

# Learn ~ Aprender Deacon Jose Moronta

#### How the narrative of Exodus became a set of rules for the Israelites

Last week we heard Jesus' reply to the question of paying taxes – a question which had been designed to trip Him up. Today he's again tested by the Pharisees and the Scribes. One of them asked,

#### «Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?...»

The Pharisees had enumerated 613 commandments but there was no agreement as to what the ranking was. After all, one of them must be the most important, the first from which all the others descended.

«...He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself...»

Jesus quotes for the first part of his response a verse from the **Book of Deuteronomy** and for the second part, from the **Book of Leviticus**. Both books have a common origin: the **Book of Exodus**.

Although this book takes the form of a popular narrative, easy for the people to understand, it also contains important religious teachings. The episodes in this history obviously involve special divine intervention: there is no other explanation for the liberation of Israel or the crossing of the Red Sea or its survival for so long in the wilderness.

The book of Exodus (which means "leaving") is a continuation of the story of Genesis. The fact that it takes its name from the Israelites' going out of Egypt shows the importance of this episode in the life of Israel.

Like his forebears, Abraham and Isaac, Jacob led a semi-nomadic existence in Canaan. He was forced by a severe famine to emigrate with his entire family to Egypt, where they settled around the beginning of the eighteenth century before Christ. Over the next 400 years the Scriptures tell us nothing about the stay of the Jews in Egypt. God makes no revelation during this period. All we know is that by the end of it the Hebrews had become numerous, strong, hard working people; so much so that the Egyptians, growing afraid of them, forced them into slavery.

At Sinai, God's encounter with the people took place. By divine initiative, a covenant realizes and ratifies the union of the Lord with Israel. From it comes a series of commitments that the people must fulfill. But let's look at some details of this reading to understand the reason for God's preferential option for those who cannot take care of themselves.

The stranger is the foreigner who resides, stably, in an ethnic group that is not his or her own. They are usually poor people: they have no property and their only means of living is the sweat of their brow. They urgently need legal protection because the temptation to take advantage of them is patent. The widow does not inherit, and the orphan owns nothing. Not having a guaranteed income, they are defenseless beings exposed to people's injustices.

Borrowing to survive is one of the greatest misfortunes that can happen to a person. The return will even be difficult: you must give as collateral the dress that covers your body during the day and at night. In these cases, the interest charged is theft, an appropriation of what is not yours. What is necessary to survive: food, clothing, takes precedence over the comfort of others.

If Israel commits these sins, God hears the voice of the oppressed and defends their rights.

A series of legal provisions are given here to protect the helpless, those who find themselves in a situation of civic, social, and economic inferiority. We see this concern for strangers, orphans and widows, the poor, constantly in the prophets and in the books of the Law, especially in Deuteronomy.

The presence of those in need of every order, social, legal, economic, and universal human, is a claim that rises and accuses; If there are any in the world, the world is under judgment. The people of God are challenged by them, since the law that protects them has the same demand as the capital precept; This is fulfilled precisely by fulfilling the former, as clarified by "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink" (Mt 25. 31-46).

Moses receives the ten commandments verbally and verbally delivers them to the people. Moses then ascends the mountain again and God gives him other laws: the treatment of Hebrew slaves, rules of conduct for personal injuries, the rules, and penalties for the protection of property, laws of justice and mercy, and laws of social responsibility – it is from these laws that our first reading for today is taken. Then, in the Gospel, Jesus takes advantage of his contemporaries' knowledge of these "commandments" in the Bible to preach that we are called to love God... and the neighbors as well.





# **Tax Free Contribution Information**

If you are over 73 and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

New laws have been passed which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2023 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.
