


We currently have 17 students, (7 Religious Ed and 10 Seton Primary) enrolled in Second grade Sacramental year. First Holy Communion will be Sunday, May 21, 2023, St. Mary's Campus at 2:00pm. The first of four required parent meetings for First Holy Communion will be Sunday, November 13, 2022, at 11:15–12:15pm at Seton High School. I look forward to journeying with you and your child to Jesus this year in First Holy Communion.

It is also my pleasure to report that we have started a RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children) for our parish children who want to be in full communion with The Catholic Church. We have 7 children ranging in age 7–14 who are very excited to join Jesus and His Church on Easter Vigil. So excited for them and their families!

In closing I would like to thank God's Holy Spirit for plucking me out of my everyday life and placing me here at this time and place. I also want to thank Him for the grace and courage given me to say "My Yes". We all have parts to play. Just listen with an open heart, be patient, and then simply "Say Yes". God will do the rest.




