MARCH IS THE MONTH OF SAINT JOSEPH

We don't know much about Joseph except what is in the Gospels. He was the husband of Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Holy Scripture proclaims him as a "just man," and the Church has turned to Joseph for his patronage and protection. Pope Leo XIII (On the Devotion to St. Joseph, 1889) explains: "Thus in giving Joseph the Blessed Virgin as spouse, God appointed him to be not only her life's companion, the witness of her maidenhood, the protector of her honor, but also, by virtue of the conjugal tie, a participator in her sublime dignity. And Joseph shines among all mankind by the most august dignity, since by divine will, he was the guardian of the Son of God and reputed as His father among men." Pope John Paul II wrote (Guardian of the Redeemer, 1989), hoping "that all may grow in devotion to the Patron of the Universal Church and in love for the Savior whom he served in such an exemplary manner ... In this way the whole Christian people not only will turn to St. Joseph with greater fervor and invoke his patronage with trust, but also will always keep before their eyes his humble. mature way of serving and of 'taking part' in the plan of salvation."

St. Joseph is the patron of the Universal Church; the patron of the dying because Jesus and Mary were at his death-bed; the patron of fathers, of carpenters, and of social justice. Many religious orders and communities are placed under his patronage.

10 Valuable Ways You Can Fast During Lent


We are called to pray, fast and give alms in an intentional way during Lent, because Lent is about conversion—turning our lives more completely over to Christ and his way. Conversion means leaving behind an old way of living and acting in order to embrace new life in Christ. We fast, or give things up, as a reminder to remove things in our lives that get in the way of our relationship with God.

- 1. **Fast from Noise.** Turn off the music and turn on the silence.
- 2. **Fast from Gossip.** Soften our hearts and tongues.
- 3. **Fast from a Creature Comfort.** Make yourself a bit "uncomfortable" so as to be more appreciative of simple gifts.
- 4. **Fast from Excuses.** Try to make all things possible
- 5. **Fast from Complaints.** Be a solution rather than a contributor to a problem.
- 6. **Fast from Busyness.** Slow down and make time for the Lord and others.
- 7. **Fast from Expectations.** Rather than expect things, be thankful for what you have already received.
- 8. **Fast from Putting Yourself First.** Intentionally put the needs of others to the forefront of our vision.
- 9. Fast from Asking God for What You Want Don't think of God as a celestial ATM. It's not about me and what I need, it's about a relationship of mutuality, intimacy, and trust.
- 10. **Fast from Being Ungrateful**. Practice gratitude not ingratitude.




