

RCIA



Fifth Sunday of Lent

No longer will they have need to teach their friends and relatives how to know the LORD.

All, from least to greatest, shall know me, says the LORD, for I will forgive their evildoing and remember their sin no more.

God, all powerful, all knowing, ever-living ... God is beyond our capacity to understand. Yet the Prophet Jeremiah, speaking for God, promises that the day will come when we will know him.

Then, in the fullness of time, Jesus enters into his public ministry. He is flesh and blood, touch and sight and sound. Though the fullness of the Godhead is veiled in his human flesh, he is God truly present. And he invites those who would know him to follow him, to experience his presence.

He still invites today. If we would know him, we must follow him, be where he is, do as he does. To follow him, we must step out of the darkness of our selfish preoccupations and into the light that is Christ.

Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be.

Fifth Sunday in Lent: Last chapter of the "Plan of Salvation"

We have been reflecting during these five Sundays of Lent in what may be called, the "God's Plan of Salvation", unveiled by God after sin was introduced in the world and twisted his original plan of happiness for mankind. This plan should be seen as a series of coordinated events along the centuries that preceded the coming of Christ.

Today we have the last of these five chapters, as next Sunday we'll be celebrating Palm Sunday, introducing us into Holy Week. After the division of Israel into two separate kingdoms God sent prophets to deliver His message of warning and love, reminding to his people all that He had done for them along the centuries. One of the greatest prophets was Isaiah, who was present at the time of the exile to Babylon.

For nearly 75 years after the death of Isaiah no great prophet arose in Judah. It appears the work of the religious leaders of the eighth century B.C. had been in vain. During the long and wicked reign of King Manasseh, idolatrous worship was established more firmly than ever, and the morals of the people sank to their lowest ebb.

The prophets of Yahweh who dared to raise their voices in protest and warning were either silenced or brutally murdered. It was only after a change for the better had been inaugurated under the successors of Manasseh, that the "men of God" again came to the front, and a second golden age of Hebrew prophecy began. It is the age of Jeremiah and Zephaniah, Nahum and Habakkuk, Ezekiel, and Daniel.

The greatest of these, and at the same time the most Christlike of all the prophets, was Jeremiah. Jeremiah came from a priestly family whose estates lay not far from Jerusalem. He received his call as a young man. He warned and admonished kings, priests, and people that they were bringing disaster to the nation because they would not live according to the covenant that they had with Yahweh.

The very institutions of Judah, the Temple, and sacrifices, had become corrupt because they were now being used as an excuse for breaking the covenant: for not treating each other fairly; for exploiting the stranger, the orphan and the widow; for shedding innocent blood; for following alien gods.

Yahweh does not want their holocausts but adherence to the way of life He had marked out for them. Such preaching earned Jeremiah the hatred of the people, priests and kings, who persecuted him. Like Christ, he preached against the established order, stood up for justice for the poor, the widow and the orphan, and was persecuted by those to whom he came to preach.

Our reading for today has also been called "Jeremiah's Spiritual Testament." His entire message is condensed in these few words.

«The days are coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their fathers the day I took them by the hand to lead them forth from the land of Egypt; for they broke my covenant... I will place my law within them, and write it upon their hearts; I will be their God, and they shall be my people...»

In this new era of the New Covenant, intermediaries such as Moses, the Levitical priesthood, and the prophets will be useless; Yahweh will intervene directly, and they will be able to recognize God in every action and situation. They will have a different life attitude because the very inner nature of humanity is created anew. This is what Jesus Christ did and we as Christians believe and celebrate.

The Gospel shows us the most dramatic human feelings of Jesus.

We read what Jesus said,

«...I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name... Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself." He said this indicating the kind of death he would die. »

The Gospel of John presents the cross as the place of victory for Jesus Christ. The evangelist does not try to mask Jesus' embarrassment. It is logical that he is worried about what is coming to him, and he confesses that he feels fear. However, we watch his conviction that sacrifice is necessary for God's plan to be carried out; his conviction is stronger than his fear. He submits to sacrifice freely, moved only by the immense love he feels for humanity, which is going to benefit from that act.

For this reason, he does not feel that his death has been decided against his will, but convinced that it is necessary, The cross of Jesus, which at first glance might seem like a failure, is actually the culmination of the process of giving his life. For by giving his life, Jesus Christ conquers the power of evil and liberates all those who were under his dominion. And he predicts that "I will draw everyone to myself." And after two thousand years, we see that this has happened, still happens and will continue happening.



Tax Free Contribution Information

If you are over 73 and have an IRA or similar retirement account that IRS requires you to take annual distributions these distributions are usually taxed at your ordinary income tax rate.
