“Reform thyself”

Fr. John Vianney (1786-1859), a humble priest who was assigned to the backwaters of southeastern, post-revolutionary France, still remains and reveals things perennial about priesthood and priestly ministry. It is amazing to think that St. Pope John XIII even wrote an Encyclical letter on St. John Vianney, recommending him as a model for diocesan priests.

John Vianney offers a fundamental blueprint for a pastoral plan for any place and time. The cultural landscape of his time is important to know in order to know the basic contours of his pastoral plan. It was a time of unparalleled cultural and political upheaval in France. The Revolution and subsequent terror, the hardship under Napoleonic rule, the widespread devastation of churches, religious communities and practices and the outright attack on the Church in France. The onslaught of secularism which was a result of the Revolution had already taken strong roots. Secularism had permeated much of French society, even to the farthest villages. God and Church were relegated more and more to the margins of French life. It was a time when even the clergy were forced to take an oath to the State against the Church. The faithful were scandalized when priests succumbed to the pressure. Fr. Saunier, the pastor of Ars, took the oath to the State in 1791; the very next year the parish church was looted and Fr. Saunier left priesthood. The church became a club for “free-thinkers” – a strange time when people had settled into mediocrity and had allowed themselves to drift into lukewarm waters of faith! It was a time of “priest shortage” as well – if we want to use an interesting phrase!

The pastoral landscape was marked by these strong contours. There was a tremendous religious ignorance and indifference, as an effect of Revolution. People frequently missed Sunday Mass. Work dominated the lives of most. In that tiny little village of Ars, there were four taverns; people engaged in festivities and drinking, lasting far into the night ending in evils. Religion was methodically replaced by reason; yet there was saturating illiteracy. Religion was simply ignored. In the context of the new evangelization, Fr. John realized soon enough that Christendom no longer made sense and much less there was a huge support of a culture for Christian values, at least in his parish.

Into such a landscape of faith and culture, Fr. Vianney arrived. He gave the people of Ars something they had never imagined! We can identify eight themes that characterize Fr. Vianney’s spirituality: 1. Conversion of his own life as a priest, 2. Manifesting an approachable and available demeanor, 3. Prayer and ascetical living, 4. Channeling initial energy into those families already faithful; 5. Giving special attention to the liturgy, preaching and catechesis; 6. Addressing problems at their roots and not in their symptoms; 7. Planting good habits of prayer and the works of mercy; and 8. Doing it all with a strong priestly identity.

It will be challenging to do what Fr. Vianney did in the first place - “Reform thyself! For Fr. Vianney, pastoral ministry meant, “if you want to sanctify others, begin with yourself.” The conversion of Ars began with Fr. Vianney’s own conversion. He was by no means a priest by profession – telling people, “Folks, here is your salvation; but not for me!” He

did not arrive at Ars as a saint – he became one by simply being a “priest for his flock” and gained sanctity over time through grace and struggle. He found the matter and form of his path to holiness his vocation as a priest. He was not looking for spirituality elsewhere; he realized that it was abundantly found within the priesthood that Christ offered. He knew that prayer and penance was the most, not the least a priest could do for his people. He was also convinced that if his people were not spiritual and holy, it was his responsibility to do something about it. The first reading for his feast day indeed scary!

Fr. Vianney’s first focus on the parish rested on families. He focused on families that were already strong in their faith. He believed that they were the fiery coals of faith! He never was a one-man army, doing stuff involuntarily – merely hearing confession and saying Mass, looking timid and impersonal. He was a well likeable man, full of kindness, cheerfulness and affability according to the Fr. Francis Trochu’s *The Cure D’ Ars* – the biography that played a vital role in the canonization process.

He addressed the problem of lack of Sunday Church attendance by beautifying the Church. He spent a huge amount of money to buy sumptuous vestments for the liturgy. He was equally charitable to the poor! He preached beautiful and intelligent homilies. But, he preached very loudly; sometimes tears rolled from his eyes. There is an unfounded error about him in that he was intellectually struggling. He was poor in Latin; yet his Latin was much better than ours today! Isn’t it sad that priestly formation today has made Latin has abrogated? Fr. Vianney had about 300 books in his personal library. He put serious efforts in teaching Catechism to his parish children. He never liked first holy communion as a formality.

He was concerned about the social life of the people. He was worried about destitution, indifference and lack of charity. He deeply cared for the orphans and the street children. He was upset about the taverns being places where the Lord’s name was blasphemed. He was “ruthless” in his invective against them. One owner was unhappy and approached Fr. Vianney and said that his preaching kept the people away and caused financial ruin for his business. The biographer writes that Fr. Vianney gave him enough money to close the tavern; one by one all tavern owners chose other occupations. He gave double the amount of the pay to a fiddler who was going to come to a tavern and sent him away! He addressed both the issues: Turning to God and turning away from worldly life. He rebuilt the respect for the Lord’s day and at the same time he worked on closing the taverns that were attracting the people away from the church.

Fr. Vianney grew in holiness; with him his beloved parish of Ars grew as well! St. Vianney was certainly in an apostolic mode and did not do things as he would in a Christendom mode! We have the same mission that we must do like St. Vianney – it is time we gear up to be Apostolic. As Pope Francis spoke recently, “Christendom is no more.” That simply means, we start evangelizing, of course beginning with ourselves.
