

As we prepare to reopen churches for the Celebration of Public Masses here at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish, please be aware of the following:

Be prepared for an "unusual way of celebrating Mass" [beginning May 20, 2020]. We are not back to "normal church." There may be strange protocols that you are not used to, but they are there for your safety. It will be a time of patient learning with trial and error. Be prepared for reading signs everywhere for safety measures – they are posted for you to see.

- No Catholic in the Archdiocese of Indianapolis is required to come to Mass at all during this time. The Sunday obligation remains lifted until August 15.
- Everyone should recognize that there is an inherent risk in coming to church. As such, those who are 65 and over, and those with high-risk health conditions should remain at home. This is the population that is most vulnerable to the coronavirus. Of course, those who are symptomatic or have tested positive for COVID-19 must not enter a church until released to do so by their health care professional.

The point is, do not feel guilty if you choose to not attend Mass. If you are sick, do NOT come to church. Otherwise, the decision is yours to make. Please know we are still fighting the same COVID-19 virus, and it still poses threats to many people in a larger gathering like our church congregation. As responsible citizens with Christian charity, we will follow national guidelines, Gov. Holcomb's plan, and the protocols set forth by Archbishop Thompson to minimize all risks as much as possible – minimize – not eradicate!!

Safety measures that are strictly implemented at our parish churches:

- To ensure a safe distance, we will occupy only 25-30% church capacity.
- Pews are marked for seating; all movements inside the church are guided by markers. Follow directions offered by volunteers as well.
- Masks are very strongly encouraged, and if you do not have one, please ask the volunteers.
- Hand-holding, Sign of Peace, distribution of the Precious Blood, and Holy Water font, loud speaking, singing, and loud reciting are to be avoided.
- Communion will take place at the close of Mass. This is not ideal and will be strange for many of us, but we do this to avoid congested areas and to ensure safe distance. We will enter the Church at one point and exit the Church. No movements are permitted within the church.
- Most important: There are people committed to cleaning and disinfecting the church. Please help them by following all safety guidelines.

Here is more important information:

- Try your best to attend Mass once per week; Tuesday through Sunday.
- If you attend the weekend Mass don't worry about attending weekday Mass, because the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains lifted until August 15, 2020 in the Archdiocese.

Do not go to another parish for Mass. Archbishop Thompson has asked all parishioners to attend their own parish for the sake of registration and safety. Again, we are not back to "normal church." Please do not socialize!

Here are our assumptions for everyone who is at Mass:

- You are healthy and not experiencing any symptoms. You are not sick.
- You have registered for Mass on Google Forms.
- You are aware that 65 and older are "not excluded" but are asked to remain home for reasons of vulnerability.
- You will be wearing masks and follow directions offered by our special team.
- You will not congregate before, after, and during Mass.
- You are aware that the distribution of communion outside Mass is suspended and that You will receive communion in your hands at Mass as you leave the church.

During Mass:

- All liturgical ministries such as Lector, ministers of holy communion, altar servers, and homebound communion are suspended. For the next couple of weeks, we will be using a special schedule of ministers.
- The procession, recession, distribution of communion at the regular time, exchange of peace are suspended. Singing and reciting is to be done in a low tone.
- Collection baskets are kept at the back of church please use them for your contribution.
- The Wednesday noon Mass and Sunday 10 am Mass will, as usual, be live-streamed.

Funerals & Weddings [Beginning May 19, 2020]:

- Funeral Masses will resume with only close family members not exceeding 60 people. The Funeral meal ministry is suspended.
- Wedding Masses will resume, again with only close family members not exceeding 60 people, including musicians and photographers.

Private Prayer & Confessions: Tue & Fri [Beginning May 15, 2020]:

Although we have opened Holy Family for an hour of adoration between 6-7 pm – do not feel compelled to spend one full hour. Please consider spending a shorter time in order to allow more people to join. It is your responsibility to disinfect the place you occupy for the safety of those parishioners entering the church after you. As you stand to wait for confessions, do not stand close to each other. Those waiting in line should be no more than three. Be prepared for a 6 feet distance from Fr. Sengole. Use a face mask. Use disinfectant sprays to clean your chair/kneeler as you leave after confession.



Frequently Asked Questions During church reopening

1. None of the Wayne County health protocols apply to me, but I am 65 and above, can I come to attend Mass, at least weekdays? If 65 or above, you are encouraged to stay home. This is in no way discriminatory but a careful parameter based on vulnerability.

