Book study on the Letter to the Hebrews

We are in the midst of the nationwide Eucharistic Revival and dioceses and parishes are gearing up to get the most out of this revival. At our parish, we read *Becoming a Eucharistic people*... book during Lent and now it is time for another book study. This time we are reading a book from the Bible – the letter to the Hebrews.

Bishop Cozzens, the chair of US Bishops' evangelization and catechesis commission said that through this revival, "we seek to create a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist — and sent out in mission 'for the life of the world.'

Healed, converted, formed and unified...! The letter to the Hebrews mainly focuses on the priesthood of Jesus and how this is in reality lived out in our times – in the Eucharist. Hebrews also focuses on another important theme for which the Eucharist stands as a living witness – a covenant that God forged in the blood of Jesus.

Hebrews presents some beautiful descriptions of Jesus; in that it sheds light on how our Lord reveals the very glory of God the Father. "[Jesus] reflects the glory of God and bears the very stamp of his nature..." (1:2). Again, on the meaning of Jesus' priesthood, the letter says, "...we have a great high priest who has passed through the

heavens, Jesus, the Son of God...we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sinning" (4:14-15).

At every Mass, we encounter not only the altar but the sacrificial lamb on it; because there is a sacrifice, there is bloodshed. But, what difference is there between the many Old Testament sacrifices in the temple and the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross? What is the meaning of Jesus taking away our sins? Although God does not desire sacrifices and offerings, why would Jesus' sacrifice of his body and blood be considered the sacrifice offered once and for all? If Jesus is the high priest, the perfect and blameless priest, why should we have priests in the Church? All good people of the Old Testament had faith in God but because they lived before Christ, are they saved? If yes, how?

To know the answers to these questions, join us in the Book Study, beginning May 25th at Seton Catholic High School Classroom 201. Free copies of the letter to the Hebrews will be offered.


Ministry Overview: Tim Elstro
