

A message from Fr. Joe Kraemer

Our letter from St. Paul to the Colossians (Col. 3:1 -5, 9-11) on this 18th Sunday of Ordinary Time is one I'd like to find in my inbox every morning: a hearty reminder to never stop seeking "the things above"! But how do we keep our eyes on Christ and yet, so often, find ourselves living or speaking outside the spirit of Paul's important faith instructions?

I'm sure that my parents could have preached a sermon on this text throughout most of my childhood, and in three simple words: Watch your mouth. Watch your mouth, Joey, watch your mouth. This was back when folks here in Richmond still called me Joey, obviously, and I was an outspoken pre-teen. I don't know why this was so. My parents are two of the least outspoken people in the world, as many of you know. I also grew up in this same polite town that many of you did, so I wasn't picking up my sassy opinions from the tough streets of some big city. And yet, I seemed to have a remark for everything, and a million-dollar-plus budget to help oversee; three large they weren't always generous. Now, this was back in the 70's, when a parent could still raise his or her hand and high school; eleven buildings that I have counted (are there threaten to slap or spank sassy children. I remember a day when I was being very outspoken, and my poor father, who'd heard enough, but who also gets tongue-tied easily, cried out to my mother, "Smart that smack kid!" I must er special programs that pop up, like Totus Tuus a few have been ten, and oh, my Lord, first my mom broke down weeks ago; and a big parish office and staff, not to mention laughing, then my brother, and finally my dad, after which I knew it was safe to laugh along with them. Children of wow! It's a lot for one priest to take care of and watch Seton Parish, if you are reading this: Father Joe asks you over! But with a great deacon and sacristans, and a bignot to make the lives of your awesome moms and dads hearted staff indoors and out, plus all of you to assist and harder by talking back or being sassy, and if you do, let me pray for him, I know the health of this faith community give you some advice. Nothing says sorry to your parents will remain strong and a light to others too. You inspire better than by becoming a priest or a nun, so I'll let that be me! I thank you again for your great welcome to me. I my parting vocations talk as well!

Our parents are usually our first and finest distillers of wisdom. They see our faults forming and intuit where and how we should show some care. It's interesting that what my parents told me as a child was said by prophets like Sirach hundreds of years before the birth of Christ: Watch what you say and what you do and weigh the words and actions of those you meet. What fills our hearts has a way of getting over our teeth and out of our mouths! We all know people—we know ourselves—and how the good or unkind things we say can reflect what's going on inside us. We know, for example, that it isn't good to gossip. Pope Francis has spoken on this topic a lot, reminding us that people who give and receive the sign of peace should be men and women of peace and to try not to ruin "the peace made by the Holy Spirit" with our tongues. This probably sounds right to most of us. When we speak positively— when we reassure or console, when we compliment or encourage others— our words tend to feel like they rise up from the best place inside us. We also know the damage we can do when our words are sharp or thoughtless. And as a man I now know what I didn't as a child: that as Christians we are called to watch our mouths and to ask God for the help that we need to do that.


Paul is right: Jesus is the best help we can seek each and every day as Christians. The Gospels show us how the Lord helps, heals, gathers, blesses. We should try to look and to listen like Jesus did. Paul reminds us elsewhere that we have been given the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ and that when we strive to imitate him— and in Paul's words, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord— we can pay attention to each other with charity, forgiveness and mercy.

What a faith leader the Richmond Catholic Community has in Father Sengole! Having been his guest in the rectory these last five weeks, I have been so impressed with his extensive theology library and many personal devotional items—pictures and statues of our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph abound!—and the priority Father Sengole plainly gives to sticking close to our Holy Family as he leads this parish flock.

His job isn't an easy one! 850 families to shepherd; churches and three Catholic schools, including a Catholic even more I haven't seen?); numerous ministries including at least eight nursing homes that I've visited myself in July, and a large regional hospital too; and then retreats and oththis large rectory that I'm writing you from this morning promise I will be keeping the "things above"—and you! in my daily prayers as I start my new work in the prisons next month.


