APRIL – The Blessed Sacrament

Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The Church traditionally encouraged during the month of April increased devotion to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. "The Church in the course of the centuries has introduced various forms of this Eucharistic worship which are ever increasing in beauty and helpfulness; as, for example, visits of devotion to the tabernacles, even every day; Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament; solemn processions, especially at the time of Eucharistic Congresses, which pass through cities and villages; and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament publicly exposed . . . These exercises of piety have brought a wonderful increase in faith and supernatural life to the Church militant upon earth and they are re-echoed to a certain extent by the Church triumphant in heaven, which sings continually a hymn of praise to God and to the Lamb 'Who was slain.'" EASTER DUTY

Due of the central importance of Easter to the Christian faith, the Catholic Church requires that all Catholics who have made their First Communion receive the Holy Eucharist sometime during the Easter season, which lasts through Pentecost Sunday, 50 days after Easter (Church Law extends the time when this duty may be fulfilled until Trinity Sunday, an extra two weeks!). They should also take part in the Sacrament of Penance before receiving this Easter Communion. This reception of the Eucharist is a visible sign of our faith and our participation in the Kingdom of God. Of course, we should receive Communion as frequently as possible (as long as we are in the state of grace); this "Easter Duty" is simply the minimum requirement set by the Church.

Easter Flower Memorial

As in past years, parishioners are invited to make donations for our church greens, plants, and flowers which honor our Lord, Mary, and the Saints, and decorate our church during the Easter season. Please include the names (feel free to add other names on the back) of deceased loved ones. Drop the envelopes in the collection or at the Rectory Office. Nine (9) Masses are offered for these intentions (see the bulletin for times). Afterward, these envelopes will be placed by the Tabernacles in our churches (close to the Heart of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament) through Pentecost. Envelopes are available at the doors of the churches.

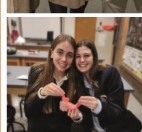

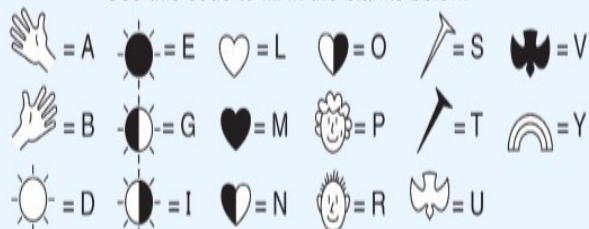

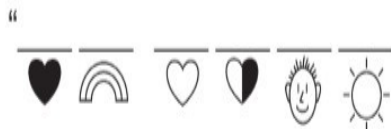
