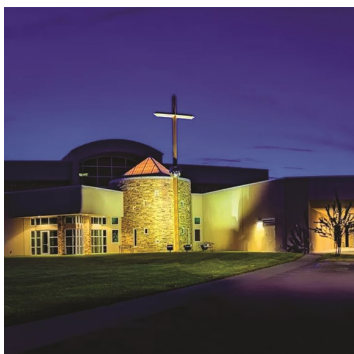

Learn ~ Aprender

Deacon Jose Moronta

As we walk into the Ordinary Time, Jesus teaches to his apostles.

We rejoined Jesus last week during the first year of His public ministry. We're now in the 10th chapter of Matthew's. In the previous chapter He has just commissioned the twelve and is instructing them as they are sent out.

Within chapter 10 (verses 5 to 42) we find the 'missionary discourse' of Jesus Christ. We can read various teachings related to the ideal attitudes of the disciple of Jesus, and especially the condition of being his apostle. Jesus Christ makes an insistent call to maintain full confidence amid all the difficulties and misunderstandings that may appear. Up to three times he repeats the expression "do not be afraid." The recipient of the disciple's trust must be God, whom Jesus teaches to call "Father." The disciple should be willing to give his life and always remain a faithful witness of Christ, with the conviction that He will protect us at the hour of final judgment.

Previously, in the First Reading, we contemplate Jeremiah being the victim of God's enemies. But God had chosen him to be his prophet. The term 'prophet' does not describe "someone who predicts the future," but rather someone who is a "messenger of God." In today's text we read how the prophet expresses before God the personal experience of misunderstanding and loneliness that he has had to suffer because of the mission that God has entrusted to him. Fidelity to God brings rejection and persecution consequently, even from those who were supposed to be his friends.

From time to time, as in this case, amid lamentation, a light of hope appears, which comes from renewed trust in God. Jeremiah remembers that the Lord does not stop doing justice to the innocent who puts his will into practice.

Let us see what Jesus teaches, that can be useful for us as well:

«...Jesus said to the Twelve, Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna...»

Jerusalem is settled over a couple of valleys, shaping an Y. One of these depressions was used to dump garbage, which experienced spontaneous combustion. There was always a column of smelly smoke because of the garbage that was consumed by fire. That valley's name was Gehenna. In the time of Jesus Christ "Gehenna" became a term to refer to the place of eternal fire and destruction. When the Lord used that word, his disciples understood very well the metaphor used by their Master.

And Jesus added in his discourse to the twelve,

«...Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge... So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows...»

Jesus uses rabbinic argument technique which compares a light matter to a heavy one. It is used here to overcome fear and encourage the disciples to trust God. With this he has set the background for the most important part of his discourse,

«...Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father.»

With the assurance of confidence that God knows and cares what happens, the disciples are urged to confess "in Jesus." The confession would be the typical confession of the primitive Church that "Jesus is Messiah and Lord." The reward of confession or denial is that Jesus will accept or disown according to one's fidelity.

St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church Soccer

A Catholic Youth Sports League soccer program for boys and girls ages 6 – 18 and all athletic abilities is ready for a fifth (Fall 2023) season at St. Mark.

The season begins in August, with first practice August 24 (early Thursday evenings at St. Mark) and the first game (Saturday mornings) on August 26. Games will be at St. Mark the Evangelist soccer fields as well as a two other churches in the North Tampa area. There will be one practice and one game per week.

Program uses small sided games: 4 players on U8 and 7 players including a goalie on U10 and above teams.

Teams include U6 (born before 1/1/2017), U8 (1/1/2015), U10 (1/1/2013), U13 (1/1/2010) and U18 (born before 1/1/2005).

Facilities and Maintenance Manager - FT

St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church has a Full-Time opening. The Facilities Manager provides facilities support to all ministry and parish functions. Responsible for implementing a preventative maintenance program that ensures that all parish buildings and grounds are maintained to the highest standards of safety, functionality, operational efficiency, and appearance. Ensures that any required repairs are completed in a timely and professional manner. Manages vendors and contractors that assist in facilities upkeep and repair such as janitorial, pest control, landscaping, HVAC repair, roofers, etc.

This position requires a team player attitude, excellent interpersonal and communication skills, attention to details and project coordination with the ability to multitask on an ongoing basis. The Facilities Manager can collaborate with and support the Pastor, General Manager, parish staff, and parishioners.

