

Learn ~ **Aprender Deacon Jose Moronta**

Approaching the end of the Church's year... and Matthew's Gospel

We're on the 28th Sunday and 6 more to go to end this liturgical year. The Gospel according to Matthew has been leading us throughout the cycle A . As we become closer to the end, the gospel narratives are setting the scene for Jesus' passion and death.

We'll have in mind that in this section of the gospel Jesus is in Jerusalem for his passion. He has made His triumphal entry and has disturbed the religious leaders. He speaks to them in parables about His mission and by whose authority He has been able to do what He has done and is to do.

The parable we hear today sums-up the long history of God's dealings with man and depicts man's response to these invitations to share in the messianic blessings. Rather invariably men favored a life engaged to a visible and touchable reality than one which they could not experience except in the spirit. Sadly real in most of its details, this parable was preached in the Temple on the Wednesday of the first Holy Week, almost in the shadow of Calvary. By now Jesus' adversaries are convinced that they will have to arrest Him. At this point it is amazing that Jesus continues to address them in parables when speaking of the rejection by Israel of God's many invitations. It is not yet too late for divine mercy.

«Jesus again in reply spoke to them [the chief priests and elders of the people] in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come…»

The messianic kingdom was referred to in the Old Testament in terms of a wedding banquet to which the Chosen People were invited. The banquet was the high point of the wedding celebration and to be invited to it was a distinct honor. Failure to accept the invitation established a grave rupture of courtesy – to the point it could even be considered a hostile act.

The upset king makes an order,

«...Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite whomever you find to the feast whomever you find. "The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment...Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside...»

Sinners are invited too. The Church in history is a mixture of saints and sinners. We must always remember that the Church isn't a house for saints, but a hospital for sinners. The wedding garment for the eschatological banquet would be a converted life full of good deeds. The sinners are invited but expected to repent. A clean white garment was the proper attire, this man has not repented. His white baptismal garment is dirty. He may have made the altar call and "accepted Jesus as his Lord and savior," but he has failed to live out that call. This is an example which shows that "once saved, always saved" doesn't work. Let's keep our banquet garment clean for the moment we're called to participate in the heavenly eternal feast.

Prophet Isaiah had anticipated a matching message in the First Reading.

The book of the prophet Isaiah has a section (between chapters 24 and 27) that has been written in a very peculiar language, ("apocalyptic literature"); that's why some scholars call this section "Revelation of Isaiah". The small fragment proclaimed in this first reading belongs to this apocalyptic section and shows us a proclamation of hope in God's intervention in the not-too-distant future. This action from God will bring happiness: one that is not fleeting but rather a complete and permanent happiness that will be "for all peoples".


The author uses the image of an exquisite and abundant banquet. This wonderful future promised by God includes the elimination of suffering and pain, and in a very special way, the final victory over death. The God of life does not permit that the men and women He has created have death as their destination.

« On this mountain the Lord of hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines, juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines...he will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web that is woven over all nations; he will destroy death forever...On that day it will be said: "Behold our God, to whom we looked to save us! »


The season begins in January, with first practice January 4 (early Thursday evenings at St. Mark) and the first game (Saturday mornings) on January 6. 

Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 73 and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

New laws have been passed which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2023 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.
