

Let's talk today about Isaiah and... of the Philippians

Today the First Reading is taken from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah and the Second Reading is taken from a letter that Saint Paul wrote to the Philippians. We know very little about the details of Isaiah's life. To differentiate him from other men of the same name, he was called "Isaiah, the son of Amos;" later "Isaiah the prophet." According to Jewish tradition he was of royal stock. He was of the tribe of Judah and his home was in Jerusalem. All his discourses are addressed to the people, or to certain classes and individuals, or to the women of Jerusalem. He was married and had two sons. By reading Isaiah 8:3 we are informed that his wife was known as a prophetess.

Today's passage may look like a possible discrepancy, as we read,

«...Seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near...As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts...»

These lines combine those mysterious opposites of divine grace: God is transcendent, yet near enough to help. Man must seek God, and yet God's ways are far beyond comprehension. This is why we need the gift of faith and also explains why it's a gift from God. We cannot generate faith by ourselves, the only source of it is God, who wants us to love him even if we cannot understand his ways.

In the Second Reading we meet St. Paul addressing the Christians of Philippi, a city north of the Aegean Sea named after Philip of Macedon, the father of Alexander the Great. Paul founded here the first Christian church in Europe around the year 51, during his second missionary journey. He lived in Philippi for some years and had special affection for these people, which they reciprocated. He even suffered imprisonment and the lash on their account. The Philippians, for their part, sent Epaphroditus to Rome to look after Paul when he was imprisoned there. Epaphroditus became seriously ill and after his recovery, Paul sent him back home with this letter, written by Paul during his imprisonment in A.D. 61-63. In this letter Paul simply expresses his gratitude to the Father for all consolation, and to the Philippians for the kindness and attention they showed him and for never being a source of worry to him but rather of consolation.

«...Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me life is Christ, and death is gain...»

St Ambrose of Milan wrote in A.D. 378, "It seems that for him death would be profitable, and life would be more of a penalty. For this reason, Paul says 'for me life is Christ, and death is gain.' The death of the body is nothing amid the spirit of life. So, we too are ready to die with Christ so that we may live with Him."

And then we get the amazing confession of the apostle,

«...I am caught between the two. I long to depart this life and be with Christ, for that is far better. Yet that I remain in the flesh is more necessary for your benefit...»

How great was his affection for the believers, that he does not choose what he says would be much better for himself. He admits that it might be much easier to be dissolved and be with Christ. But nonetheless he knows that it is necessary for him to remain in the flesh for the benefit of the faithful, so that their glory may abound in the Lord, and all may praise the Lord when they see him again. Awesome!





St. Vincent de Paul was born in Pouy, France on April 24, 1581, and was ordained a priest on September 23, 1600. Vincent devoted himself entirely to the alleviation of suffering of the poor. To that cause, he established the Confraternities of Charity, later known as the Ladies of Charity, in 1617. In 1625, he founded the Congregation of the Mission, his community of priests and brothers. With Louise de Marillac, he cofounded the Daughters of Charity in 1633. Vincent died in Paris on September 27, 1660 and was canonized in 1737. Pope Leo XIII declared him patron saint of all works of charity.



Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 73 and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

New laws have been passed which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2023 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.

This is a great way to fulfill your pledge and/or contribute your annual offering in a lump sum.
