ADMINISTRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

- **Baptism** • We welcome all families with young children. For your first step, you must become a registered, practicing, contributing member of St. Rose of Lima. Your second step is to contact Tessie in the office, 851-1874, to schedule and get a baptism packet. **Be sure you provide all the necessary documents 10 days prior to the baptism class.** Baptism class is the 2nd Thursday of every month at 6 PM. **Reservations are needed for the class.** At least one godparent must be a practicing Catholic. All baptisms are celebrated on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, & 4th Sunday of each month at 12 noon, after the 10:30 Mass. **No baptisms during Lent.**
- **Matrimony** • At least one party must be a registered, practicing member of St. Rose with at least 6 months active proven attendance at Mass. After this is accomplished, please call Jane Lucero to make an appointment to begin your 6 month marriage preparation process. *Please make no arrangements until after this appointment.* You may pick up a marriage packet in the parish office. *Engaged Encounter* weekend is required: www.renoee.org for dates, times and registration.
- **Anointing of the Sick** • It is best to call at the *beginning* of a serious illness or when surgery is first scheduled.
- **Funerals** • Upon the death of a loved one, please call the Parish Office to make arrangements, 851-1874.

GOD'S WAYS

In the stream of readings during this portion of Ordinary Time one week's texts can often appear to pick up exactly where the previous week's concluded. The sentiments expressed in today's first reading seem to be a direct reaction to the Gospel passage we heard last week. In that Gospel, the landowner pays the same wages to his workers whether they worked for a full day or for only a few minutes. Today Ezekiel gives us the lament, "The LORD's way is not fair!" (Ezekiel 18:25). These Sundays in Ordinary Time offer us a glimpse into the ways of the Lord. We see how God's way has the tendency to turn the accepted conventions of the day upside down. Those who always expected that their way to heaven was guaranteed are disappointed. Those who thought they never had a chance are given that chance. Today offers us another opportunity to discover the abundance of God's mercy and love.

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TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — When the wicked turn away from their wickedness they have committed and do what is right, they shall surely live (Ezekiel 18:25-28).

Psalms — Remember your mercies, O Lord (Psalm 25).

Second Reading — Consider others as better than yourselves; look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others (Philippians 2:1-11 [1-5]).

Gospel — Tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God ahead of you (Matthew 21:28-32).

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Eucharistic Prayer IV is, like Eucharistic Prayer III, a fresh composition from the 1960s, based on a prayer from the tradition of the ancient church of Alexandria. It has an interesting structural feature. The new prayers all nod toward the East with the *epiclesis*, or calling down of the Spirit, over the gifts. In this prayer the Spirit is asked to come down again, after the consecration, to make holy the communicants who "partake of this one Bread and one Chalice that, gathered into one body by the Holy Spirit, they may truly become a living sacrifice in Christ to the praise of your glory." This beautiful phrase is well worth meditating on. What is the goal of your reception of Holy Communion today?

The preface for this Eucharistic Prayer is firmly attached to the prayer, and the directives for using the prayer anchor it to Ordinary Time. It is not intended to be an option if the Mass has a proper preface of its own, like a funeral, a Lenten weekday, or a great feast. It is not often used these days, in part because of these limitations. At first, it was suggested that this prayer was better suited to small groups of people who were well educated in scripture. This was kind of an odd stipulation, especially since its images are so beautiful and worthy of attention.

The Women of St. Rose will host Bishop Randolph Calvo on Monday, October 16, 2017 for a presentation titled "Women Deacons: What the Past Can Mean for Today." This event is open to the entire parish. The presentation will begin at 6:00 in the Sanctuary followed by a dessert social

in Caramella Hall. In May 2015, Pope Francis was asked if he would establish an official commission to study the question of whether women could be admitted to the diaconate. "I accept. It would be useful for the church to clarify this question. I agree," he answered. In August 2016 Pope Francis established a "Commission of Study on the Diaconate of Women" and named twelve members to serve on it.

While serving as president of the Canon Law Society of America in November 1995, Bishop Calvo sent a copy of an ad hoc committee's report on "canonical implications of ordaining women to the permanent diaconate" to then-Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger.

