# A note from Fr. Sengole

John the Baptist is an important person in the New Testament. He has a unique character marked by his miraculous birth. Elizabeth, his mother, conceived him when she was advanced in age. When Mary, his aunt, visited his house, John the Baptist leapt in joy at hearing Mary's voice. An infant leaping in joy at hearing a person's voice indicates that he knew the place and importance of Mary, the Mother of God.

John is both a prophet and a precursor (2 Kg 1:8, Zech 13:4-5). Unlike the Old Testament prophets, John not only speaks for God, but he also prepares for the Messiah whom no prophets were privileged to see and witness in person. Even the prophets had fore-told of him. Isaiah spoke of a precursor, "A voice of one crying out in the desert, prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths" (Is 40). John lived a life of simplicity which required him to have an enormous amount of faith and trust in God. His dress was made of camel's hair. He ate and survived on locusts and wild honey. His message was two-fold to those who came to be baptized, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" In other words, "Prepare your lives to receive God's Kingdom and to acknowledge Jesus as King who will be the One to usher in this Kingdom upon the earth." Like John, Jesus also called on everyone to "repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Mt 4:17).

Fr. Raniero Cantalamessa, the papal preacher, talks about this message of John and Jesus. Fr. Cantalamessa (who has many spiritual writings that we should read) unpacks the meaning of a seemingly same message of repentance. What difference could there be of this message preached by two people? As I paraphrase, Fr. Cantalamessa says that for John it is, "repent and change your life, so that you may receive Jesus and his offer of mercy." For Jesus, it is, "repent and change your life, because you have already received mercy." It simply means that God is powerfully and mercifully intervening in our lives. This new intervention in our lives through Jesus was necessary to revert to God's original plan, thwarted by original sin. There must be a response from us to such powerful intervention of God. This response is repentance marked by good fruit.

I have always tried to see my life as a response to God's mercy. We all have received God's bountiful mercy and grace. There is a radical difference between people who have not been baptized and those who have. We are called to live a life in Christ and in his Spirit, true to the call of being Christians. During Advent, we prepare ourselves to worthily celebrate Christ's birth. True preparation lies in our internal and spiritual purification in such a way that our life shows the signs of being touched by grace for which Jesus came down from Heaven!

# Altar Servers Needed



Y algunos más! Cada vez que leo la historia de algún santo, meemocionodeverlaextraordinaria vida que vivieron. Lospóstoles eran muy diferentes de su vida anterior, incluso durante su tiempo con Jesús. Muy cierto lo que leemos en Hechos 1:8, " Pero recibirás poder, cuando haya venido sobre tí el Espíritu Santo, y serás mi testigo en Jerusalén, oda Judea, en Samaria, y hasta lo ultimo de la tierra'. The Church celebrates a mysterious and miraculous event of such importance to God's plan for our salvation in Christ that it happened in a manner that went virtually undetected.

This event is the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Not to be confused with another mysterious and miraculous event, the virgin birth of the Lord Jesus, the Immaculate Conception is about how God acted in an extraordinary way in the life of the Blessed Virgin Mary, so that from even the first moment of her own conception, she was rescued from the power of original sin. (For this year, this feast is abrogated as it falls on a Sunday. Nevertheless, it is good to remind us of the truth of this feast).

# What does this event mean?

Original sin is a fact of our existence, a sad fact, that characterizes the human condition. It darkens our intellect, distorts our imagination, and positions our will so as to be susceptible to sin. We are born this way and cannot of our own efforts remedy this situation. Because of original sin, the inclination towards sin is a part of who we are from the very beginning- from the first moment of our own conception. This inclination towards sin effects us physically, emotionally, psychologically, intellectually. For this reason, original sin is referred to as a condition of human existence.

Sin is our refusal of God and our refusals of God, are manifested in the ease at which we prove ourselves to be unwilling to love. It is in our refusals to love that we see the great indicator of original sin as an oppressive and terrible condition. God has a plan through which he deals with original sin. This plan unfolds in the scriptures and culminates in the revelation of Christ the Lord. When we speak of Christ "saving us" or refer to Christ as our redeemer, what he is saving us from and delivering us from is original sin and its effects.

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is part of God's plan. Christ, who receives his human flesh from his mother, receives this flesh from a person who, by a singular gift from God, herself comes into this world without original sin.

This exemption is God's gift to the woman who would freely choose to be his mother. The gift highlights the extraordinary nature of the mission of the Mother of God- no one would even have the relationship God in Christ has to the Blessed Virgin Mary. No one will ever be the Mother of God except the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Some might be inclined to think that something like the Immaculate Conception made things much easier for the Mother of God, and in this regard, I think such folks would be mistaken. The Immaculate Conception was not a kind of decorative accessory, but a reality that would be essential for the Mother of God to fulfill her mission. It would express itself in a capacity to love that would have far exceeded our own. And this would not have made things easy.

The Mother of God was an Immaculate Conception in a sin-filled world. Those whom she loved suffered from the effects of original sin and her exemption would not have made her cold and aloof, but would have quickened her to life with a deep compassion that would have cut into her heart.

She would have been to this world a sign of contradiction, a stranger, someone who would have always been on the peripheries, deeply in love, but beset with grief at how much God's love is refused in a fallen world.

Whatever we feel at the effects of the world's refusal to love, would have been intensified for Christ's mother. She would know, better than us, humanity's desperate need for a Savior and the consequences of our refusals of God would have been overwhelming, if not for the grace that she received in her relationship with her Divine Son.

The Immaculate Conception does not mean that Christ's Mother did not need a Savior or that she somehow saved herself. In fact, it means the opposite. Christ saved her in an extraordinary way and gave her a holiness that she did not achieve for herself. He did this for her, for the sake of her mission- a mission that only she would bear. This gift of holiness is what the Immaculate Conception is all about.

The Immaculate Conception is not something easy, it is mysterious and miraculous, but is nevertheless a beautiful and extraordinary gift – a gift through which God in Christ acted to save his Mother, and us from our sins, from all our refusals to love.