2. Where Can I find the Governor's protocol for church reopening for worship?

3. Can I take communion to my Mother/Father elderly persons in my family?

Not at this time. Please read above clarifications for health risks.

4. I have difficulty wearing masks or breathing with mask on - can I be exempted?

Wearing a mask is not mandatory/compulsory. You are, however, encouraged to wear a face mask out of Christian charity for your fellow worshippers.

5. I am 65 years old but healthy and doing well, am I required to

No. No one in the Archdiocese is required or obligated to attend Mass at least until August 15, 2020.

6. I am 65 or older, but registered for Mass at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parish website. Would I still be able to attend Mass?

Please know that those parishioners 65 or older are asked to stay at home purely for reasons that we care about you as we do not know yet of the nature of the Corona virus as to how it spreads. No one in the Archdiocese is obligated or required to attend Mass. Any crowd or congregation may possess an inherent risk to all who are part of it. Moreover, there is such a thing as "vulnerability" and it is in many and varied forms of health conditions. The only safeguard measure is to avoid being in a crowd. We are not back to normal church functioning. We are still fighting the same Corona virus which caused us to shut down and is still spreading.

7. How should I sign up for being a volunteer on the monitoring teams for Mass?

8. If people 65 and older are ill advised to come to Church, why are other groups attending?

Please note that no one is excluded from Mass nor is anyone obligated during this time to attend Mass, at least until August 15, 2020. At the same time, we cannot be a Church with a prolonged absence of people to celebrate Mass. There is this fine line between who could be vulnerable and who could not be considered vulnerable, given many factors such as age, underlying conditions, pre-existing conditions, prolonged presence in a crowd/congregation etc. For more information please visit COVID19 dashboard of Indiana: https://

9. Can children attend Mass? Should they wear face mask?

Yes. Children under 3 years old, if uncomfortable, need not wear a mask.

9. I have not been to confession in a long time, but I am elderly and want to go to private prayer and make a confession at Holy Family?

You are welcome to attend the private prayer. In order to make a good decision, please call Fr. Sengole by reaching the Catholic Office of SEAS parish: 765-962-3902.

10. How can I help during this time in terms of cleaning/providing face masks?

Contact the parish office. We need help in cleaning and sanitizing our churches during this time. Also, we need help in forming teams that monitors crowd and navigates movements of people before and after Mass.

12. I am a health professional/doctor/nurse and working in hospital or hospice care; I may have worked in a COVID19 area, can I still attend Mass?

Follow your institutional guidelines; if asked to quarantine or tested positive, you must remain home.

13. Now that Churches are open can I choose to remain home even if I feel healthy and I am under 65 years

Yes. The lifting of obligation to attend Mass is extended to August 15, 2020

14. When attending Mass, I do not want to receive communion, can I choose to not receive communion?

Yes. You may choose to not receive communion; you need not come to receive blessings from ministers as well.

15. Can I choose to go to another parish for Mass?

No. Since all parishes are working on their own protocols keeping in mind the number of registered parishioners in their parish, it is strongly advised not to go to another parish during this time. Some parishes may decline your online registration for Mass. Also, Archdiocese of Indianapolis has stipulated that parishioners should attend only their home parish Mass.

16. I cannot commit to the same schedule for each week that I registered online. Can I switch between Masses?

No. Please know that this is not a normal Church schedule. We have worked on this tentative/temporary schedule, keeping in mind all safety and social distance precautions. During this time, a lot of sacrifice is needed. If you cannot attend Mass, you need not feel guilty as the obligation to not attend is extended to August 15, 2020. Consider attending weekday Mass instead of weekend Mass.

17. What is the number of people that can attend a Funeral Mass or a Wedding Mass?

For the safety of all, we would like to keep to 50 people, including musicians and photographers; following all safedistance policies.

Anuncio general sobre la reapertura de la Iglesia para misa y

Mientras nos preparamos para reabrir Iglesias para la celebración de misas públicas aquí en la parroquia de St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, tengan en cuenta lo siguiente:

*Preparénse para una "forma inusual de celebrar la misa" (comenzando el 20 de Mayo del 2020). No regresaremos a la "iglesia normal". Habrá protocolos extraños a los que no estás acostumbrado, pero están ahí para tú seguridad y la de todos. Serán tiempos de aprendizaje con paciencia, pues estaremos trabajando a prueba y error. Prepárate para leer los señalamientos que habrá por todas partes indicando las medidas de seguridad, estarán a tu alcance para que los sigas.

