The Jubilee Year Quilt

The quilt that hangs each year in the background of the St. James outdoor Crèche was made in the Jubilee Year 2000 and was first hung in December of 2000. It has been hanging there each year as a gift to the Baby Jesus for the gift of His life to us.

The quilt blocks themselves have Christian themes. They are; "Bethlehem Rose" (lower left), "Carpenter's Wheel" (lower right), "Star of the Magi" (upper right) and "Heavenly Stars" (upper left). Gold thread was used to quilt symbols of our faith in each of the 9 red squares in the center medallion, such as; The Alpha & Omega, Star of David, the Eucharist, a Fish, St. James Shell, and a Dove just to mention a few. The outer border of red Poinsettia's and green swags complete the original design.

It has faded over these 24 years but still brings some cheer to the stark, cold days of the Christmas Season. The Jubilee Year 2000 quilt was handmade as a gift to St. James by Carol Auer, the wife of Deacon Art Weiner.

"The Twelve Days of Christmas"

is an English Christmas carol. From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the Church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember. To fit the number scheme, when you reach number 9, representing the Fruits of the Holy Ghost, the originator combined 6 to make 3, taking the 6 fruits that were similar: the fruit in each parenthesis is the that was not named separately. There are actually Twelve Fruits of the Holy Ghost.

The "True Love" one hears in the song is not a smitten boy or girlfriend but Jesus Christ, because truly Love was born on Christmas Day. **The partridge in the pear tree** also represents Him because that bird is willing to sacrifice its life if necessary to protect its young by feigning injury to draw away predators.

According to Ann Ball in her book, <u>HANDBOOK OF CATHOLIC SACRAMENTALS</u>:

The two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.

The three French hens stood for faith, hope, and love.

The four calling birds were the four Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The five golden rings represented the first five books of the Old Testament, which describe man's fall into sin and the great love of God in sending a Savior.

The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.

Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit-----Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit-----Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience [Forbearance], Goodness [Kindness], Mildness, Fidelity, Modesty, Continency [Chastity].

The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.

The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful Apostles.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in The Apostles' Creed.


