentile converts to Christianity. In his Gospel, Mark bypasses Jesus' genealogy and the birth of Jesus. Mark is more interested in the Jordan River, where John the Baptist is baptizing people. He writes the words of John the Baptist: "Someone is coming soon who is greater than I am. I baptize you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit!" "Come follow me and I will show you how to fish for people" Mark 1:17.

By skipping a lot of Jesus' story, Mark, makes it sound as though Jesus starts picking his disciples even before he begins teaching and healing. Not true. Mark makes it seem as though Simon, Andrew, James, and John while fishing along the Sea of Galilee, were all waiting for a chance to quit their jobs. But in reality, they can't seem to refuse. Mark 1:18 "Come follow me and I will show you how to fish for people" Mark 1:1)

He appears to be writing to the Gentile audience. Mark was careful to translate Jewish terms and customs into Roman equivalents. The miracles of Jesus captivated Mark's attention. Of the thirty-seven miracles recorded in all four Gospels. Mark recorded the most.

The suffering of Jesus is a major emphasis in Mark's gospel. A third of Mark's book is on the last week of Jesus' life, which is called "Passion Week".

The Biblical Scroll, Almost everywhere in the Old Testament, where we encounter the word "book", we should be thinking scroll. It is a long, sewn together, series of written sheets of leather or parchment; or a thick primitive paper made from reeds. A black, thin, writing tool, such as the one seen on Mark's scroll, was thought to have been used, to write some of the gospel. Within the scroll lies the Ichthys, a symbol of a fish, used secretly by persecuted Christians. It is imprinted with the words: "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior." The teachings found upon these scrolls are the pillars of our Christian lives and the road to eternal life.

Joshua was told by God: "Never! stop reciting these teachings. You must think about them night and day, so that you will faithfully do everything written in them. Only then, will you prosper and succeed."

The "Color, Royal Blue", represents the "Healing Power of God", "The Word of God". It is a symbol of "Hope". And the color blue has throughout our Catholic history, represented the "Virgin Mary", as Emporess or Queen of Heaven"



Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

A new law was passed on 12/15/2015 which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021 required annual distribution or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.

This is a great way to fulfill your pledge and/or contribute your annual offering in a lump sum.
