

Dear friends,

As we move towards the end of the church year, which culminates on the feast of Christ the King, we hear Jesus more obviously challenge the leaders of Israel on their understanding of God and God's law. He represents them as ignoring God's invitation to share in God's joy through a participation in the wedding feast.

In that first reading, the prophet Isaiah foretells the great feast on the mountain of the Lord; it depicts the world after the sacrifice on the cross of The Son; "let us rejoice and be glad that he has saved us!" And in the Gospel, we learn that we have the free will to respond to God's love, or to ignore it, which is what we call sin. Sin is putting anything else before God: "my farm", "my business", "or "mistreat others (self-centeredness)." So what is the message that the church wants us to experience today?

The message is contained in the psalmist response: "I shall live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life." This week we are again given the choice accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior, or to choose our own desires. When we choose God, "we shall not want (need)." Through His infinite love God provides everything we

need; He lavishes us with gifts as Isaiah spoke about. He makes everything work together for His good. The words of Psalm 23 are so familiar to us, but do we really believe the words, or just mouth them. Do we truly believe that He is at your side? Do you truly fear no evil?

Through our Baptism, the Apostle Paul tells us that we participate in the divine life. It is this participation which gives us the strength to do all things—gives us the freedom to choose the ways of God, for He "will supply, whatever [we] need in accordance with his glorious riches in Christ Jesus."

The most glorious riches God gives us is Himself: His body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist. We are weekly invited to the great wedding feast to nourish and strengthen our Christian belief. With His nourishment we are strengthened to live this witness to those around us.
