### THE ADVENT WREATH



The weekend of December 2-3, we begin the season of Advent as we prepare for the celebration of Christmas.

We invite you to bring your family Advent Wreath to Mass on December 2-3 and place it on the table by the Mary statue before Mass with your name on it to avoid confusion since some wreaths may be the same.

During Mass the celebrant will bless these wreaths. After Mass you can bring them home.

The Advent Wreath is a circle of green branches with four candles representing the four weeks of Advent. During Advent we celebrate the first coming of Christ at Christmas, his continued presence among us especially in the Eucharist (the real presence of the Body and Blood of Christ), and the hope of his second coming at the end of time. The candles for the first week (representing hope), second week (representing peace), and fourth week (representing love) are purple but the candle for the third week(representing joy) is rose colored as we celebrate Gaudete (a Latin word meaning rejoice) Sunday expressing our joy as we prepare to celebrate Christmas.

We have an Advent Wreath in the Church during Advent and encourage families to also have one in their homes. One suggestion is to light the candles together as a family at meal time each evening (the Sunday celebration begins on Saturday night). You can use the following prayer as you light the candles on the wreath as listed below.

Lord our God,

we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us,

he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God.

let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.

May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen December 2 through 8 Light one purple candle

December 9 through 15 Light two purple candles

December 16 through 22 Light two purple candles and the rose candle

December 23-24 Light all four candles

The fourth week of Advent is only one day since Christmas Day December 25 is on Monday

## Learn ~ Aprender Deacon Jose Moronta

#### Advent is a season of two distinguishable parts.

The first two weeks concerned with the Lord's coming as Judge of all at the end of time and the second two weeks serving as the proximate preparation for His coming in the flesh.

The Church's readings reflect this dual character. The Old Testament readings of Advent set the mood and theme each week. As we hear these readings, we need to look at our own dreams and expectations. The prophets of the Old Testament used beautiful poetic expressions, such as the lamb lying at peace with the lion, swords being beaten into plowshares, and the great banquet to come that will be presided over by the Lord.

The first reading from the book of Isaiah expresses how the prophet spoke words of encouragement to his people who would be in exile years after Isaiah prophesied. He wrote "Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God." During the time of Isaiah, conquered peoples were often put to work building roads for the victors. In the process of road building, they would be filling in the valleys and cutting down the high places to make the road smoother. Sometimes roads would be built especially for the victorious ruler to ride in triumph. This would become the "king's way."

After their liberation from Babylon, they will build "a highway for our God." In this "highway builder" role they will be preparing the way for their Lord. In the gospel reading, Mark quotes this passage from Isaiah in introducing John the Baptist. He is a key symbol of Advent preparation. The prophet Isaiah is quoted to show how John is preparing the people for Christ's coming. When the Jews were held captive in Babylon, they built roads for their captors. A day would come, Isaiah wrote, when they would build a highway for their God to prepare the way for His coming. Valleys would be filled in, and hills would be lowered for the "king's highway." In a similar fashion John the Baptist is calling on us to prepare a road so that Christ can be welcome on his

second coming. As Christians we are also called to be highway builders preparing the way for Christ to entermore fully into our lives. We are proclaimers of "glad tidings."

#### And now a story for our personal reflection

The evil one appeared to three monks and told them: if I gave you the power to change something from the past, what would you change? The first of them, with great apostolic fervor, replied: "I would prevent you from making Adam and Eve fall into sin so that humanity could not separate from God." The second, a man full of mercy, told him: "I would prevent you from turning away from God and condemning yourself eternally."

The third of them was the simplest and, instead of responding to the tempter, he got down on his knees, made the sign of the cross and prayed, "Lord, deliver me from the temptation of what could have been and was not." The evil one, giving a stentorian cry and shaking with pain, vanished. The other two, surprised, said to him: "Brother, why have you reacted like this?"

He replied: "First: we must NEVER dialogue with the enemy.

Second: NO ONE in the world has the power to change the past.

Third: Satan's interest was not to test our virtue, but to trap us in the past, so that we neglect the present, the only time in which God gives us his grace and we can cooperate with it to accomplish his will."

Likewise, Advent is not a look to the past, but to the future. We are waiting for the Second Coming of the Lord. The Church is living not a "Liturgical Advent" of four weeks, but a real Advent (so far, twenty centuries) until Jesus will come again. Advent is a look to the future that comes but using the present day to be prepared for that Day of Glory.

A Catholic Youth Sports League soccer program for boys and girls ages 6 – 18 and all athletic abilities is ready for a sixth (Winter 2024) season at St. Mark.

The season begins in January, with first practice January 4 (early Thursday evenings at St. Mark) and the first game (Saturday mornings) on January 6. 

## **Tax Free Contribution Information**

If you are over 73 and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

New laws have been passed which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2023 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.
