



He knew Lazarus, perhaps walked by him every time he came in or out, but did nothing to relieve his suffering. Is there a Lazarus in my life? What am I doing to help?

"We should not think of the devil as a myth, a representation, a symbol, a figure of speech or an idea. This mistake would lead us to let down our guard, to grow careless and end up more vulnerable. Faith-filled prayer, meditation on the Word of God, the celebration of Mass, Eucharistic adoration, sacramental Reconciliation, works of charity, community life, missionary outreach...progress in the spiritual life and growth in love are the best counterbalance to evil."

A note from Fr. Sengole

Two weeks ago I began a small catechesis on the Holy Mass using my homily for the high school students. I gave a brief story about me going to school on a bike every day, for four years. Our home parish had a Catholic school only to the eighth grade. Those who wanted to continue education had to go about six miles one way on a bike. As with everything, time brings change. We no longer have to travel miles to go to school!

I told the students how I also asked a question at one point in my life that everyone one would ask, "Why should I go to Church?" I did not proceed any further. I just left them with that question. I did ask that question when I was a tenth grader. Although I did everything in the church growing up, from cleaning to repairing, from arranging for Mass to accompanying my pastor on his motor cycle to distant villages. I was a lector. I was a cantor as well! A period of doubt came to rest on me. It was pretty upsetting. I had couple of my friends to share the same type of feelings. Well, asking right questions takes us to the right answers and deepens our conviction in what we believe. There is nothing wrong in asking questions, even if absurd. What matters is whether or not we pursue the question and search for meaning.

This Tuesday I continued on the same topic. I told them three things to consider in answering the question: "Why should I go to Church?" 1) You are the future of the Church; you/we are the Church; 2) If we believe in God and also believe that God speaks to us – what is the best way God would find to reach our hearts?; 3) If we believe that we love one another, what is the best expression of love that we are trying to emulate or imitate?; and 4) You belong to God's family and that family is the Church. If you are the future of the Church, what concrete ways you are involved in the Church now? Look at the people that are involved in raising you as disciples of Christ. God talks to us through the sacred Scriptures. In Greek the word, inspiration, has an active meaning. The scripture is *theopneustos* (God-breathing). God inspires us right when we read and listen to the Scriptures that are presented in the 1st, 2nd and in the responsorial, mostly from the Old Testament. That is why the Church rightly recognizes the Old Testament as the preparation for the Gospel. God leads us to Christ in the Gospel; the whole direction is toward finding Christ ever new and ever more! The supreme expression of love for the entire humanity is Jesus' death on the cross. Jesus' coming back to life again is God's faithful response to the love of Jesus on the cross. If we believe in what Jesus did, we must also believe in what he said – that he is truly present in the Mass.

I will continue to talk about the Holy Mass two more Tuesdays.


