Renewal or resolution?


Each New Year reminds us of a resolution or resolutions that might interested us. Whether or not we commit to our resolutions, it is almost likely that we even forget them. I read a funny cartoon caption some years ago that goes like this: “My new year’s resolution is to stop hanging with people who ask me about my New Year’s resolution.” With resolutions we want to start something new or stop something that might be an old habit. Mark Twain’s quote on smoking is too funny to be true: “Quitting smoking is easy, I have done it hundreds of times!”

Well, I am not thinking about resolutions. But a more pressing urgency seems to loom large in my head regarding another commitment — renewal. For us Catholics, this word renewal is very important, especially at the dawn of the New Year. How can we imagine a life of renewal? First of all, to my understanding, renewal begins with rediscovery. Renewal means we go back to our sources; going backward in order to move forward. There is a word that has become famous since the Second Vatican Council – *ressourcement*. It is a French word that simply means looking to the past for norms or practices or mind-sets to be used in changing, or correcting or at least qualifying the direction things are moving in the present.

What are our sources that may help us to be better disciples of Jesus? What renewal should we be thinking about in 2020 both as a parish and as individuals? Renewal is primarily the work of God. It is the Spirit of Christ that can bring the renewal in our lives. Why renewal? It is renewal for the sake of something. We want to be renewed from within for the sake of the Gospel; renewal for the sake of being a missionary disciple. In order that God’s work of renewal may take place in our lives, we must find ourselves returning to our sources wherever they are found — Scripture, Liturgy (Holy Mass), the living Tradition of the Church all the way from the Apostles and the Fathers, a robust Catholic Theology, the Saints, etc.

We can be part of our children’s renewal as well. We should accompany them to truth and love in Christ by taking them to the Holy Mass and helping them read the Bible and study the Saints. It is important that we introduce them to new ways of praying. It is important that we talk about current trends in the world that mislead them in various ways. I recently heard from a parent that he wanted to address a particular topic that was bothering his child and was able to have a fruitful dialogue that was transforming. Renewal is entirely the work of the Spirit of God, we just to find ourselves at the right place!



ANUNCIOS PARA LA COMUNIDAD LATINA

Mensaje por el Padre Sengole Gnanaraj

Una ocasión le pregunté al Padre Berchmans, un sacerdote retirado de la Diócesis a la que pertenecía mi casa, “¿Padre, qué es lo que hace estos días, ahora que está ya retirado?” Él contestó, “Estoy trabajando en mi Ph.D.” Literalmente creí que él estaba trabajando en algún ensayo como requerimiento para obtener un grado de doctorado. El cargado muy fuerte y dijo, “¡Yo dije que estoy trabajando en la preparación para mi Santa Muerte, Ph.D = Preparation for my Holy Death!” Noviembre es el mes en que se conmemora a la muerte. En el Día de Todos Santos se ofrecieron tres misas por los fieles difuntos. Es una buena práctica el atender las tres misas y visitar el panteón. En el entendimiento teológico de la vida humana, tomamos en consideración cada aspecto de nuestra vida. Nacemos, crecemos, y morimos. Inmediatamente después de nacer, son bautizados nuestros infantes. El Bautismo marca el momento más importante de la vida Cristiana. En el Bautismo, nosotros morimos con Cristo. Al participar en la muerte que redimió, reclamó y restauró la dignidad original. Nosotros crecemos con Cristo y comenzamos una vida nueva, la cual es orientada hacia la vida eterna. Toda nuestra vida es una respuesta a la Misericordia que nos apropiamos para nuestras vidas en el bautismo. Toda nuestra vida, es una vida de conversión que está marcada por etapas que son purgatorias, iluminativas y unitivas. Así es como vemos el progreso espiritual Cristiano. También creemos que nuestra real y natural muerte es un momento definitivo. En nuestra muerte Dios nos llama a sí mismo. Pero, nuestra forma de reunirnos con nuestro amado Creador Dios, es el mismo camino para encontrar a Jesucristo quien sufrió y murió en la Cruz. La entrada de Jesús al cielo, en su cuerpo glorificado es también nuestro patron a seguir. ¡No tenemos una ruta diferente!

Esto es el porqué vemos todo nuestro sufrimiento - sufrimientos que son a cuenta y por virtud de nuestro bautismo por el bien del amor, y es redentor.

¿Sufro por mi fé y mi amor? Juan de la Cruz dice, “En el ocaso de la vida, Dios no nos juzgará por la posesiones terrenales o los logros humanos, pero lo hará en la medida de qué tan bien hemos amado”. Otra vez, amor no es algo que nos hace sentir bien y cómodos. El verdadero amor nos hace hijos de Dios. Amor y verdad siempre van juntos. Nosotros amamos en el sentido verdadero de la palabra. Jesús nos ama a todos. Su amor fue la forma más pura de amor.

El tuvo compasión y misericordia por mucha gente. Y sin embargo, sólo tenía unas pocas personas para amarlo y aceptar su mensaje. La muerte de Jesús fue la muerte más decisiva para la humanidad entera. Su muerte no sólo transformó nuestras vidas, también nuestra muerte natural. Nuestra muerte se ha vuelto significativa. Nuestra muerte no es más un evento de penumbra y perdición. Tenemos esperanza, la esperanza nos lleva a un punto más allá de nuestra muerte natural. Por ésta razón, uno de los misterios centrales de la vida Cristiana es la muerte. Celebramos el nacimiento en cada uno de nosotros. Lamentamos la muerte de nuestros seres queridos. Pero mucho más allá de eso, nosotros rezamos por aquéllos que se fueron antes que nosotros, porque tal es nuestra esperanza.

Todos necesitamos la sanación misericordiosa de Dios, ambos, los vivos y los muertos. Ojalá el mes de Noviembre haya sido un tiempo de renovación y esperanza.



Children as young as five and adults of all ages will enjoy the colorful, engaging film. The film features eleven different stories that introduce children to this humble priest's spirituality and ministry. Each segment features a child who tells a fascinating and true story about Blessed Solanus. As the story unfolds, another child colors a large drawing that is eventually revealed to be a colorful illustration of the segment.

The film was written and produced by veteran Michigan filmmakers Dr. Stan and Pam Williams under

their SWC Films banner and was directed principally by Kelly Nieto, the creator of *The Cross and the Light* stage musical. The original orchestral score was created by Royal Oak, Michigan composer James Stonehouse. Famed Catholic illustrator and graphic novel artist, Sean Lam, created the drawings.

Although ordained a priest, Bl. Solanus Casey never received permission to hear confessions or preach a sermon. He celebrated the Eucharist each day and carried on his apostolic work not in a pulpit or confessional, but in a tiny office. He was the friary door-keeper whom people by the thousands visited, seeking counsel and spiritual guidance. Bl. Solanus spent his life in the service of people. He was always ready to listen to anyone at any time, day or night. He faithfully served the people by providing soup for the hungry, kind words for the troubled, and a healing touch for the ill. Because of his holiness, St. John Paul II declared him Venerable in 1995. In May 2017, Pope Francis announced that Fr. Solanus would be Beatified. Venerable Solanus was elevated to Blessed November 18 at Ford Field, Detroit, witnessed by 60,000.






