





Salutation: 1 Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus, To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are in Philippi, with the bishops and deacons: 2 Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Paul's Prayer: I thank my God every time I remember you, 4 constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, 5 because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. 6 I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. 7 It is right for me to think

this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. 8 For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. 9 And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight 10 to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, 11 having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Week 1 Reflection: Philippians 1:1-11

During this quarantine season, many of you may feel like you are experiencing house arrest and are beginning to feel more and more anxious to get out of the house. I know I am! Take courage, because even St. Paul likely felt the way you do. It is estimated that he may have spent over 5 years of his ministry either in prison or under house arrest by the Romans.

When Paul wrote this little letter to the Christians residing in the city of Philippi (Macedonia, Greece), Paul was in prison and chains for preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ. However, Paul never sounds discouraged in this letter. Instead, he sounds joyful, and the book of Philippians is considered to be one of Paul's most encouraging and optimistic letters. How is this possible?

Paul writes, *"My imprisonment is for Christ; and most of the brothers and sisters (Christians), having been made confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, dare to speak the word with greater boldness and without fear"* (Phil 1:13-14).

St. Paul has a purpose-driven life, and he can see God's plan working through his suffering. Just as Christ's suffering won salvation for the world, Paul's suffering is expanding the message of this salvation into the world. Without evangelism and sharing our faith, how will people know of the grace won for them on the cross? This grand design by God to work through Paul gives him great internal peace and joy even when his external circumstances are out of his control.

The introduction of this letter also sounds very Catholic. We hear words such as 'saints' and 'bishops' as well as 'grace.' This letter gives evidence that St. Paul set up churches in every city with structure and apostolic authority. The city of Philippi no longer exists, but we do know that there were Catholic bishops overseeing this diocese for the first 1,500 years of Church history. As Catholic Christians, we know that our bishops are given to us by God in order to guide us in good times and bad.

St. Paul also calls every Christian at Philippi with the title of saint! The word 'saint' simply means 'holy one.' In Sacred Scripture, God's people are called 'holy' because of our baptism and participation in the divine life of God in the sacraments. He made us holy at baptism and his making us holy through the graces offered through Holy Mother Church. However, we know this process of becoming holy (sanctification) is not complete until we arrive to heaven. This is why we reserve the title 'Saint' with a capital 'S' for those who have crossed the finish line of this life and were faithful to the end (like St. Paul)!

3. **How focused are you in becoming holy or the best version of yourself? Do people notice a difference in you? *Rate your desire to become a saint from 1 to 10.**

INTRODUCTION

St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians may be short, but it packs a powerful punch. Many may already be familiar with its popular verses such as "Rejoice in the Lord always" (Philippians 4:4) and "I can do all things in him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). But other treasures of this epistle include the model it provides for working together in partnership to advance the Gospel, the beautiful relationship of mutual love that unites Paul and the church in Philippi, and Paul's great hymn to Christ in Philippians 2:6–11. This first session begins by looking at the town of Philippi, its first converts, and Paul's opening words to them in his epistle.