*Ningún católico en la Arquidiócesis de Indianápolis está obligado a asistir a misa en este período de tiempo. La obligación de asistir a misa los domingos regresará el 15 ded Agosto del 2020.

*Todos debemos reconocer que existe un riesgo inherente al venir a la iglesia, como tal, aquéllas personas mayores de 65 años, o con condiciones de salud precarias, deberán permanecer en sus hogares, ya que ésta es la población más vulnerable al coronavirus. Por supuesto, las personas que son asíntomáticos o han dado positivo por COVID-19 no deben ingresar a la iglesia hasta que un profesional de la salud basado en la atención médica, les dé permiso para hacerlo.

*El punto es que no te debes sentir culpable al no poder asistir a misa. Si estás enfermo, NO vengas a la iglesia. Pero si estás sano, la decisión de venir a la iglesia es tuya.

Tenga en cuenta que todavía estamos luchando contra en mismo virus COVID-19, y aún es una amenaza para muchas personas, sobre todo en reuniones con mucha gente como lo es la misa en la iglesia. Como ciudadanos responsables con Caridad Cristiana, seguiremos las reglas nacionales, el plan del gobernador Holcomb y los protocolos establecidos por el arzobispo Thompson para minimizar los riesgos lo más posible. ¡Minimizar, no erradicar!

Las siguientes medidas de seguridad se implementan estrictamente en nuestras Iglesias parroquiales:

- 1 Para garantizar la distancia segura, sólo ocuparemos entre el 25-30% de la capacidad de la iglesia.
- 2 El lugar para sentarse en las bancas está marcado, así como todo el flujo por el cual deberemos movernos dentro de la iglesia. Siga las insgtrucciones que los voluntarios le indiquen.
- 3 Se pide el uso obligatorio de cubre-bocas, si no cuenta con uno, pregunte a los voluntarios.
- 4 Deben evitarse las manos, el signo de la paz, la distribución de la Preciosa Sangre de Cristo, agua bendita, hablar en voz alta, cantar o recitar en voz alta.
- 5 La comunión será al final de la misa. Esto no es ideal y será extraño para muchos de nosotros, pero se hace para evitar congestionamientos y garantizar la distancia segura. Entraremos a la iglesia por un punto en específico y no se permiten movimientos dentro de la iglesia. Evite usar el baño.
- 6 Lo más importante: Hay personas comprometidas con la limpieza y desinfección de la iglesia, ayúdelos siguiendo las reglas de seguridad.

Esta información también es muy importante:

1 Haz tu major esfuerzo para asistir a alguna de las misas una vez por semana, martes a domingo.

- 2 Si asistes a misa el fin de semana, no estás obligado a asistir a misa de lunes a viernes, la obligación de atender misa dominical vuelve a entrar en vigor el 15 de Agosto del 2020 en la Arquidiócesis.
- 3 No vaya a otra parroquia para misa. El arzobispo Thompson ha pedido a todos los feligreses que asistan a su parroquia por el bien y seguridad de todos. No hemos vuelto a la "iglesia normal". ¡Por favor no socialice!

Si estás asistiendo a misa es porque cumples con lo siguiente:

- 1 Estás sano y no tienes ningún síntoma. NO estás enfermo.
- 2 Te has registrado para misa en los formularios de Google.
- 3 Usted sabe que las personas que tienen 65 años o más "no están excluídos", pero se les pide permanecer en su casa por razones de vulnerabilidad.
- 4 Llevará cubre-bocas y seguirá las instrucciones que le indique el equipo de seguridad.
- 5 No te reunirás antes, durante o después de la misa.
- 6 Usted está consciente de que la distribución de la comunión fuera de la misa está suspendida y que recibirá la comunión en sus manos cuando salga de la iglesia.

Durante la misa:

- 1 Todos los ministerios litúrgicos como lector, ministro de la Sagrada Comunión, monaguillos y comunión, están suspendidos.
- 2 La procesion, la recesión, la distribución de la comunión en el horario habitual y el intercambio de paz, se suspenden. cantar y recitar se deben hacer en un tono bajo.
- 3 Las canastas de recolección estarán en la parte de atrás de la iglesia, úselos para depositar su diezmo.
- 4 La misa del miércoles al mediodía, así como la misa del domingo a las 10 am, se transmitirán en vivo.

