# **Youth Ministry Bonfire**

As you are aware, our parish has been conducting a 3 hour workshop on evangelization. I heard from couple of parishioners that there is some kind of reluctance in attending this workshop due to an apparent assumption that these workshops were meant only for those who have special interest in evangelization ministry. Although this is true, the whole point about offering a workshop on evangelization is to recapture and reclaim for ourselves the original message of the Apostles, precisely so, we named it "Evangelize 3:16 - Preaching the Kerygma today." You have heard me speak of Kerygma many several times. The Kerygma is the heart of the Gospel. Pope Francis talks about the Kerygma as the heart of the Apostles preaching.

We are living in a time when our people really need to (re) hear the Gospel. Evangelization is generally understood to be bringing people to Christ and to His holy Church. This is correct. But, once after they come to join us, they still need to be evangelized, meaning hear the Gospel that presents Jesus in an uncompromised way. The end of evangelization is conversion, a total change of heart and mind in accordance with what we believe. The one who evangelizes must first experience a deep conversion and then as a result go out and talk about his own conversion in such a way that people rediscover Jesus Christ in their lives, fall in love with him and increase in prayer and penance.

So, what is Kerygma? Kerygma is the basis of all that we believe, preach and practice. Kerygma takes us to the Apostles preaching. When the Apostles preached Jesus, the people they encountered were totally non-Christians, or in the traditional language pagans. Isn't it true that we encounter a similar world around us? Many of those born and raised Catholics do not practice their faith, much less, they know the heart of the Gospel. We are in an important time that calls for the renewal in the Spirit. You and I are the evangelists for our time. This means that we must be like the Apostles who went about talking about Jesus and bringing people to surrender to God in Christ.


From where did the Apostles begin? What was the message the Apostles preached? Can we say it in one sentence what the Apostles preached?


