### **Interacting with the 8th Graders**

Here is a little story of me interacting with the 8<sup>th</sup> graders.

I walked into the 8<sup>th</sup> grade class room this past Tuesday. I told them, "Ask me the most difficult question you may have about religion." One student asked me, "How many words are there in the Bible?" I wrote down a random number, a 16-digit number. The student was literally taken aback and asked me, "How sure are you about that?" I replied, "Go ahead and count them on the Bible, then let me know if I was correct!"

They knew I was kidding. Another student asked me, "Why do we say, Jesus is the fulfillment of the Old Testament?" I was shocked to hear that from an 8<sup>th</sup> grader. I told the student that it was a profound question and that I was glad she was thinking about it.

I wanted to give them a short lesson on the Scripture. I explained that it was necessary to understand the Old Testament before we can grasp the meaning of Christ as the fulfillment of the Old Testament. Today's second reading is a great exhortation on the importance of reading and valuing the Scripture. When Paul wrote these words, the canon (vardstick to determine which books will go into the Bible) of the Bible had not yet been established. His own writing was not yet considered a Scripture. All that was considered Scripture was the Old Testament because that was what they had – both Jews and the early Christians. I told the 8th graders that the Old Testament was not only about God, but it was primarily from God. The Old Testament begins with the two creation stories. In the second creation story (Gen 2:4-24), God makes man in his image and likeness. He gives Adam a suitable partner, Eve. Eve is tempted by the serpent and she falls prey to the temptation, so is Adam. Finally, their eyes are opened and become ashamed of themselves and also become afraid of a God who so lovingly created them and befriended them. This is generally called the Fall.

God did not entirely abandon our first parents. He made a promise to them which is recorded in Genesis 3:15. That promise was about getting them home, being restored in their friendship with God! In order to make this promise come true, God prepares the entire Old Testament people to receive the Messiah. There are over 300 prophecies about the Messiah that clearly point to Christ. God sent His own Son to restore friendship with God. By being human, and on our behalf Jesus restored our dignity – the beauty of unity as humans in and through divine intervention. I asked the class to memorize John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." Believe me, they all did a fine job memorizing this verse.

Then, I pointed out to Hebrews 1:1 – "In many and various ways God spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets; but in these last days he has spoken to us by a son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the ages. He reflects the glory of God and bears the very stamp of his nature, upholding the universe by his word of power."

Friendship with God necessarily means enmity with Satan. Friendship with God is made possible in Christ and through Christ! This is a simple summary of how Christ fulfills the Old Testament. The key words to remember are: Sin-Redemption-Grace!

### **Fall Sports Award Ceremony**






