All Mother's Day Masses, will be offered for these special intentions, with the exception of the 12:30pm Mass at OLL, which is offered for all the people of the parish. The envelopes will then be placed near the Tabernacle for the Month of May.

ATTENDING MASS WITH SMALL CHILDREN

You are most welcome to come with all the kids to the 10:00am Family Mass, a child-friendly liturgy where the movement and noise of little ones in the church is most welcome.

During other Masses at St. James, you are encouraged to use the main lobby and the hall by the bathrooms to sit with noisy young children. Chairs are provided. This keeps the noise to a minimum in the church itself and provides spaces during Mass for the gradual socialization of our little ones into the practice of Sunday worship. *We encourage those with little ones to bring them to church and to use these options.*

ENCOUNTERS WITH THE RISEN CHRIST

EASTER DUTY

Due to the central importance of Easter to the Christian faith, the Catholic Church requires that all Catholics who have made their First Communion receive the Holy Eucharist sometime during the Easter season, which lasts through Pentecost Sunday, 50 days after Easter (Church Law extends the time when this duty may be fulfilled until Trinity Sunday, an extra two weeks!). They should also take part in the Sacrament of Penance before receiving this Easter Communion. This reception of the Eucharist is a visible sign of our faith and our participation in the Kingdom of God. Of course, we should receive Communion as frequently as possible (as long as we are in the state of grace); this "Easter Duty" is simply the minimum requirement set by the Church.

ALPHA Marriage Course

The **Office of Family Life** invites all married couples in the Archdiocese of New York to take part in the ALPHA Marriage Course! This series of 7 video sessions is designed to promote open, honest, and productive conversation between spouses on the topics of connection, communication, conflict, forgiveness, family, sex, and acts of love. There is no discussion or sharing with the larger group, so you can use this time to get to know and grow with your spouse without fear of judgment or lack of privacy!

The Course is by Zoom every Thursday from May 16 to June 27, from 7:00 PM to approximately 9:00 PM.

MAY AND MARY

The month of **May** is dedicated to **The Blessed Virgin Mary**. The first 19 days fall within the liturgical season of **Easter**, which is represented by the liturgical color white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored). The remainder of the month (beginning the Monday after Pentecost) is in **Ordinary Time** which is represented by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection.

The world is resplendent with Spring's increased light and new growth. It is Mary's month in the Easter season and all of nature rejoices with the Queen of heaven at the Resurrection of the Son she was worthy to bear. During the remainder of Easter time, let us endeavor through the prayers of the Holy Liturgy and the Holy Rosary to deepen our gratitude for the mystery of our Baptismal rebirth in Christ.

"The month of May, with its profusion of blooms was adopted by the Church in the eighteenth century as a celebration of the flowering of Mary's maidenly spirituality. With its origins in Isaiah's prophecy of the Virgin birth of the Messiah under the figure of the Blossoming Rod or Root of Jesse, the flower symbolism of Mary was extended by the Church Fathers, and in the liturgy, by applying to her the flower figures of the Sapiential (Wisdom) Books - Canticles, Wisdom, Proverbs, and Sirach.

In the medieval period, the rose was adopted as the flower symbol of the Virgin Birth, as expressed in Dante's phrase, "The Rose wherein the Divine Word was made flesh," and depicted in the central rose windows of the great gothic cathedrals - from which came the Christmas carol, "Lo, How a Rose 'ere Blooming." Also, in the medieval period, when monasteries were the centers of horticultural and agricultural knowledge, and with the spread of the Franciscan love of nature, the actual flowers themselves, of the fields, waysides, and gardens, came to be seen as symbols of Mary.

Pentecost, the birth of the Church, is also among the celebrations of May. Though sprung from the side of Christ on the Cross, the Church marks as her birthday the descent of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the Apostles. At the "birth" of the world, the Holy Spirit — the Breath of God — was the "mighty wind [that] swept over the waters" (Gen 1:2); at the birth of the Church He is present again "like the rush of a mighty wind" to recreate the world in the image of Christ through His Church (Acts 2:2).