Commissions have studied the possibility of women deacons in the past, but what they have concluded has not been published. Bishop Calvo's presentation will draw upon the work of historians and scriptural scholars, who point to the presence of women deacons and deaconesses in the early church. Beyond looking at history, Bishop Calvo will invite us to look at the possibilities.

"What we're doing here today," the bishop has said, "in raising the question of women deacons, is asking, 'Where is the Holy Spirit calling us on this particular question at this particular time?'"

Creating awareness is the strength of this program.

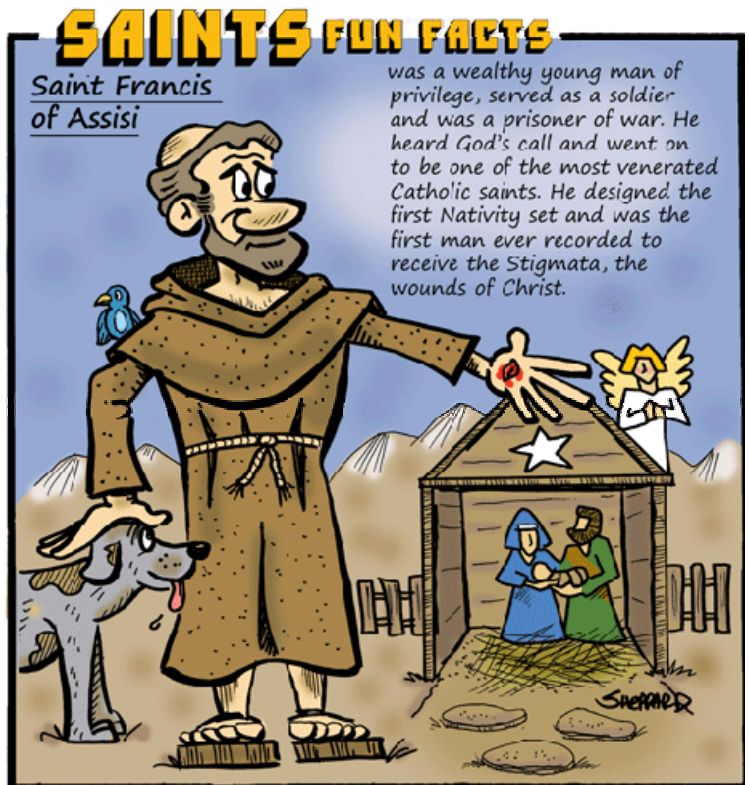

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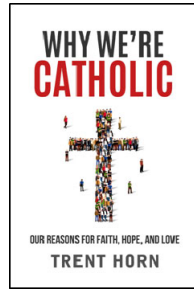

Find Your Catholic Voice – Bible Translations (2)

More on Bible translations (Sources: *Hard Sayings* and *Why We're Catholic* both by Trent Horn.)

We do not possess Plato's original *Republic* nor do we possess the original Jewish histories of Josephus, The Roman histories of Tacitus, or the Greek histories of Thucydides.

However, modern scholars reconstruct original manuscripts of these works by comparing all the surviving copies using a process called *textual criticism*.

Simple example of textual criticism: Your grandmother, who lived in a remote cabin, had a fabulous recipe for chocolate chip cookies. You liked them so much you copied down her recipe for your personal use. When you bake them for your friends they in turn copy down the recipe for their use. 50 years go by and your grandmother has passed on and her cabin was destroyed in a fire. No original recipe. However, with all of the various copies that were made, if you collect them all and compare them to each other and sift out the various differences that may have crept in, you will be able to reconstruct the original recipe.

One of the most famous examples of Greek literature:

Homer's *Iliad* was written in the eighth century B.C. and the oldest complete copy available was written in the tenth century A.D. Or 1,800 years later.

In contrast, there are over 5,500 copies of Greek New Testament manuscripts. Fifty of the manuscripts are dated to within 250 years of the original copies. There are 15,000 copies in other languages like Latin, Coptic, and Syriac. The first complete copy of the New Testament [*Codex Sinaiticus*] can be dated to within 300 years of the original documents.
