


### A note from Fr. Sengole

"As committed Christians of the Roman Catholic Church in Richmond, Indiana, we are a community centered in Christ and rooted in the Eucharistic communion, journeying together in our call to be holy, constantly discerning the charisms of the Spirit, making disciples of one another, seeking God's kingdom in service, stewardship and charity."

You just read our new Mission Statement! Two months of being here in our parish, I have been praying and working on this new Mission Statement for our parish. This doesn't mean that the existing statement is obsolete or wanting more. The purpose of a new vision and mission statement is two-fold: to update ourselves with new and emerging models of evangelization and to ignite a new fervor for the urgency of evangelization for our times that each one of us need to take up. Generally a vision statement captures "who we are or who we want to be" and a mission statement tells us and others "what we should be doing in order to realize who we are." In our Christian calling, the vision and mission are one and the same. We all have one mission - that of what our Lord entrusted to the Apostles. The Lord told the Apostles: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Mt 28:19-20). If you notice, there are four verbs in the great commissioning: Go, make disciples, baptize and teach. The original Greek sentence has one of these four verbs as a hinge verb without which the other three verbs has no context. That hinge verb is "make disciples." If we fail in making disciples, all that we do - going far and wide, baptizing and teaching in many and varied ways as Catholics - will lose the original context. Our primary mission is to make disciples. You and I as parents, teachers, co -workers, colleagues, friends, ministers... are called to make one another disciples of Christ. Making one another a disciple necessarily means that we invite others to experience the joyful life that we have in the Lord. The first one to go evangelizing in the Bible is Mary. She immediately rushed and set out to see Elizabeth (Lk 1:39), primarily driven by her exuberant joy of salvation for the entire humanity, after being visited by Gabriel. Evangelization is a mission of joy. It is all about telling others what God has done to us in His only Son and in His Spirit. This joy is about our holiness. God has made us holy in our baptism. We are set on a mission of telling everyone that God in Jesus loves us unconditionally and beyond imagination. To such a love, our only response is to constantly see ourselves holy and thus bear witness to God's presence. Jesus is living! He is real! That is why we go to Mass. We must encounter Him everyday and begin having the most wonderful friendship that we can ever imagine! The cost of discipleship is our life, nothing less and nothing more!

May we entrust ourselves and our parish to the intercession of the Blessed Mother!