We, the members of Christ's Mystical Body, are the present-day disciples sent by the Holy Spirit to bring Christ to the world. May we go forth as did Mary, who set out in haste to assist St. Elizabeth (feast of the Visitation, May 31). *Come upon us, O Holy Spirit, so that, with Mary, we may proclaim the greatness of the Lord who has done great things for us — for his mercy endures forever!*

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES

It is a great honor to be asked to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. The role of a "godparent" is to be an "other parent" in matters of our holy Faith. That is why sponsors must be **practicing Catholics, 16 years of age or older (14 years old in the Archdiocese of New York)**, having received **Catholic Confirmation** and currently **living a good Christian moral life**. If the sponsor is married, that person must be in a **valid Catholic Church marriage**. One sponsor is required for Confirmation. It is customary to have two for Baptism, in which case one must be male and the other female. Parents may not be sponsors. A baptized non-Catholic may replace the second Baptism sponsor as a Christian witness. Non-Christians may not be Sponsors. Former Catholics may not be sponsors.

A nominated sponsor is asked to get certification from his/her current parish. This is a declaration by a priest/deacon that the individual is qualified to be a sponsor according to Church Law. To be so certified, the individual must be a current parishioner of the particular parish where the certification is being sought and be known to the priest/deacon as being a faithful practicing Catholic, attending Mass there weekly. Those away at college or graduate school or in the military may seek certification from their campus ministries or chaplains.

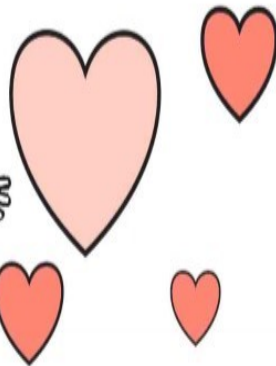
Unfortunately, at times, family members or friends are chosen to be sponsors with good intentions but are found to be ineligible according to Church Law. Also, more and more, people seem to think that they are still "parishioners" of their childhood parish, where they attended school or received sacraments years ago, while no longer living in the area or attending Mass there regularly. **It is important for all individuals to be active members of their local Catholic faith communities.** Here, at St. James the Apostle / Our Lady of the Lake / Mt. Carmel Parish, Certificates of Sponsorship are given by the pastor or his vicars to registered members of the parish who are practicing Catholics, and who meet the above criteria. Please call or stop by the Parish Office to inquire about getting a certificate.

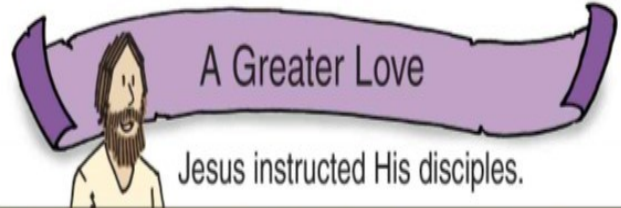

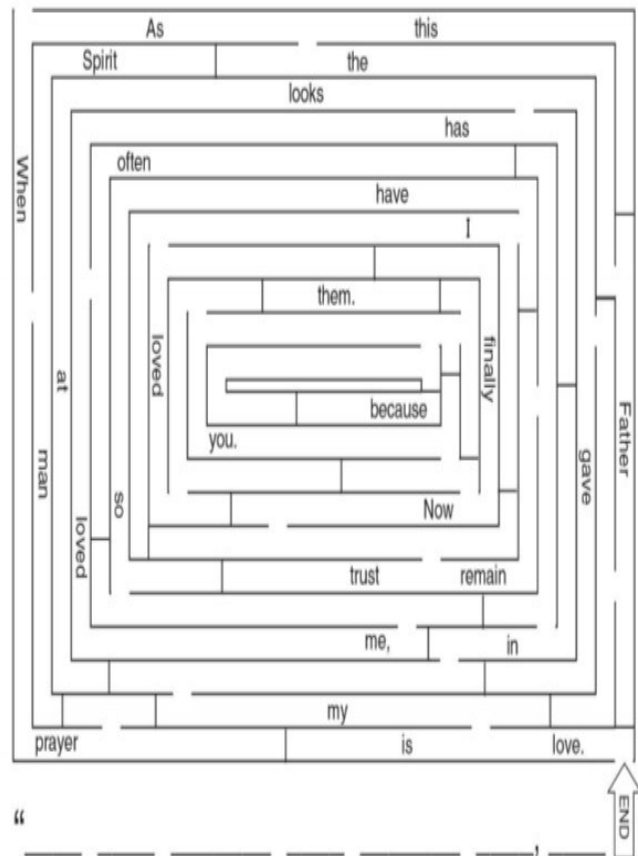
