#### **Journeying with Jesus**

After the Baptism at the Jordan River Jesus walked into the wilderness to be in intimacy with God, the Father. He stayed there for forty days and nights, tempted by the devil.

The journey of Jesus into the wilderness reminds us the story of Elijah who walked to Mount Horeb to encounter with God. He spent forty days and nights on the journey. It also reminds us that Moses spent 40 years in the wilderness leading the people of Israel on the journey to the Promised Land. Jesus, the new Moses, entered into the wilderness for forty days preparing to lead the people of the new Israel to a new promised land, the land of life, the land of heaven.

At the end of his ministry here on earth, Jesus made another journey, the journey to the hill of Calvary. The desolate hill of Calvary then became new Garden of Eden, replacing the Garden where Adam and Eve sinned against God. In the middle of this new Garden was the tree of the Cross, the tree of life, the tree that transforms death into eternal life.

As we begin the season of Lent let us come into the desert of our heart, where we fast and pray with Jesus, where we will meet the Father, where we will receive strength to overcome temptations, sins and death, where we will accept our suffering as part of God's plan for our salvation, where we will walk with Jesus on the journey to Calvary to receive the fruit of eternal life from the tree of the Cross.

We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

Because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world. Amen.

#### 10 Valuable Ways You Can Fast During Lent

We are called to pray, fast and give alms in an intentional way during Lent. Why?

Because Lent is about conversion—turning our lives more completely over to Christ and his way. Conversion means leaving behind an old way of living and acting in order to embrace new life in Christ. Those at Catholic Relief Services remind us that "we fast, or give things up, as a reminder to remove things in our lives that get in the way of our relationship with God. - 1. **Fast from Noise.** Turn off the music and turn on the silence.
- 2. **Fast from Gossip.** Soften our hearts and tongues.
- 3. **Fast from a Creature Comfort.** Make yourself a bit "uncomfortable" so as to be more appreciative of simple gifts.
- 4. **Fast from Excuses.** Try to make all things possible.
- 5. **Fast from Complaints.** Be a solution rather than a contributor to a problem.
- 6. **Fast from Busyness.** Slow down and make time for the Lord and others.
- 7. **Fast from Expectations.** Rather than expect things, be thankful for what you have already received.
- 8. **Fast from Putting Yourself First.** Intentionally put the needs of others to the forefront of our vision.
- 9. Fast from Asking God for What You Want. Don't think of God as a celestial ATM. It's not about me and what I need, it's about a relationship of mutuality, intimacy, and trust.
- 10. **Fast from Being Ungrateful**. Practice gratitude not ingratitude.

Lent need not be about what we give up, but what we gain!

Gain light, grow in love, live Lent!

#### + LENT 2024 +

Lent is a holy season in our Church's year. It is holy because it calls us in a special way to holiness and encourages us to adopt holy habits of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We should try to attend Mass as often as we can during Lent and pray the Rosary and make the Stations of the Cross. We should try to practice some form of self-denial or self-discipline during Lent – so that we might in some small way identify ourselves with Christ who was crucified for us. Also, we should try to make special sacrifices during Lent and practice acts of charity and almsgiving – and it is fortunate that the Cardinal's Stewardship Appeal continues throughout Lent so that we have a very practical opportunity to assist the Church's works of charity in New York.

During Lent the redder shade of purple is used if available, evoking the Blood of Jesus shed for us. The Pascal Candle (normally by the Baptismal Font) is put aside during Lent, brought out only for baptisms and funerals. Flowers are noticeably absent. Dried natural materials and bare and thorny branches remind us of passion themes. The penitential nature of Lent calls for specific seasonal music as well. Pain chant will be used at Mass.


#### A thank you to our parishioners from Mary Knolker




