

Appreciation for our Catechists...

This past week, I wrote on the indispensable work of the sacristans. Many of you told me that it was so nice of me to tell the parish about what the sacristans do. Again, please show them your appreciation for them.

This week, I want to write a few lines on the work of our Catechists. We have wonderful people who are journeying with our young children, teaching them and equipping them in the faith of our Church in the Lord. Without their time and willingness to teach on Sundays, it would be hard to imagine the work of catechesis in our parish. The catechists, as you might know them, are: Marie Byrum (Pr-K), Margaret Lahmann (1st gr), Camella Schmitz (2nd gr), Mike Clark (3rd gr), Peggy Rokosz (4th gr), Mike Anderson (5th gr), Natasha Snyder (6th gr), Joe Moriarity (7th gr), Laura Elstro (8th gr), Bryan Schmitz (HS), Lane Inglish (HS Seniors), Dave Rokosz (Confirmation assistance), Trinity Semler (Confirmation), Vicki Roosa and Sam Krutz (RCIA).

The Catechism teaches,

Quite early on, the name catechesis was given to the totality of the Church's efforts to make disciples, to help men believe that Jesus is the Son of God so that believing they might have life in his name, and to educate and instruct them in this life, thus building up the body of Christ. Catechesis is an education in the faith of children, young people and adults which includes especially the teaching of Christian doctrine imparted, generally speaking, in an organic and systematic way, with a view to initiating the hearers into the fullness of Christian

life. While not being formally identified with them, catechesis is built on a certain number of elements of the Church's pastoral mission which have a catechetical aspect, that prepare for catechesis, or spring from it. They are: the initial proclamation of the Gospel or missionary preaching to arouse faith; examination of the reasons for belief; experience of Christian living; celebration of the sacraments; integration into the ecclesial community; and apostolic and missionary witness. Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life (CCC 4-7).

The biggest problem we encounter in the ministry of Catechesis is the apparent failure of our young people in maturing into discipleship. The main reason for this is the absence of evangelization. If we are catechizing unevangelized children, or children who do not see a supportive culture in their family and in society at large, education in Catholic faith will be far from success. We all are called to be part of this important work of evangelization and catechesis that go hand in hand. We do so well in sacramentalizing; but offering sacraments is not the only ministry we are called to do. We are called to make disciples, meaning, we are called to help our young people to know, love and be with Christ. Please show your appreciation to all our catechists whose work is indispensable in our parish!


