Baptism of our Lord

Today we celebrate the mystery of the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ. I say “mystery” as a way of alluding to the fact that this event is one of the “Luminous” mysteries of the holy rosary. Admittedly, Christ’s baptism in the River Jordan is one of the rosary mysteries that I often have a hard time meditating on. Until sitting down to write this bulletin piece, I had never really thought about why this is. Maybe part of it has to do with the fact that I can’t remember my own baptism, so it’s not easy for me to relate to the experience of being baptized. Or maybe it was just so dramatic an event (the heavens opening, the Holy Spirit descending in the form of a dove, the Father’s voice thundering: “This is my beloved Son...”) that I have a hard time wrapping my head around it. It is much easier for me to meditate on the mysteries in which I can comprehend, at least partially, the circumstances and emotions of those involved (especially Jesus or Mary); for instance, Mary, in the Wedding at Cana, interceding with her Son out of pure, compassionate concern for the good of others; or Jesus, in a state of unspeakable dread, sweating drops of blood in his interior Agony in the Garden. These mysteries evoke emotion in me; they stir my heart, or at least they often do. But what about our Lord’s baptism is supposed to stir my heart? What emotion should it evoke in me? How should it affect me?

After reflecting on these questions, what sticks out to me about Christ’s baptism is the deep humility which it reveals. Jesus, approaching the River Jordan along with the people “of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem,” puts himself in the place of a sinner by seeking something that only sinners would conceivably seek: a baptism “of repentance for the forgiveness of sins” (Mk 1:4-5). Jesus, the Messiah of Israel, falls in line with his fellow Jews, joining them in their hike into the wilderness; Jesus, the Son of God, falls in line with sinners, men and women with evil in their hearts, who need to be washed clean by the baptism of God’s mercy. Think about it this way: Jesus *lets himself be seen* as a sinner. He who is without sin lets himself be seen doing only what sinners would do. He allows himself to be known—to be *thought of* by those around him as just another guy in need of forgiveness. We know, of course, that nothing could be further from the truth; that he is the one sent by the Father to deliver us from the captivity of sin; that it is only by his sacrifice on the Cross that the sins of humanity are forgiven. Nonetheless, Jesus humbles himself, taking on the appearance of a sinner by going with the crowds to receive John’s baptism of repentance.

This is a simple observation about our Lord’s baptism. It’s not profound or insightful. But, I think it can stir

our hearts, if we let it. Imagining our Lord walking toward the Jordan with a throng of contrite sinners, allowing himself to be seen and thought of as one of them, as no better than them—it makes me think about how different I can sometimes be from Christ; how my pride makes me want to be thought of highly by others, even when I don’t deserve it; how my vanity makes me care so much about how others perceive me. Meditating on the mystery of his baptism, I begin to see how humble our Lord’s Heart is, how it contains not even the slightest hint of vainglory. And, examining my own heart, I begin to see how far it is from the pure, lowly Heart of Christ. These thoughts rouse certain emotions in my soul—feelings of love for Christ, feelings of disgust at my own vain and prideful tendencies. These feelings, in turn, provoke a deeper desire to follow Christ; to imitate him, to love him not just in words but in deeds. All of this is the fruit of meditation, and therefore the fruit of praying the rosary. Today, on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, may we devote a little time to meditating on this event, particularly by praying the Luminous mysteries of Our Lady’s rosary.
