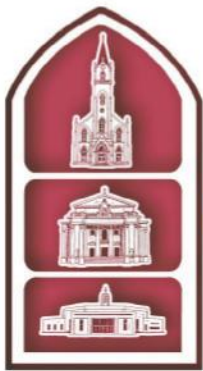


A note from Fr. Sengole

Apart from Respect for Life and Rosary, the month of October commemorates many famous saints! St. Luke the Apostle, St. Jude the Apostle, St. Ignatius of Antioch (d. 107), St. Theresa of Child Jesus (1873-1897), Francis of Assisi (1181-1226), St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582) and some more! Every time I read a saint's history, I am thrilled to see the extraordinary life they lived. The Apostles were so different from their former life, even during their time with Jesus. So true that what we read in Acts 1:8, *"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."* Once they were touched by grace they were different people, entirely animated by the Spirit.

The saints were heroic. They were bold. They were selfless. St. Jude's martyrdom is so powerful that he is represented by the axe by which he was killed. St. Ignatius of Antioch was thrown out to be devoured by lions. St. Luke wrote one of the four Gospels. It is amazing, how he presents Jesus in the context of the poor and the underprivileged. St. Francis of Assisi became a man for everyone and every living creature. He called every living creature, his brother and sister. Sister death...sister suffering!! St. Theresa of Avila was a heroic woman. She was a different woman! She was beautiful, talented, outgoing, adaptable, affectionate, courageous, enthusiastic, she was totally human - wise, yet practical; intelligent, a mystic, yet an energetic reformer; a holy woman, a womanly woman. Her book, *The Interior Castle*, is a classic on Christian mysticism. Theresa of Child Jesus died of tuberculosis at the age of 24. She was an extraordinary woman for her age. Within the four walls of her cell, she spent hours praying for priests and doing little things in which she took so much pleasure. She never got out of her convent and still she is patron saint for missionaries! Her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*, will astound anyone to admire at her ability to remember the Scripture versus and attempting to apply to her life. No wonder, saints are considered the best interpreters of the Bible by their living!

Saints are not supermen/women. Their lives were surrounded by all kinds of miseries and sufferings. What makes them stand out was their love for Christ and the awareness of what they were capable. The saints remind us that we are and can be more than what we think. Let us bless the Lord for the cloud of witnesses in the saints! We can be saints – no doubt whatsoever!

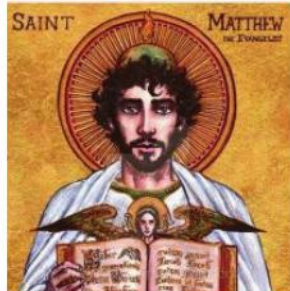

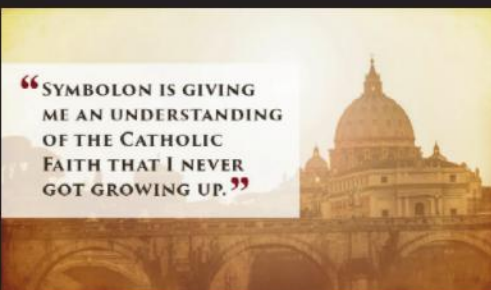

Every year our students give of their time, talent, and treasure in some way. We have been in school 42 days and our students have already been busy raising money for Birthright, Indiana Women in Need (IWIN), and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. They also have been collecting toiletries for area veterans. Seton Catholic students have raised \$200 for Birthright, \$3,000 for IWIN, and \$239 for St. Jude's. St. Jude's was a fundraiser that fifth grader, Ashton Brandt, brought to our attention. She has been raising money for St. Jude's since she was 4 years old. She asked Mrs. Becker if our elementary students could pay \$1 for a free-dress day and all the money raised would be put towards her total. ANUNCIOS PARA LA COMUNIDAD LATINA

Mensaje por el Padre Sengole Gnanaraj

Se realizó nuestro primer entrenamiento para los servidores en la sagrada misa. Extraordinarios Ministros de Eucaristía (EME). Yo estaba en 4to. grado cuando comencé a servir durante la misa, adoraba hacerlo en mi pueblo donde nací, incluso ayudaba en los días en que no estaba asignado, siempre dispuesto a sustituir a alguien. De ésta forma aprendí cada detalle del altar y de lo que el sacerdote hacía.

