# **EASTER DUTY**

Due to the central importance of Easter to the Christian faith, the Catholic Church requires that all Catholics who have made their First Communion receive the Holy Eucharist sometime during the Easter season, which lasts through Pentecost Sunday, 50 days after Easter (Church Law extends the time when this duty may be fulfilled until Trinity Sunday, an extra two weeks!). They should also take part in the Sacrament of Penance before receiving this Easter Communion. This reception of the Eucharist is a visible sign of our faith and our participation in the Kingdom of God. Of course, we should receive Communion as frequently as possible (as long as we are in the state of grace); this "Easter Duty" is simply the minimum requirement set by the Church.

## **BUY A BRICK PROGRAM IS BACK!**

Purchase a personalized 4x8 brick for \$200, each additional brick is \$150. A second option is an 8X8 brick for \$375.00.

The bricks can be used to memorialize a deceased loved one, celebrate a relative or friend, commemorate a special occasion, or give thanks to God for a blessing received. The number of lines of text are 15 characters per line (periods, commas, dashes, and spaces count as characters). All letters will be capitals and are centered on the brick.

#### PERMANENT DEACONS + ARE YOU BEING CALLED? +

We have been blessed to have many deacons serve at St. James the Apostle & Our Lady of the Lake / Mt. Carmel Parish over the years. The ministry of permanent deacons has become an important part of our parish life today, yet for centuries until 1967, this deeply traditional ministry had virtually disappeared. Every priest had first to be ordained a deacon (transitional deacon), but the notion that one could actually embrace a permanent vocation to the diaconate was lost in the West while perduring in the East.

The primary ministry of the deacon is to the welfare of the community, especially its poor, and his role in sacraments and preaching flows from that. His principal role is to animate and promote the ministry of all the faithful.

Deacons do not preside at Mass, nor may they absolve sins. Nor, since anointing of the sick is linked theologically to penance, may they anoint. Deacons do baptize and preside at Catholic marriages. They are ordinary ministers of Holy Communion distributing the Eucharist at Mass and bringing the Blessed Sacrament to those in need. They conduct Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament and lead parish devotions. They teach and preach as needed.

Ninety percent of permanent deacons are married, although the discipline of celibacy for clerics means that if a deacon is widowed, normally, he cannot remarry, nor can an unmarried deacon marry once ordained.

Sometimes we are slow to engage with a tradition: the Council of Trent discussed permanent deacons in the 1560s, but nothing was done until the 1960s. The documents of the Second Vatican Council (Vatican II) and two decrees of Pope Paul VI restored the permanent diaconate to the Western Church.

The vitality of the long delayed restoration of the diaconate has greatly enriched the Church, particularly in the United States, where the majority of the deacons in the world serve.

Men of the parish 30 years of age or older are invited to consider whether the Lord is calling them to this ministry. Speak with Fr. Quarato or one of the deacons if interested.