Ideal Candidate must have the following criteria:

- High School Diploma with training in the maintenance of buildings
- 5 years experience in facilities management or building trade.
- Experience in supervising others
- Knowledge of plumbing, electrical and HVAC
- Ability to safely lift a minimum of 50 lbs.
- Ability to work a flexible schedule, including evenings and weekends.
- Must successfully pass a level II FBI background screening and attend a Safe Environment Training

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Ensure building and property follow all standards and codes daily.
- Schedules, coordinates, and executes all maintenance tasks.
- Self-perform repairs, so facility operations are not interrupted.
- Self-perform any painting, drywall repairs, and maintains esthetics and landscaping needs.
- Plumbing, electrical, and HVAC preventative maintenance
- Schedule and perform daily, weekly, and monthly facilities maintenance checklists.
- Coordinate maintenance work order requests and follow up to ensure completion of work orders.
- Maintain work order log.
- Monitor property to ensure compliance with maintenance, safety, and security.
- Initiate work orders or proposal requests
- Coordinate and inspect outside vendor maintenance repairs.
- Maintains the key log.
- Perform various reporting and admin tasks.
- Respond to property emergencies and resolve them immediately (ex. alarm calls)

Candidate must pass a Level II (FBI) criminal background screening and complete Diocesan Safe Environment Training before employment. St. Mark is a smoke and drug-free workplace.

The North Tampa Catholic Young Adult Ministry is for young adults (ages 21-40) desiring to journey together in a faith-filled community!

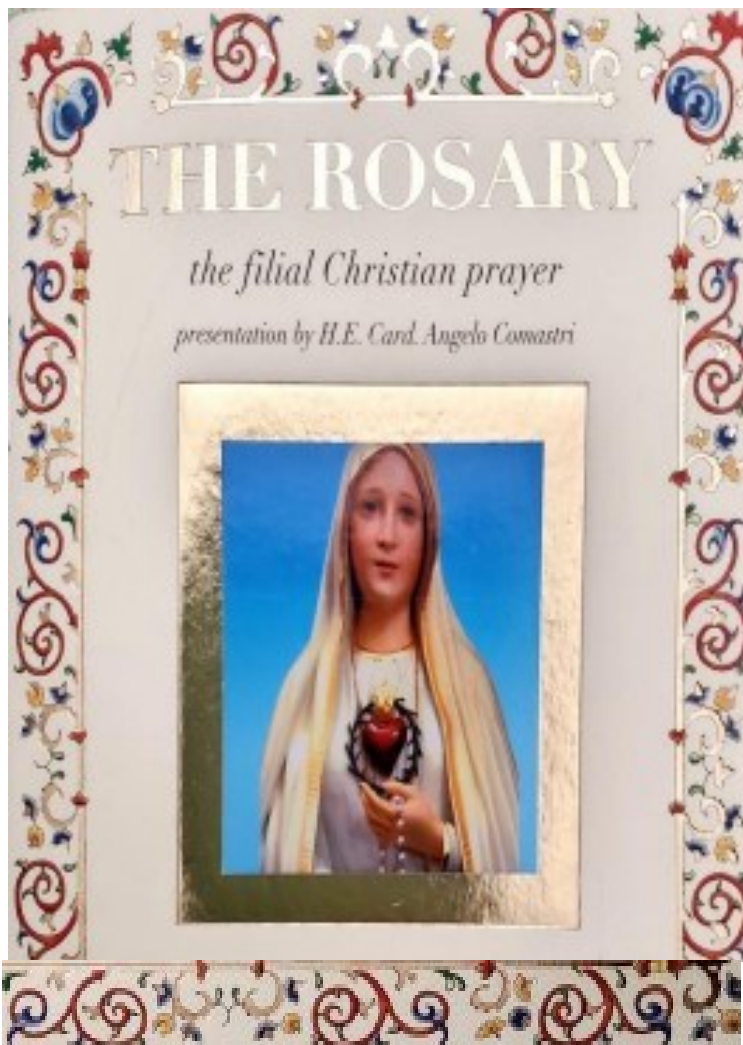

Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 73 and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

New laws have been passed which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2023 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.

This is a great way to fulfill your pledge and/or contribute your annual offering in a lump sum.