Recuerden que la Santa Misa es una conmemoración de la muerte de Cristo, es un sacrificio real porque representa (hace presente) el sacrificio en la cruz (ver CCC1364-1366). Qué gran honor y privilegio tienen los servidores del altar al estar cerca del misterio más sublime de nuestra fé, que asisten al sacerdote, que en la persona de Cristo, celebra la Misa!

San Juan Pablo en el 2001, exhortó a un grupo de servidores en el altar diciéndoles: Los servidores del altar ocupan un lugar privilegiado en la celebración litúrgica, ya que experimentan de primera mano que Cristo Jesús está presente y activo en cada acto litúrgico.

Jesús está presente cuando la comunidad se reúne a rezar y alabar a Dios. Los servidores son amigos jóvenes de Jesús, que al cultivar ésta amistad más profundamente encontrarán a un verdadero amigo para la vida. Quiero agradecer a los servidores del altar, ellos ayudan a sus padres, abuelos y a todo aquél que pide ayuda. Y nosotros no lo vemos! Pero sabe que muchas bendiciones vienen a tu vida al ir perfeccionando tu servicio a Cristo y al mundo. Asistir a Misa los domingos es una obligación, pero aún más importante es el mostrarnos agradecidos a Dios, amando a Cristo, quien murió por tí y por mí.

Programa de Primera Comunión y Primera Confesión**Requisitos Generales:**

Estar bautizado (a): Haber recibido el sacramento del bautismo en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Si el niño (a) no fueron bautizados dentro de la comunidad católica, pueden hacer su Primera Comunión, pero deberán avisar primero al Padre Sengole de ésta situación.

Haber cursado 2 años de catecismo: Tradicionalmente son dos años consecutivos comenzando en primer y segundo año de escuela, después de esos 2 años, podrán realizar el sacramento en la fecha que les acomode. Los (as) niños (as) deberán estar inscritos en el Programa de Educación Religiosa de la Escuela Católica de Setón, asistir cada domingo de acuerdo a calendario, se estarán registrando las asistencias. Recuerden que el propósito es hacer seguidores comprometidos de Jesús.

La familia debe practicar la fé católica: Las familias deberán atender regularmente misa los domingos. Y estar conscientes que son discípulos llamados a realizar éste viaje siguiendo los pasos que Jesús siguió en ésta vida. La Última Cena es la primera imagen de la Primera Comunión en las Sagradas Escrituras, en ésta, Jesús transforma el pan y el vino de la Comida de Pascua Judía, en su propio Cuerpo y Sangre, y esto es un gran regalo, no para extraños, sólo para sus queridos amigos que lo acompañaron en su temprano ministerio.

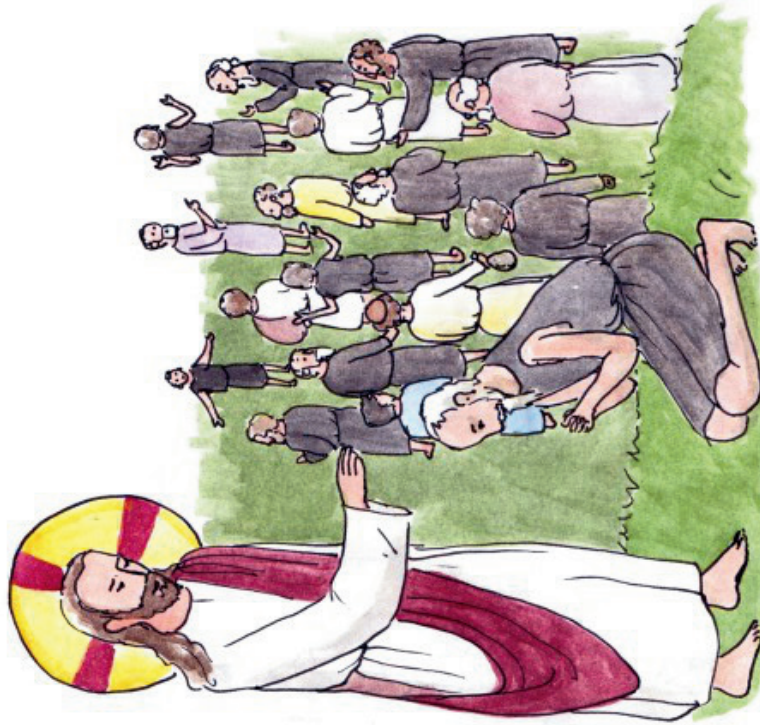

“Ignatius lived from around A.D. 35 to 107. He was the third bishop of Antioch and tradition records that he was a disciple of the apostle John (cf. The Martyrdom of Ignatius). During the reign of Emperor Trajan, he was taken to Rome and suffered martyrdom there. Along the way he wrote seven letters—one to St. Polycarp of Smyrna, and six others to various churches.

