From the Desk of Fr. Jon Tveit

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, when we begin the holy season of Lent. This is a very important time of the year for our spiritual lives, a time of exercise to strengthen our will and help us to grow closer to the Lord.

Catholics have traditionally marked this season with three things: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It's a good time for us to jumpstart our spiritual lives by adding a bit to our daily prayer routine, and by remembering to share some of what we have with those less fortunate than ourselves. Fasting is also an incredibly powerful spiritual practice.

In Lent, fasting usually takes a few different forms. The 'giving something up' that Catholics are known for in Lent is a kind of fasting. Giving something up that is good and that we like helps us to be strong in the face of temptations to things that aren't so good. Meatless Fridays during Lent are also a kind of fasting. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we abstain from meat and fast throughout the day.

As a reminder of the Church's rules regarding fasting in Lent:

- * Catholics aged **14 and older** are required to eat no meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent
- * Those aged **18-59** are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday
- * Fasting means eating only one full meal during the day, plus two snacks that together don't add up to a full meal

In this way, the Church sets the bare minimum for our Lenten practices. We are, of course, encouraged to go above and beyond this bare minimum, prudently making self-sacrifices to remind us of what our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has done for us, and to prepare us to celebrate better and more worthily the holy feast of Easter.

May God bless you all this Lent and may it be for you a happy and holy season! Fr. Tveit

Facilitators Needed for Putnam Synod

A Synod of Bishops will take place in Rome in October 2023. The theme is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission." The Synod, offers an opportunity to see "how we can continue to live out our mission better, and bring others to know the truth within our Church."

As part of the synodal process, gatherings of Catholics, non-Catholics, and those on the margins are invited to pray, listen, and dialogue together in groups called listening sessions. The Synod listening sessions are to take place during Lent in each of the 12 deaneries of the archdiocese. A working definition of synodality is "cooperation, listening and sharing."

The Putnam/Dutchess Deanery session is scheduled for March 26, 2022 from 9:30am to 12:30pm at St Columba/St. Denis Church in Hopewell Junction, NY. The day will include a 30-minute period of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament and two discussion periods, in the school, 50 minutes each with a 15-minute break in-between each section.

We need to recruit conversation facilitators whose responsibility would be to assist the conversation of a small groups of 8 to 10 people. The facilitator needs to register for a training on ZOOM offered by the archdiocese. If you are interested or have questions, please call Msgr.
