

What is your Vocation?

Do I have a vocation? Every young man should ask this question.

Do you have a vocation? Every parent must ask this question to their children.

This past Sunday, we celebrated Priesthood Sunday and many of you thanked me for being the priest for our parish. Every time someone appreciates me for being a priest – I get excited! I tell them, "You made me happy."

I do not believe in the shortage of priests, but I do believe in the huge hesitation and discouragement that are prevalent in our culture to embrace religious life. It is true that there are those who do have a vocation to religious/priesthood life and still refuse to discern and embrace it. It is also true that families do not talk about vocations to their children. We must remember, the first teachers (parents) often become the source of encouragement to embrace religious life. There has been an increase of "single life" in modern day. If only they asked this question, "Do I have a vocation?" – many women might have consecrated themselves to the divine love, so would men to priesthood!

One need not be attracted to vocation in order to have a vocation! All that one needs is love for Christ and love for his holy Church! Pope Paul said in 1966: "In no time and in no place can one think that God does not provide for the needs of the Church and, as in the past, that He does not call to Himself innumerable battalions of receptive adolescents, in their generosity, their strength, their integrity, their purity, to obey the voice of Christ and have the desire to devote themselves to the Church..." (Pope Paul VI, Allocution to the Congress of Priestly Vocations, Dec. 3, 1966).

In some countries, families have become small due to contraceptive lifestyle. Nonetheless, there are large families in many parts of the world for which we must be thankful! Isn't it surprising to know that some special vocations have come from very large families? The little Thérèse was the ninth child, St. Ignatius was eleventh, St. Francis Xavier was thirteenth, St. Catherine of Siena was twenty-fourth!









Students begin sixth grade learning about the methods of science. They read and study

a scientific inquiry about "The Ice Man, Otzi, of the Alps." One aspect they learn is how evidence found on, near, or in the body guided scientists to where he lived and helped solve the mystery. Students applied this skill and gathered quantitative and qualitative evidence as well as the contents of the owl pellet to determine where our owls







One study involved diffusion, specifically osmosis. Step one was to dissolve an eggshell with vinegar. Overnight the water from the vinegar moved through

the semipermeable membrane into the egg. The students returned to class to find that their eggs had swelled due to the extra water inside of them.

The second study involved the change of matter lab which allowed the students to cause a chemical reaction by running an electric current through copper wire into a beaker of water. They were looking for signs of chemical or physical change. The lab concluded with students writing down their observations and answering some critical thinking questions concerning the lab.