On the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that the Eucharist is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ (1374). In his Letter to the Smyrnaeans, Ignatius addresses the issue of those who do not believe as the Church does:

‘Take note of those who hold heterodox opinions on the grace of Jesus Christ which has come to us, and see how contrary their opinions are to the mind of God... They abstain from the Eucharist and from prayer, because they do not confess that the Eucharist is the Flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ, Flesh which suffered for our sins and which the Father, in his goodness, raised up again. They who deny the gift of God are perishing in their disputes.’ —Letter to the Smyrnaeans, Ch 6

Here Ignatius equates the Eucharist to the same flesh of Christ that suffered for our sake on the cross. Jesus also uses this literal comparison when he explained, “I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh” (John 6:51).

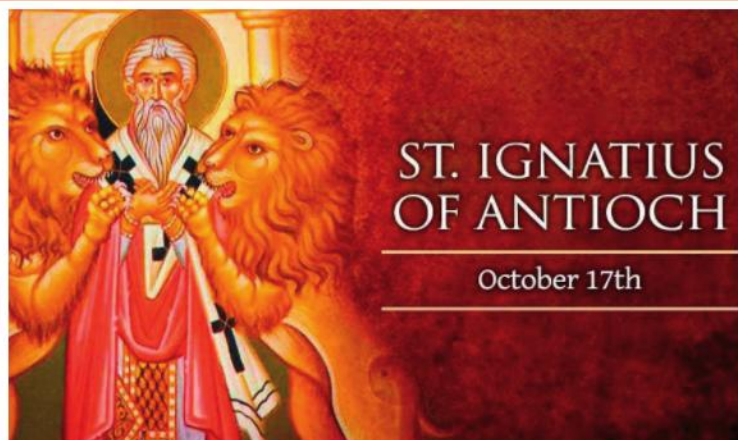
Ignatius also explains that the Eucharist must be administered either by a bishop or one of his ordained ministers:

‘Let that be deemed a proper Eucharist, which is administered either by the bishop, or by one to whom he has entrusted it.’ —Letter to the Smyrnaeans, Ch 8

On the Authority of the Catholic Church

The Greek root of the term catholic means “according to the whole” or “universal.” Ignatius uses the term to refer to the visible and authoritative Church:

‘See that you all follow the bishop, even as Jesus Christ does the Father, and the presbytery as you would the apostles; and reverence the deacons, as being the institution of God. Let no man do anything connected with the Church without the bishop. Let that be deemed a proper Eucharist, which is administered either by the bishop, or by one to whom he has entrusted it. Wherever the bishop shall appear, there let the multitude of the people also be; even as wherever Jesus Christ is, there is the Catholic Church.’ —Letter to the Smyrnaeans, Ch 8




Ignatius urges the faithful to submit to the authority of their bishop because it is the will of God:

‘But inasmuch as love suffers me not to be silent in regard to you, I have therefore taken upon me first to exhort you that you would all run together in accordance with the will of God. For even Jesus Christ, our inseparable life, is the manifested will of the Father; as also bishops, settled everywhere to the utmost bounds of the earth, are so by the will of Jesus Christ... Let us be careful, then, not to set ourselves in opposition to the bishop, in order that we may be subject to God.’

—Letter to the Ephesians, Ch 3,5

Ignatius recognizes the authority, or “presidency,” in particular of the Church at Rome:

‘To the Church that has found mercy in the greatness of the Most High Father and in Jesus Christ, his only son; to the Church beloved and enlightened after the love of Jesus Christ, our God, by the will of him that has willed everything which is; to the Church which also holds the presidency in the place of the country of the Romans, worthy of God, worthy of honor, worthy of blessing, worthy of praise, worthy of success, worthy of sanctification, and because you hold the presidency of love, named after Christ and named after the Father; here therefore do I salute in the name of Jesus Christ, the Son of the Father.’ —Letter to the Romans, Intro”
