

## How the world experienced the first manifestation of God incarnated

We are celebrating the Solemnity of Epiphany, a Greek word meaning revelation or manifestation, used most often in ancient times to describe the king or ruler "showing himself" before the people of the nation.

Epiphany was originally an Eastern Church celebration. As the celebration moved westward, it took on the meaning of the revelation of Jesus to the Gentiles. The central point of this celebration is that God's salvation is intended not only for the people of Israel, but for all people.

Epiphany is now celebrated as the 12th day of Christmas and its celebration seems to predate the celebration of Christmas itself. We see how God epiphanies Himself through Jesus. It is the people of God empowered with the gifts of the Holy Spirit who reveal the risen Christ to the world through acts of creation, love, healing, and liberation. Today's Gospel reading has been called "The Worship of the Magi". They were wise men, astrologers. Originally the term designated the learned priestly caste of the Persians; later it came to mean anyone skilled in occult knowledge and power (magicians), or a charlatan or trickster. The word is not used in an abusive or derogatory sense here by Matthew and the mention of the star shows that they are wise men who study the stars. Nothing else is said about them. Since they are not Jews, they can be the very first gentiles to receive the call to salvation in Christ. Matthew and Luke both have unique accounts of the conception and birth of Jesus and some of the incidents that followed the birth. Neither Mark nor John addresses this period in Jesus' life. Matthew's version is greatly affected using Old Testament texts. The magi seek a king, and Herod consults the religious experts of Judaism to find out where they should look. Of this there is no doubt, they should look not in Jerusalem, but in Bethlehem – the city of David

The prophets and the psalmists foretold that the kings of the earth would pay homage to God at the time of the Messiah (Isaiah 49:23). They would offer him their treasures (Isaiah 60:5-6) and adore Him (Psalm 72:10-15). Through the action of these wise men, these prophecies begin to be fulfilled; although there is no indication that these wise men were kings or emissaries of kings.

The gifts offered were those most valued in the East and have symbolic meanings: • **Gold** - A symbol of royalty and Jesus' kingship • **Frankincense** - A symbol of Jesus' divine priesthood • **Myrrh** - A burial spice and symbol of Jesus' death to redeem us.

The fact that there were three gifts have led to the assumption that they were three men. But the gospel text doesn't bring any number. There may have been two, or even a dozen. We will never know, and don't need this kind of information to be saved.

#### A not so spiritual tradition associated with the celebration of Epiphany.

The 12th night is a familiar title of a Shakespearian play and comes from European heritage where 12th night parish parties are (or were) celebrated. These parties have carried over into the Mardi Gras tradition. During the party, at the appointed time, the king cake is brought out. Hidden in the cake are three beans or coins. Those who find the "prizes" are crowned kings or queens for the evening. While the "royalty" are being outfitted for their office, the Christmas tree is stripped of all ornaments (German Lutherans call this "plundering the tree"). The tree is removed from the room and saved for the Lenten season when it is stripped of its branches and made into a processional cross. Tradition also celebrates the arrival of the wise men currently.

We of the Church are called to be an ever-unfolding epiphany of God's love and power to the dark world seeking desperately for such epiphanies.

## ...and tomorrow, January 8th, we will have the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

We will celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which marks the end of the Time of Christmas, inaugurated on December 25<sup>th</sup>. After this feast begins a period in the liturgical calendar which is called Ordinary Time. During the period of Ordinary Time, we are guided through the gospel readings in a chronological manner from the beginning of Jesus' public ministry through His entry into Jerusalem for His passion, death, and resurrection. This year our gospel readings will concentrate on the Gospel of Mark, our Patron Saint.

The fact of Jesus' baptism has been a Christological and theological issue to be reckoned with almost since it happened. After all, why would Jesus, who was sinless, participate in a rite for sinners? Also, why would Jesus, the Messiah and clearly superior to John the Baptist, submit to the authority of John? Jesus identifies Himself with sinful humanity by undergoing John's purificatory rite.



## **Tax Free Contribution Information**

If you are over 73 and have an IRA or similar retirement account you may be required to take annual distributions prescribed by the IRS. These distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.

New laws have been passed which may allow you to contribute any part of your IRA including these required distributions to St. Mark TAX FREE!

Example: If you contribute \$5000 from your IRA to St. Mark and are in a 20% tax bracket, the church receives the \$5000 and you may save \$1000 in taxes.

A WIN-WIN for both the church and the parishioner!

If your tax advisor agrees and you want to contribute from your 2021/2023 required annual distributions or even from your current IRA,

instruct your IRA custodian to make the check out to: St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.

They can either send it to you or directly to the church.