Funerales y bodas (a partir del 19 de Mayo del 2020):

- 1 Las misas fúnebres se realizarán sólo con familiares cercanos sin que excedan 60 personas. Se suspende el ministerio de comidas funerarias.
- 2 Las misas de boda se reanudarán, sólo familiares cercanos atenderán y sin exceder de 60 personas, incluyendo músicos y fotógrafos.

Oración privada y confesiones: Martes y Viernes (a partir del 15 de Mayo del 2020).

- 1 Aunque abrimos la iglesia de la Sagrada Familia para una hora de adoración de las 6:00-7:00 pm, no se sienta obligado a pasar la hora completa, considere un tiempo más corto para permitir que más personas entren a orar. Es su responsabilidad desinfectar el lugar que ocupa, para la seguridad de los otros feligreses que ingresen a la iglesia después de usted.
- 2 Mientras espere confesiones, no se pare cerca de la otra persona. Los que esperen en fila, no deberán exceder de 3. Haga una distancia de 3 pies de separación del Padre Sengole y use todo el tiempo su cubre- bocas. Utilice aerosoles desinfectantes para limpiar su silla y rodillera cuando se vaya después de la confesión. Gracias.



Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for God is at work in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

Do all things without grumbling or questioning, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world...

I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of

knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as refuse, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own, based on law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith; that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, that if possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

(Phil 2:12-15; 3:8-11)

Week 5 Reflection: Philippians 2:12-3:14

Another theme of this little letter to the Church in Philippi is the Greek word, 'Kenosis,' which means self-emptying or pouring out. St. Paul uses this word in verse 7; Jesus 'emptied himself' as he came down from heaven to become man. Now, we should say that Jesus did not empty himself of His divinity. We believe He was fully God and fully man. Instead, Jesus empties Himself of His divine privileges to become like one of us. The Son of God became a son of man who came to serve instead of be served (Matthew 20:28). Jesus became the lowest servant or rather 'the Servant of servants' in order to bring salvation to the world!

In this next section, St. Paul applies the principle of kenosis to himself. Paul sees his own sufferings as a sharing in Christ's sufferings. His imprisonment empties himself of all of his ordinary privileges, but that is okay with him, because it magnifies the glory of Christ and leads to the salvation of others.

Like our Lord, we are also called to empty ourselves and offer up our lives to God and to others with sacrificial (Agape) love. Kenosis is how the Christian life is to be lived. We are to look to the interests of others before our own. Kenosis, however, does not leave us empty handed in the end. Just like Christ's death led to His resurrection and exaltation, our kenosis will lead to resurrection and glorification. If we are faithful and "work out our own salvation with fear and trembling," He will raise our souls to be with Him at death and will raise our very bodies to reign with Him at His Second Coming. This is a mysterious and glorious reality! In conclusion, we must empty ourselves of our own plans and privileges in order to make room for God's better plan for our lives.

Reflection Question:

- 1). How can God use your suffering to bring others closer to Him? What are opportunities for you to unite your suffering with the suffering of Christ?
- 2). How well are you practicing the principle of Kenosis in your own life? Rate yourself from 1-10
- 3). Read verse 2:14; How can you replace complaining and grumbling with praying & praising? What are some practical ways you can encourage others today?



Frequently Asked Questions Continued

- 18. What safety measures should I be taking when I am in the Church?
- Please avoid hand-shake, exchange of peace, hugging, and loud speaking without a mask.
- Please maintain a six-foot minimum social distance between individuals not from your immediate household at all times.
- As always, when we are in the presence of the Lord as in any Catholic church, there must be attitudes of prayer, adoration and silence to honor the Lord's presence. This also helps those who might be praying.
- Do not congregate for socializing before and after Church, even is it is outside the Church.
- Follow the tape markers and instructions offered by our special teams.
- You need not sing hymns, if you want to please do so quietly. Say all prayers quietly.

SCRIP

SCRIP physical cards can now be ordered online for pick up at the church office on Fridays. There are a few items that need to observed:

- Orders must be entered ONLINE by Sunday evening 10pm, to be delivered the same week.
- Any orders entered after that time will be delivered the following week.
- Example: Order entered by May 17 will be available for p/u Friday May 22. Order entered May 18 will be available May 29.
- Orders will be available for pick on Fridays at the church office.
- Church office hours are 8:30-4pm
- All orders must be PRE-PAID with either PrestoPay or credit card.
- NO local cards (Galo's, Old Richmond Inn, Bagel Shop, etc) due to the variability of restaurant availability
- There will be no Mass order forms again due to social distancing and order timing.
