### Learn ~ Aprender

### The Book of Wisdom in our First Reading today.

The Book of Wisdom can be found only in Catholic Bibles. (Because it was written after 400 B.C. and in Greek, the Book of Wisdom was not in the Hebrew canon of Scripture, and Protestants decided to remove it from the Bible 15 centuries after Jesus Christ.). This book is unique in the Bible as being the product of a Jewish man with a Greek frame of mind, thoroughly familiar with Greek culture, writing probably at Alexandria in about 50 B.C. This might be the last book written in the Old Testament, before the first coming of Jesus Christ,.

Against the background of Egyptian worship of animals and mockery of Jewish trust in God, the author devotes much of the first part of the book to the ineffectiveness of such mockery when God has promised immortality to those who remain faithful. Using Greek modes of thought, he is the first to express the hope of after-life in terms of immortality of the individual soul.

At times he speaks in the person of Solomon, placing his teachings on the lips of the wise king of Hebrew tradition in order to emphasize their value. His profound knowledge of the earlier Old Testament writings is reflected in almost every line of the book. Its contents show the religious devotion and learning of post-exilic Judaism.

There's a section in which we read a praise of Wisdom. This reaches its high point in the descriptions of Wisdom as God's own power at work in the world. The third section of the book is devoted to a rather flowery history, concentrating chiefly on the ineffective opposition of the Egyptians to God's people at the time of the Exodus. Using Jewish legends and other amplification of the biblical account, the author points a contrast between the wonders God worked for Israel and the adverse effect of the same wonders on the Egyptians, constantly stressing the folly of Egyptian worship of animals and idols.

Perhaps the single-most important contribution of the book consists in its reflections on Wisdom, and especially the personification of Wisdom as God's agent in the world. With this, the ground is prepared for the understanding of Jesus as the incarnate Wisdom of God. It is also valuable to see Judaism beyond the frontiers of Palestine, at grips with the varied worship of the Greco-Roman world, and to see it developing such ideas as that of the individual as a child of God.

Today we hear the conclusion of Solomon's prayer for Wisdom:

«...And scarce do we guess the things on earth, and what is within our grasp we find with difficulty; but when things are in heaven, who can search them out? Or who ever knew your counsel, except you had given Wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high?...»

Here, Wisdom is identified with the spirit of the Lord and becomes the internal principle of physical and moral life. Wisdom is presented as a personification of the functions of Yahweh and was understood as an effect of the spirit of God on human beings.

Why does our church have a Chapel for Reconciliation?

Reconciliation is not the same as an apology. Reconciliation means acceptance of the apology and takes two people. Reconciliation requires change. This transformation is a lifelong journey to discover what God truly wants us to do with this gift of his presence in our lives. One place for this journey is the Chapel for Reconciliation.

We need a space of intimacy that allows penitents to bare our souls. This is not a public space. It is a private, personal space between penitent and the minister of the sacrament who both come before God as forgiven sinners. It should feel like we are coming home, the kind of feeling that makes us realize a sense of security.


The chapel is open into the worship space as a sign of our reconciliation with the altar table and the gathering of people in the church. Its location next to the Blessed Sacrament Chapel and near the Baptistery is highly symbolic.

The chapel provides an opportunity for anonymity, by celebrating this sacrament through a screen. The screen is for privacy, not a barrier. Reconciliation is about our relationship with the Lord represented by the person on the other side of the screen, a priest.

The Reconciliation Chapel has been designed as a space conducive for the realization of the indwelling of God. When we feel good about the space around us and comfortable, even pampered, in the chair, it aids our sense of worthiness. The feeling of worthiness fosters courage to accept God's forgiveness, to forgive ourselves, to live in peace with those around us, and to work on behalf of the marginalized and abandoned.

### **Tax Free Contribution Information**

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

A new law was passed on 12/15/2015 which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2022 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.
