WELCOME TO THE PARISH OF ST. JAMES AND OUR LADY OF THE LAKE / MOUNT CARMEL

Thank you for joining in our Eucharistic celebration. Welcome if you are a visitor. We are glad that you are with us today and hope that you will find nourishment for your faith and life here. If you have recently moved into our Parish, please come to the Parish Office Window at St. James to register and introduce yourself to the priests and staff.

On March 2nd we begin the season of Lent, a time of prayer, penance and reflection. During this season we are called to review our life and prepare ourselves for the Resurrection of Christ, our Savior. During this time, it is customary to "give something up for Lent", I would suggest "doing something for Lent" instead. An extra prayer or two, a daily good deed, trying to reach out to someone in this time of pandemic and so on. Please make an effort to *attend* mass instead of watching it on TV. We can call an elderly neighbor, just to pass the time with them or help an elderly neighbor with their groceries. There are many ways that we can be present for others. Lent is a time when we should reflect on the fact the Christ came to earth so that he might lead us back to the Father. Remembering his prayer at the tomb of Lazarus, "that these might come to understand that I came into this world to bring them everlasting life.". We too are called to be witnesses to that resurrection.

During this time of "social distancing" we will continue to do our best here at St. James to assistance in that journey of faith. Stations of the Cross will be held on Friday afternoons at 1:00 p.m. in St. James Church and Friday evenings at 7:30 p.m. in the Chapel of Life. We will say Morning Prayers before both Morning Masses as we have done in the past. This year we will use the Stations of the Cross Pamphlets as well as the Morning Prayer Pamphlets. We will continue to celebrate an additional Mass at Noon. All parishioners are asked to wear a mask, even if you are fulling vaccinated. Please make sure the mask covers your nose as well as your face.

On Ash Wednesday we will celebrate Mass at 7:30 and 9:00 a.m. and at Noon. Ashes will be distributed after the Mass. We will have a Prayer Service at 4:00 and 7:00 p.m. with the distribution of Ashes after the Service. You must attend Mass or a Service in order to receive Ashes. The manner for the distribution of ashes will be a general imposition of the Prayer, all will stand and the minister will say the blessing over all. Then, if you wish to have ashes place on your head you may approach the altar as you would for communion. All must exit the church immediately after the blessing or reception of the Blessed Ash.


