The Cost of Discipleship

Biblical language can be difficult to interpret and even to understand. Does Jesus teach contempt in this week's Gospel text? Does he really ask us to hate father and mother? What does he really mean when he says that we should bear our own cross? He says, "you cannot be my disciple" – three times!

Biblical language is unique and comes with a specific usage of words. Much different from how we use words in English, different languages use words differently. For example, if you translate "I have a pen" into Tamil (my native language), it would sound something like, "the pen is with me"!

What our Lord says in v. 26 may seem harsh; but we need to read this verse in the overall context of the demands he makes and the biblical language he is using. In many passages of the Old Testament, "loving" this person or thing and "hating" another means simply that the one is better than, or preferred to, the other: the difference between them marks a choice. For example, in Genesis 29:30 we read that Jacob "loved Rachel more than Leah", but literally what is said is "he loved Rachel and hated Leah"; in Malachi 1:2–3 (and Romans 9:13), we read "I have loved Jacob but I have hated Esau": what these statements mean is that Rachel was the one chosen by Jacob, and Jacob was the object of God's election.

Therefore, Jesus' words here should be read as meaning that one must put Christ first and commit one-self decisively to him: being a disciple of Christ means taking God's side and not compromising in any way. That is how the passage has been read in the Tradition of the Church: St Gregory the Great says, "We should have charity towards all—towards relatives and towards strangers—but without separating ourselves from the love of God out of love for them". The Second Vatican Council makes a similar point when it teaches that Christians strive "to please God rather than men, always ready to abandon everything for Christ" (*Apostolicam*

actuositatem, 4). St. John of the Cross teaches, "For, as long as the soul does not reject all things, it has no capacity to receive the Spirit of God in pure transformation."

Discipleship is an adventure! There is no such thing as "accidental blessing" or "automatic conversion" of the heart – conversion is intentional; meaning, we must sit down and count the cost of what we may be losing in order to gain friendship with Christ!


