

### Let's talk about the Commandments

Today's First Reading and the Gospel offer a reflection about God's Commandments. One offers the vision from a wise man in the Old Testament times while the Gospel shows Jesus' practical understanding and application of the Law.

The First Reading is taken from a book written within a couple of centuries before Jesus Christ by Jesus, son of Eleazar, of the family of Sirach. The treasure of practical wisdom contained in the book of Sirach won for it the honorable title of Ecclesiasticus, which means "Ecclesiastical Book" or "Church Book." It appears to have been much used in the early Church as a textbook for the instruction of catechumens (candidates for baptism). Today's reading comes from the section of Sirach's writing on man's free will and responsibility:

«... If you choose you can keep the commandments; it is loyalty to do his will. There are set before you fire and water; to whichever you choose, stretch forth your hand. Before man are life and death, whichever he chooses shall be given him...»

It's easy to understand that the argument presented here is that we have the radical freedom to choose "life" by obeying the Law or "death" by refusing to obey. This paragraph echoes Deuteronomy 30:16 when this early book of the Bible states that "...I command you today to love the Lord your God, to walk in obedience to him, and to keep his commands, decrees and laws; then you will live and increase, and the Lord, your God will bless you..."

Before Jesus Christ, the obedience to God's commandments was seen as if they were the part of a contract that would render benefits. You would receive God's favors only if you did your part of the covenant. Loving God was not necessarily the motivation to behave well.

But Jesus Christ brings a different perspective, one that implies the practice of mercy and love. In today's gospel passage we are still at the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus has delivered it and is now applying the beatitudes to the hearers of the sermon. These verses give the basic legal principles of the sermon. The Christian Church demands only the obedience to the ethical commands such as the 10 commandments and the commands to love God and neighbor and not to the 613 precepts of the Old Testament law (both ethical and ceremonial). Jesus emphasizes only on the demands of the 10 commandments and doesn't talk about the rest of precepts.

We're stepping on delicate ground here. The non-observance by Jesus of the traditional Sabbath ordinances and of the laws of Levitical cleanliness was a frequent source of controversy. Jesus is not inviting disobedience but he's addressing those who teach strict observance but do not practice it. Observance of the Law and traditions will secure the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, but it is a submission to the will of God what goes beyond the observance of the Law. It's why we read today Jesus' words saying,

«... unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter into the kingdom of heaven...»

Then the Lord refers to some of the commandments and the most remarkable teaching is that rather than the acts that may be considered sinful, are the intentions of our hearts. This is what the Lord wants to change in us. We contemplate in today's Gospel Jesus saying

«You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. But I say to you,...You have heard that it was said, You shall not commit adultery. But I say to you...»

Jesus preaches a different approach to the commandments. He proposes a scheme that does not raise the fundamentalist attachment to what is written, but to its practical application. It is a method that enriches because it discovers "the words behind the words", that is, the spirit of the Scriptures, the message that God has wanted to reveal. Not limited or restrained by the words with which they have been written. There is more than words, there is an idea behind each of the commandments.


This is the approach that the Catholic Church continues to apply, a practical application of the message, not a fundamentalist reading of the Word of God. This is why I use to say, it's only for intelligent people who can discern and understand what has been said, not how it has been said.







# **Tax Free Contribution Information**

If you are over 70 ½ and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

New laws have been passed which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2023 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.
