Learn ~ Aprender Deacon Jose Moronta

First time we read about Prophets in the Bible.

This Sunday's First Reading has been taken from the Book of Deuteronomy.

This book has been composed in the form of three discourses, the second of which contains the laws proper. The first four chapters, which form the first discourse, is an introduction to the book. It stresses what the book, and the entire Bible, is all about. It tells us that God in His providence and mercy is constantly watching over His people, over every single man and woman, as can be seen from the wonders He worked during the 40 years the Jews spent in the wilderness. This first discourse emphasizes another basic fact: Yahweh demands strict fidelity to the covenant to which Israel committed itself to in Sinai, to adore the one true God.

The second discourse, from which the first reading for this Sunday's Mass has been taken, goes from chapter 5 through chapter 28. This discourse stresses the Decalogue and that God's choice of Israel is a pure act of love on His part; consequently, a whole series of liturgical, civil and criminal laws are given to ensure that His promises are carried out.

The third discourse (rest of the Book) is a vigorous exhortation to obedience to Yahweh. Their love for Him should not be out of fear of punishment but by way of appreciation for all the gifts He has given. True wisdom consists in not exploring the hidden mysteries of God out of curiosity, but in knowing His commandments and practicing them faithfully.

In today's first reading, it is Moses who is speaking, but he's not transmitting a message of his own, but from God. This is a key text regarding the institution of the office of prophet in Israel. Together with the king and the priest, the prophet is one of the great institutions of Israel; the prophet has a very important religious position and special moral authority.

In the history of the Jewish people Moses is seen not only as the one who delivered Israel from slavery in Egypt, not only as the one who gave them God's laws, but also as the first prophet and the model for all future prophets. A good definition I read some time ago about what a prophet is, says that it's a person who after realizing a special relationship with God in his or her life, cannot speak about any other thing than about God's will. The words of prophets are not theirs by the word of God. Prophets are like fingers, not like faces. We are not meant to look at them but to the reality to which they point.

On the day of our Baptism, we were anointed with the Sacred Chrism as prophets. We have been called by God to act as prophets for the world. We may follow other prophets' lead, but we are also called to lead others through the paths that bring people closer to God.

Anxiety and Marriage. Curious approach from St. Paul In today's second reading we find these words from St. Paul:

« I should like you to be free of anxieties. An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided.

An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, how she may please her husband...»

Saint Paul begins by saying that he would like to spare us worries, but immediately afterwards he speaks to us about how one should worry about the things of the Lord. And there are two types of concerns, those that marriage brings with it and those who live their consecrated life to God. Paul advises that if one does not marry and is called by God to be celibate, do not hesitate for a moment to surrender to the Lord. If he is faithful to his vocation, it will be much better for him, and for the faithful. Because his only concern will be his response to God's call to service.

Paul is not against marriage. In this same chapter he speaks that marriage is better for those who need to live in a company. He comes to warn against selfish singleness that will inevitably lead to damnation. What gives value to celibacy is exclusive dedication to God, it is a renunciation of having a family, being loved, and cared for by a wife and enjoying the joy of children. It is a delivery for which God grants a special grace. Because it is not easy to control our instincts and serve with joy. The person who sacrifices his/her feelings out of love for God does not destroy them, but elevates them, transforms them into a living and permanent offering so that his dedication contributes better to the redemption of humanity.
