

A message from Fr. Joe Kraemer

The Fourth of July has come and gone and summer is very much upon us! If you're anything like me, you are looking for occasions to get outside and enjoy the beauty of nature. Last week, the Prophet Hosea pointed out the mighty cedars of Lebanon: trees with deep spiritual roots in both Hebrew and Christian traditions. The height and breadth of these trees have long been associated with God's greatness; fruit-bearing, evergreen and sources of refuge for many creatures, we find in them characteristics of both Yahweh and our Blessed Mother, protectress of our Church.

When I feel low in spirit or distant from God in prayer, I always find comfort taking a walk through the woods or a neighborhood park. As a towhead growing up in "Oak Park" here in Richmond, I loved to climb and jump from trees, read my comic books beneath them and build forts with my friends in the creek bed around them. For the last decade or more, I have lived in California among some of the most incredible trees on our planet: the Joshua trees of the Mojave Desert; ancient bristlecone pines, some of which date back to the Pyramids of Egypt; the earth's tallest trees, the great coastal redwoods and mighty sequoias; and my favorite, the torrey pines, North America's rarest pine tree, which you only find in two places, battered by coastal winds into bonsai-like shapes. Fewer than 10,000 exist today, but once upon a time they may have populated almost the entire West Coast.

My last class in theology school was called Spirituality of the Earth. This course reminded me to always keep paying attention to the beautiful details of our planet. Psalm 19 tells us how God is manifested in nature: The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge. God talks to us in nature. His words are there! St. Augustine said about the Book of Creation, "Look above you! Look below you! Read it. God, whom you want to discover, never wrote that book with ink.

Instead, He set before your eyes the things that He had made. So go hug a tree! Consider the lilies of the field. Wait for a door Can you ask for a louder voice than that?"

But the noise of the world can drown out the music of creation and the deeper truth that we ourselves are created beings. And as created beings, we should never forget to turn for peace and comfort to the world God made for us. One way to do this is by developing our own "spirituality of the earth," which can start by finding a corner of nature just for us. Visit that place and con-

template an apple tree or a humble creek—then do it again and again! When I'm in Richmond, I run most mornings to South 10th Street Park. There I encounter the Holy Spirit at work among two leafy rows of mature "fellow travelers" in the world. I am always humbled by the size and endurance of these big trees in Richmond's oldest park.

As I write to you this morning, wildfires near Yosemite National Park threaten its largest grove of sequoia trees. The danger to these sequoias bring to mind the massive die-off of many more of California's trees—almost two million lost since 2010—and the peril to many of our forests on earth. I think about the invitation of Pope Francis in his encyclical *Laudato si'*, which encourages us to show more care for our common home. This starts when we slow down and show more care for our little corner of the world. Because we will find Jesus, hear God and feel the Spirit in nature!

One reason St. Augustine's thoughts about this feel so right to me is because I know that the opposite is true. If we miss God in nature, God may feel harder for us to find. In May, I learned that my first assignment as a priest will be in prison chaplaincy in Washington State. I've done work like this before, and one challenge in it for me is that when you enter a prison there are no consolations from nature. The air and light are artificial. No one has a pet. Nothing blooms.

There are no trees in jail. It's in prison where I have found the Devil's power to be strongest, because that cold earth is rich for planting seeds of despair. It's there he tells his greatest lie: that there are sins we can commit that put us beyond the power of God's forgiveness.

But as Christians, we know that our final image of Jesus isn't of an executed teacher who hangs on a dead tree. We have the Easter Jesus to celebrate — Christ forgiving, Christ risen, Christ the Creator of all! Easter Resurrection is happening all around us, every day! But we have work to do as Catholics to preserve and protect creation. That work starts with attention and appreciation.

So go hug a tree! Consider the lilies of the field. Wait for a door open to the greenest fields of your soul as you pray with the words of another prophet: You will go out in joy and be led forth in peace, the mountains and hills will burst into song before you, and all the trees of the field will clap their hands. (Isaiah 55:12)

God bless you and keep you safe!
