Thank you for joining in our Eucharistic celebration. If you are a visitor, we welcome you and are glad that you are with us today. We hope that you will find nourishment for your faith and life here. If you have recently moved into our Parish, please come to the Parish Office at St. James to register and introduce yourself to the priests and staff.

ORDINARY TIME AFTER PENTECOST

Ordinary does not mean plain. The name comes from "ordinalis" meaning "showing order, denoting an order of succession." It is used in this sense to refer to the order of the counted weeks. That is to say, it is a season of counted weeks.

This second period of Ordinary Time is the longest liturgical season. Ordinary Time resumes after Pentecost and runs until the final Saturday before Advent. This period of Ordinary Time focuses on Christ's reign as King of kings, and on the age of the Church. This is the age we live in now, which is the time between the age of the Apostles and the age of Christ's second and final coming for which we are ever preparing. The final Sunday in Ordinary Time is the Feast of Christ the King; the Saturday after this feast is the final day of Ordinary time. The liturgical color is green, and the lighter shade reflects the natural beauty of summer life.

TRINITY SUNDAY

Trinity Sunday, officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity," is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than a person or event.

Today, Christians remember and honor the eternal God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. While the word "trinity" does not appear in Scripture, it is taught in Matthew 28:18-20 and 2 Corinthians 13:14 along with many other Bible passages. The concept of the Holy Trinity can never be completely understood. That is the mystery. But it is clearly taught in Scripture and explained in Tradition. Understanding this comes through the work of the Holy Spirit; therefore, it is appropriate that this mystery is celebrated the first Sunday after Pentecost, when the outpouring of the Holy Spirit first occurred.

However, although we ponder the Most Holy Trinity on this special day, we commemorate the Trinity at every Eucharist. By its very nature, every Holy Mass is Trinitarian: when we offer TO the FATHER, WITH the SON (as part of His Mystical Body), IN the HOLY SPIRIT.

The Parish Office will be closed on Monday, May 27 for Memorial Day. Our morning Masses will be said as scheduled.

As reported in the Parish August 31, 2023 Annual Report, during the period 2002 to 2023 the Archdiocese, on behalf of our parish, has paid our bills for pensions, medical benefits, and insurance as an "interest free" loan. Our debt to the Archdiocese as of March 2024 is \$2,051,279 (\$1,421,344 for the school, \$629,935 for the parish). The current fiscal year 2024 Archdiocese bills and all other bills are being paid by the weekly collections. In order to pay down this significant debt, we ask you to continue to use the monthly gold envelope, now to be labeled *Debt Reduction*.

A Note about Cremation

Cremation is permitted by the Catholic Church, and Catholics are reminded that the cremains (ashes) are to be treated with respect and dignity.

Cremains should be buried or interred as soon as possible after a Funeral Mass.

Cremains should never be displayed or stored in an urn at home or sprinkled over land or water, nor may they be divided among family members and friends. Just as the body is reverently buried, so too should cremains be buried reverently with prayer in a consecrated place. Please speak with a priest or deacon if you have a question.






