WELCOME TO THE PARISH OF ST. JAMES THE APOSTLE AND OUR LADY OF THE LAKE/MT. CARMEL

Thank you for joining in our Eucharistic celebration. If you are a visitor, we welcome you and are glad that you are with us today. We hope that you will find nourishment for your faith and life here. If you have recently moved into our Parish, please come to the Parish Office at St. James to register and introduce yourself to the priests and staff.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum-from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day, unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil. Therefore, the Easter Triduum of the passion, death and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. So, the Solemnity of Easter has the same kind of preeminence in the liturgical year that Sunday has in the week. From the early days of the ancient Church the Easter Vigil has been the time for adult converts to be baptized and enter the Church. Catechumens (those who have never been baptized) and candidates (those who have been baptized in a non-Catholic Christian denomination) are initiated into the Church by (respectively) baptism and confirmation. Other candidates (baptized Catholics who have not completed their initiation) are given the Easter Sacraments as well.

A Traditional Holy Thursday Devotion

One of the traditions during Holy Week is a practice in which the faithful visit seven churches (a Roman custom) on Maundy (Holy) Thursday to pray in front of the Blessed Sacrament in the repository. While the rest of the world goes to sleep, Catholic pilgrims will be traveling around late into the night, keeping Jesus company on the eve of his Crucifixion. Considering visiting our neighboring parishes.

Divine Mercy Novena at St. James Church

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy (the Sunday after Easter) be preceded by a Novena beginning on Good Friday. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said: "These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy." A group will gather before the Divine Mercy in Our Lady of the Lake on Good Friday after the Tenebrae Service and then during the week in the Chapel of Life after the 9AM Mass. No matter how long it may have been since your last confession – weeks, years or even decades – there is no time like the start of Holy Week to know the mercy of God in the Sacrament of Penance. Seize this moment of grace. Bring a friend.

6 STEPS FOR A GOOD CONFESSION

- 1) Examine your conscience to ascertain which sins have you committed since your last good confession.
- 2) Be sincerely sorry for your sins.
- 3) Confess your sins to the priest. Say: "Bless me Father for I have sinned, it has been _____ since my last confession. I am a single/married man/woman (with children). These are my sins..."
- 4) Make certain that you confess all your mortal sins and the number of times you committed each one.
- 5) After your confession, do the penance the priest gives to you.
- 6) Pray daily for the strength to avoid the occasion of sin, especially for those sins you were just absolved from. Say the Act of Contrition before going to bed every night!

ACT OF CONTRITION

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended You, and I detest all my sins because I dread the loss of Heaven and the pains of Hell, but most of all because they offend You, my God, Who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Amen.


Divine Mercy Novena

Please say the Novena in your home on Easter Sunday.






