



From the Pastor's Desk: The Power of Living Faith

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Faith is not just a feeling or a tradition—it is a living trust in God who walks with us, even when the path is uncertain. As the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us, "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

Abraham, our father in faith, stepped into the unknown simply because he believed God's promise. He had no map, but he had faith—and that was enough. Many of us today face our own uncertainties—about our jobs, families, health, and future. But the same God who guided Abraham guides us too.

Jesus, in Luke's Gospel, tells us, "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom." (Luke 12:32) He knows our struggles. He invites us to be ready, to be faithful servants—not out of fear, but out of trust in a loving Father who never leaves us alone.

Sadly, some of us misunderstand faith. We think it means everything will be easy or that we must "feel" strong all the time. But real faith is not the absence of struggle—it is choosing to trust God even in the midst of it.

Let us grow in that kind of faith. A faith that listens, trusts, and waits. A faith that gives us courage to face the world, knowing we are not alone.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

La fe no es solo un sentimiento o una tradición; es una confianza viva en Dios, que camina con nosotros, incluso cuando el camino no está claro. Como nos recuerda la Carta a los Hebreos: "La fe es la garantía de lo que se espera, la certeza de lo que no se ve." (Hebreos 11,1)

Abraham, nuestro padre en la fe, salió hacia lo desconocido simplemente porque creyó en la promesa de Dios. No tenía un mapa, pero tenía fe. Y eso fue suficiente.
