

Christ the King

Happy feast of Christ the King of the Universe!

The first thing that comes to my mind when I think of a king is rule and control, demand and command! In other words, Kings in human history were people who enjoyed unlimited power and authority. In any case, Kings did have a moral responsibility to rule with justice and ensure safety and prosperity for the people as well.

Mahatma Gandhi's famous slogan against British rule in India was "self-rule" – we want to rule ourselves! Self-rule or self-governance applies not only to external structures like kingdoms or government, it primarily means being able to rule oneself. Alternatively, the question is: Who is my master? Who rules me?

When we acclaim Christ as King, we recognize who Christ is in the first place as the second person of the Trinity – the Creator and thus, naturally the King who should rule. Furthermore, we should also see Christ as the one who commands. The word command is so crucial in our life that without this faculty or ability, we would hardly be able to do anything. The one who commands my will is myself! No one can command my will. Precisely, it is called the "Ten Commandments" and not simply the "Ten rules." Someone asked Jesus, "Which is the greatest commandment?" Jesus simply reminded him, "Love God and love your neighbor."

Christ commands us! "This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12). The crucial question is, do we want to allow Christ to command our will? That will depend on whether or not we love Him! In fact, Jesus himself says that, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (Jn 14:15).

Who commands your will? You do! More often than not, we have a divided will – divided between the good and the bad. All our addictions are based on this fact. That is because the will is powerful. There is no such a thing as a weak will. If Christ the King commands our will, if we let Him do that – we will only do good things. Love and forgiveness are acts of the will – meaning, anything opposed to love and forgiveness equals to doing our own will not the will of the Father. That is why we pray, "your will be done."

May Christ be truly your king; let Him command your will!




