# UNITY IN DIVERSITY

Multicultural Ministries is one of 11 diocesan ministries that encounter God, and offer all who seek God an opportunity to encounter Him and enrich our spiritual lives, fostering our response to God's call to serve. Through the Catholic Ministry Appeal, this group of ministries will receive \$3.8 million, or 43%, of the total \$9 43% million appeal goal to carry out their good works.



The Annual Diocesan African Mass invites all to come and experience the celebration of the Eucharist with diverse African languages and cultures. The 2023 Mass, celebrated at St. Paul Parish in Tampa, drew more than 700 priests and parishioners from parishes across the Diocese and representing various African countries gathered as one unified community to celebrate Mass and worship God together.

"The African Mass was an awesome experience of the unity in diversity of our Catholic Church. I witnessed parishioners of St. Paul Parish in Tampa from diverse ministries and cultural communities working together to set up for the reception which would follow the Mass," said Carlos Flores, Director of diocesan Multicultural Ministries.

The reception that followed offered the opportunity to continue the celebration and experience. "At the reception, there was food not only from African countries, but also from other ethnic communities like the Brazilians and the Filipinos," Flores shared. "I sat at a table with persons from Puerto Rico and a couple from Philadelphia who expressed they travel every year to experience the African Mass in our Diocese."

As part of our diocesan Multicultural Ministries, the Black Catholic Commission was established in 2011 in the Diocese of St. Petersburg for the purpose of supporting the Bishop in providing spiritual, cultural, and social nourishment to Catholics of African descent, thereby facilitating their enrichment within the diocese and encouraging them to participate more fully in the life and activities of the Church.

# Learn ~ Aprender Deacon Jose Moronta

#### What was more important for St. Paul

In our previous liturgical year (Cycle A) we had some chapters of this same First Letter that St. Paul wrote to the church in Corinth. In those chapters, more often than not, he addressed the scandals which were evident in the Corinthian church. In this new year of the church (Cycle B) Saint Paul is now answering the questions which have been asked by this same church. For the last two weeks we have heard him dealing with marriage and virginity. Now, we hear him begin to attend to their questions about eating meat which has been offered as a sacrifice to idols.

This problem is a very sensible one. A considerable amount of the meat that was sold in the market came from animals sacrificed to idols. Usually, only certain portions of the sacrificial victims were burned, the leftovers becoming the property of the temple priests. Much of this meat was sold to butchers and was available at a lesser cost.

The Council of Jerusalem, which took place around A.D. 48-50, had written to the Christians of Antioch, Syria and Cilicia telling them to abstain from food which had been sacrificed to idols. When Saint Paul was preaching in Corinth two years later, he may not have said anything on the subject, given the very pagan environment of the area, much different from Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. If the faithful at Corinth had to stay away from meat of this kind, they would have had to detach themselves from their fellow citizens.

In replying to this question Saint Paul first explains the general principles that apply: They may eat meat of this type, for idols have no real existence, but sometimes charity requires that they abstain from it. Paul then illustrates what he says by telling what he himself does. It is from this image that our reading comes.

«... If I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it! If I do so willingly, I have a recompense, but if unwillingly, then I have been entrusted with a stewardship...»

Preaching is the expression of Saint Paul's being a Christian, for this he deserves no special credit. The apostolate is a stewardship with which he is entrusted; he is obliged to fulfill it. The servant sent by the Lord does what he has to do even if he is not willing, because it is simply the plan of God almighty. Let us remember that Moses preached to Pharaoh even though he did not want to, and a couple of Sundays ago we heard about how Jonah was forced to preach to the Ninivites.

I think that intentionally, Paul shifts the theme of his letter, to lessen the importance of "religious rules" in order to boost the importance of discipleship. It is obvious that for St. Paul preaching the gospel is more imperative than discerning about not as relevant matters like that one about the acceptable meals. We may follow this example, as in our beloved Catholic Church, we have many, many things that might distract us from the main focus, which is a personal, close relationship with the Lord and the love for his children.


